Sen. Bil Sarpalius, deciaring
that Texas' drunk driving laws
still are incomplete still are incomplete, recently
they announced he has -filed a bill that finally will make it
illegal to drink and drive on
Texas Highways. Texas Highways.
Sarpalius, D.Canyon, said
S.B. 135, which also ind S. B. 13 .3, which also is known as
the "Open Container" bill,
would outlaw carrying would outlaw carrying open
containers of alcoholic beverages while driving a motor
vehicle. The measure also woula prevent passengers who
are accessible within five feet are accessible within five feet
of the driver from carryyng open
containers of alcoholic beve. ages.
According to Sarpalius, the
measure will further strengthen measure will further strengthen
the tough drunk-driving laws he
passed two years ago during the 68th Session of the Texas Legislature.

sarpalius sald during a Capital news
conference. "No state's drunk. conierence. "No state's drunk-
driving laws are complete if driving laws are complete if
they allow drinking while driving. We intend to eliminate that problem make a dent in those

Sarmplilius said simply eliminating the temptation to drink and drive can help reduce the
number of traffic fatalities linked to open containers of alconol.
"Most people don't intend to be intoxicated while they drive. Most drunk drivers are just
victims of their own poor judgevictims of their own poor judge.
