## News Has New Owner

This week's issue of the McLean News will mark the beginning of a new ownership for the paper. Kathy Carter has purchased the paper and will be the publisher and editor. She will be the second woman to be sole publisher of the McLean News and will be the fourth female editor. Mrs. R.B. Edgel was editor in 1903, Mrs. L. Moody was editor in 1918 and Linda Haynes served as editor of the paper from 1978 until October of 1983.

Mrs. Carter bought the business from Mrs. Haynes. Mrs. Haynes took ownership from Mike Haynes, August, 1978.

The new editor has

periodically worked for the McLean News since 1978, when she started as a type-setter for the paper. She served as advertising manager from September, 1980 until October, 1983, when she took over as managing editor of the paper. She and Sam Haynes have shared responsibility for producing the weekly paper the past six months, when Linda Haynes accepted the position of Public Relations Director at Colorado Community Hospital in Pampa.

The McLean News switched from tabloid size to full newspaper size under Mike Haynes, in February, 1980. Under

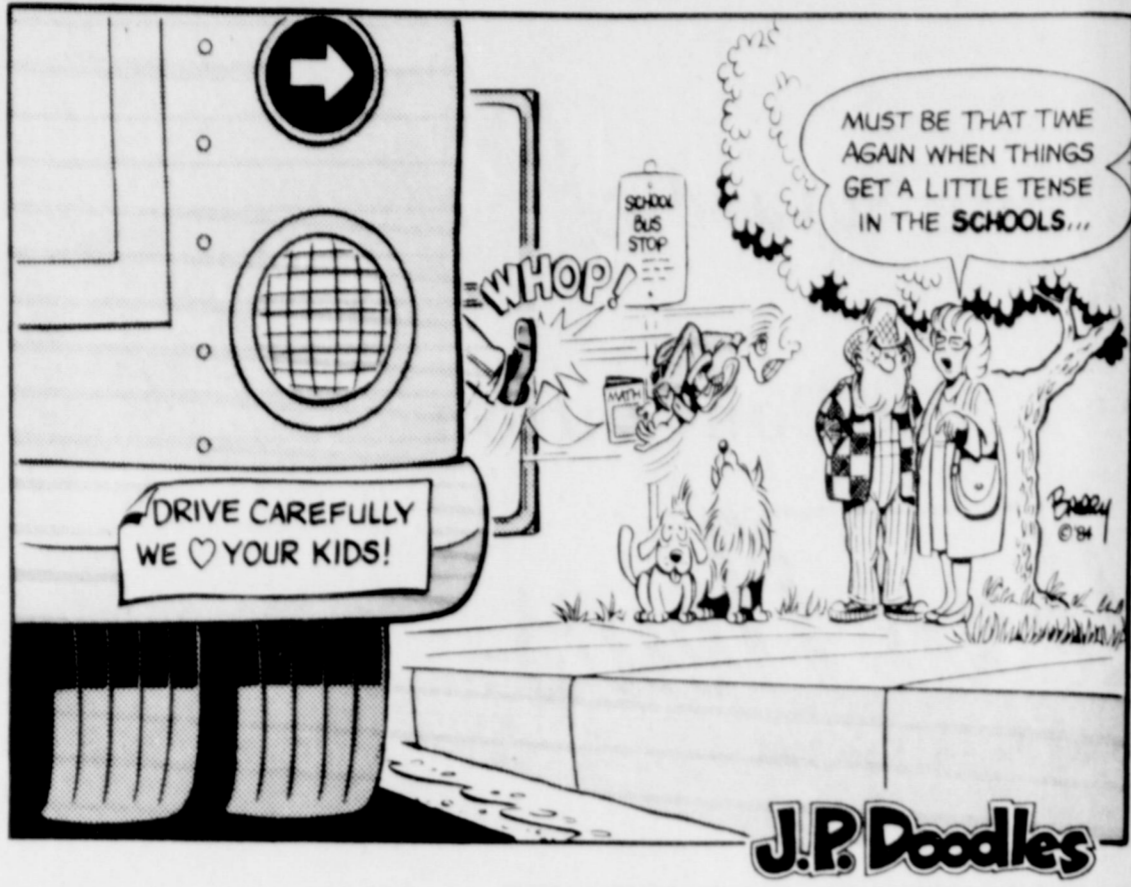
Remember to keep

After a honeymoon in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, the couple will live in Pampa.

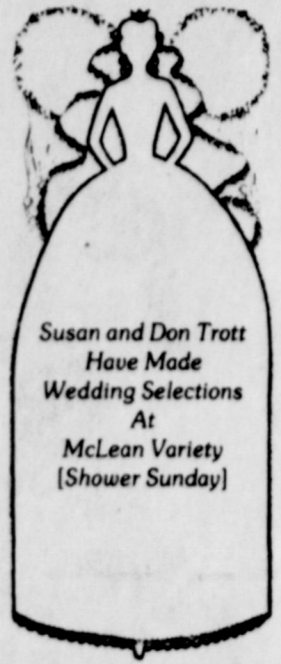
The bride is a 1982 graduate of Pampa High School. She has attended West Texas State University.

