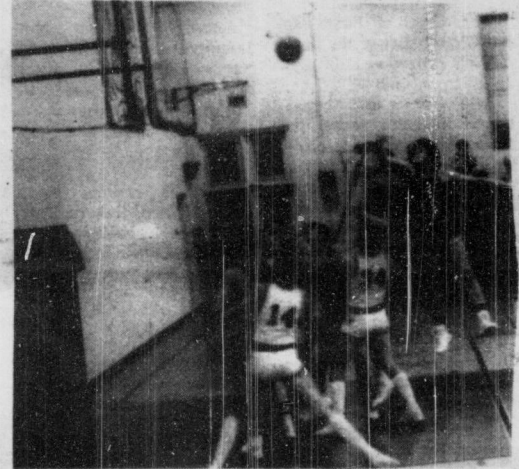

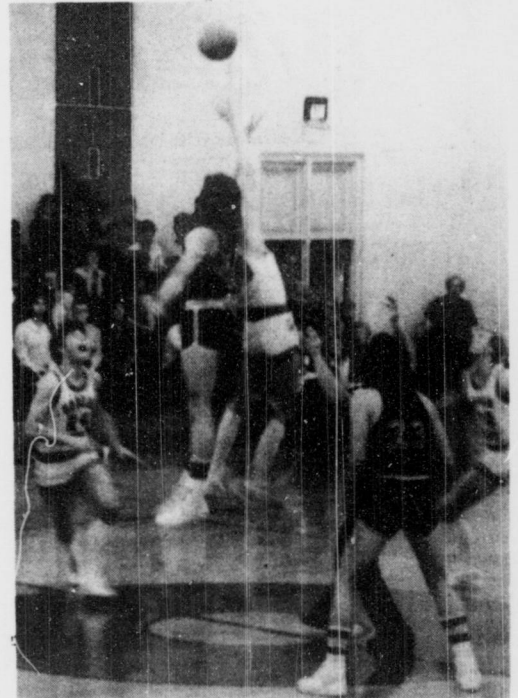

### Sheriff's Department Reports Active 1985

Carson County Sheriff's Department records for 1985 showed that 350 persons were confined in the county jail, 30 received sentences to the Texas Department of Corrections, 77 warrants were executed, 580 civil processes were served and 35 received Grand Jury indictments.
