White Has the Answer
The children of Texas finally have an effective advocate in Austin, it seems, in the form of our new governor Mark White. Gov. White presented his new budget to the legislature last week and vigorously urged that group to endorse a 24 percent pay increase for Texas teachers. White said that the immediate pay increase would bring the same people could draw in industry. The bill. sponsored by Senators Lloyd Doggett and Carl Parker, would give the teacher's a $\$ 1.6$
billion increase over the next two years. This would give a beginning teacher with a bachelor's degree starting salary of $\$ 14,500$ instead of $\$ 11,110$. A teacher with a master's degree and 30 years of
experience would receive $\$ 27.250$, instead of $\$ 21,100$.
This proposal is certainly a step in the right direction to insure that our children get the bes education possible. Sen. Parker said "You can" have a Cadillac system on a Model $T$ budget," fact that our previous legislaries have managed to ignore for too many years