## 'Journey For Sight' Saturday

At the three-mile mark, liquid refreshments will be available.

"We have marked a six-mile trail from the golf course to a bridge on 273," said Lions spokesman Johnny Haynes. "If participants don't want to walk that far, a vehicle will be near to pick them up and bring them back."

Refreshments will also be available for participants at the conclusion of their walk.

During the past several weeks, participants have solicited pledged from the community to support the Journey and, after they have walked the course, will collect the funds pledged to them.

75% of the funds raised will stay in the McLean Lions Club to benefit local sight programs.

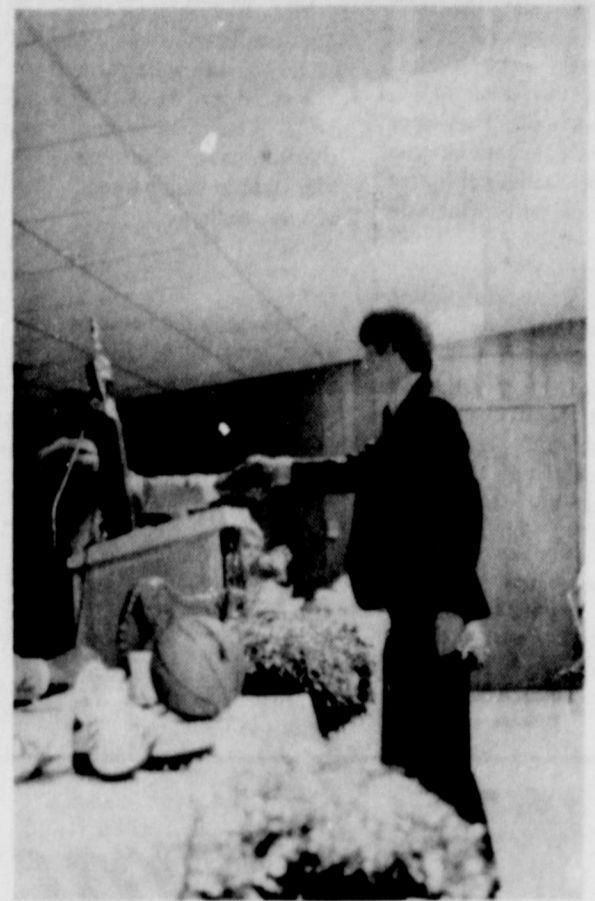

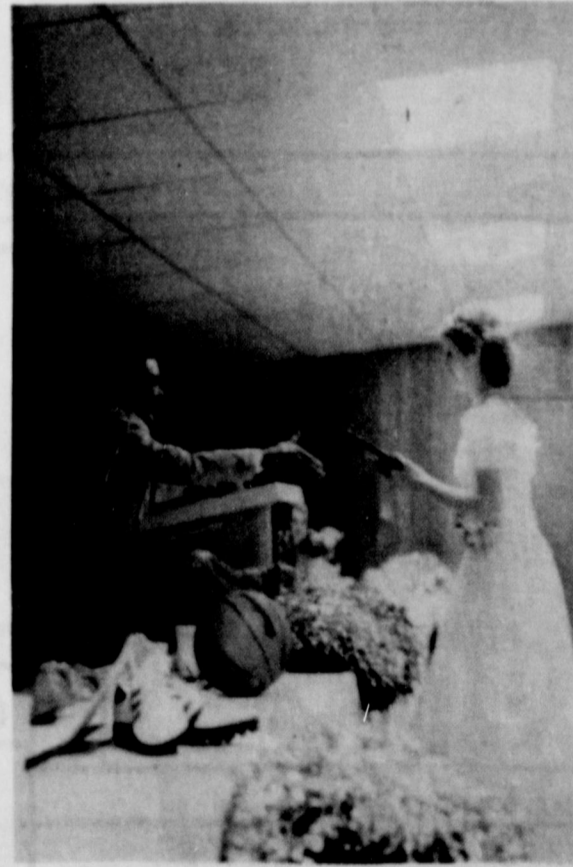

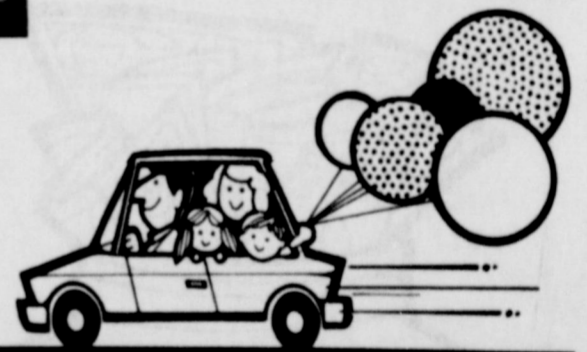
