
Business Closings Announced For Holidays

total each day instead of individually in the obituaries in thousands of cities and towns where the tragedies occur. Its victims are a crosssection of America; the rich,

the poor, the young, the old, the safety-conscious and the not-so-safety-conscious. But they share a common demise that is always unexpected, always needless and often grudgingly tolerated because our social norms won't quite permit them to be characterized as other

than accidental deaths.

For many years in this country we talked about drunk driving in statistical terms only; lives lost and public expenditures. The higher the numbers, the more the public would pay attention, or so we thought. But the opposite was ture. The numbers were largely ignored because they were, after all, just numbers. There were no faces or shattered lives attached to tug at the heart strings.

But something changed all that in the early 1980's. Citizen activist groups, like Mothers Against Drunk Driving, moved drunk driving off the bar graphs and brought it up close and personal, laying its dire consequences squarely on the doorsteps of virtually every American community.

Suddenly the blinders came off, the outrage swelled and things began to change—and change dramatically.

Thanks to that awakening, the United States, to its credit, has made remarkable progress in just a handful of years. Forty-one percent of the total traffic deaths in 1986 involved at least one driver or pedestrian who was intoxicated, a shocking figure but one that represents a significant decline from the 46 percent that was tallied in 1982. The percentage of intoxicated tennage drivers involved in fatal crashes also dropped from 28 percent in 1982 to 21 percent in 1986, the largest decrease among all age groups.

As promising as the improved statistics are, they are not much comfort to the families and friends of the 19,000 people who were killed last year in alcohol-related crashes. We are

holding our own-keeping things from getting worsebut we are still a long way from the point where we can drive our roads, reasonable assured that the approaching car or truck is not driven by someone who has had too much to drink. Alcohol has played and probably will continue to play a major role in how we socialize in this country. The challenge is to convince people to use alcohol in moderation and to avoid driving after drinking. This is especially true during the Christmas and New Year's holiday season when travel increases. parties abound and it's common to get together with family, friends and neighbors for "a little holiday cheer."

Tougher laws, more enforcement and increased public and media attention over the past few years helped reduce alcohol-related crashes by nearly 30 percent in some parts of the nation. Many responsible

people have gotten the message and have modified their drinking habits for the better. But the problem is far from solved and complacency should not replace the concern and anger of the early 1980s that motivated government, the private sector and citizen groups to stop wringing hands over drunk driving and start fighting it.

It may be difficult as a host to stick your neck out and actively prevent some-

The next accident also happened at the mile 98 marker when Larry Liggett of California lost control on the ice and struck an already disabled vehicle on the north side of the

highway. No injuries were reported one from driving who has been celebrating too much. But isn't it better to call a cab, offer a ride or provide a bed than to allow friends or co-workers to put themselves and everyone else at

Drunk driving is not only a national tragedy— it is a national disgrace. As we begin 1988, let each of us individually resolve to do our part to eliminate this disgrace and make it a resolution that is kept.

in any of the accidents.

The other wreck involved a semi and the patrol car driven by Don King. Officer King stopped Roger Ritch of Pennsylvania on a speeding violation. King was directing Ritch to pull his rig in front of his patrol car when the semi struck the left front fender of the vehicle while pulling off the roadway. The patrol car received an estimated \$250 damage.

Panhandle Health Care Coalition Will Serve Maternity Services

In Texas, more than 3,000 babies born alive die during infancy. One reason is that appropriate maternity care has not been readily available to many pregnant women who cannot afford medical care and who have special medical problems.

Now, the Texas Department of Health (TDH) has extended maternity services to many such women through contracts with 37 clinics and other health care providers across the State.

For the Texas Panhandle area, Panhandle Health Care Coalition has been named to serve these women. The PHCC is a non-profit organization made up of hospitals, physiciars, and pharmacists throughout the Panhandle to provide services to pregnant women with high-risk conditions throughout the Texas Panhandle.

Dave Clark at the Panhandle Health Care Coalition said, "Our contract with the state is to provide prenatal care, delivery and follow-up services to certain women whose infants are at risk of being born unhealthy because the mothers can't afford care and have medical problems that affect the health of the baby. We especially need to serve women whose pregnancies are medically 'high risk' by finding and treating their problems early to avoid long-term health problems, or even death, of their babies."

Eligibility requirements for MIHIA services are based on the family's level of income and the presence of a high-risk medical condition. "Although not every pregnant woman can qualify for special services under this program," Dave Clark said, "we urge all pregnant women to begin prenatal care as soon as they know they are pregnant."





Tax Report

The State Comptroller's office recently sent checks totaling \$57.6 million in local sales tax to 852 cities that levy the one-percent city tax.

This month's allocations showed an increase of \$33.3 million over last year's December allocations, an increase of 6.2% However, state wide year-end totals for the monthly city allocation decreased to \$850.7 million from the 1986 total payment of \$886.3.

The monthly payment to McLean was \$1,109.13, down from the \$1,481.36 sent during the same period in 1986. Year-to-date payments totaled \$18,311.40 compared to \$19,636.37, for 1986, a decrease of 6.75%.

For Gray County as a whole, the payment for this period was for \$86,693.07, up from \$82,367.68 for last year. However, the year to date county-wide payment was \$1,226,995.94, compared to \$1,414,971.97, a decrease of 13.28%.

There was no payment to Lefors during this reporting period but year to date payments are down from \$4,460.42 for 1987 compared to \$6,022.68 for 1986, a decline of 25,94%.

The City of Pampa showed an increase during the period: \$85,583.94 compared to a payment of \$80,886.32 for the same period last year. However, year to date payments to Pampa are still down by 13.32% compared to 1986.

each tree is watered properly is a method known as trickle irrigation. This involves the application of small quantities of water at frequent slow applications through a network of small pipes or hoses, either above or below the ground.

Outlets are located at each tree which will allow the water to soak into the soil at a rate of 1-4 gallons per hour, depending upon the design of the equipment. Lines can either be run on top of the ground or under-ground, whichever fits the needs.

Underground lines with outlets above the surface will allow mowing between the trees. Lines run above the ground can be rolled up when not in use and the installation and maintenance is somewhat easier. There are advantages to both





The Environmental Protection Agrecy (EPA) has published final regulations to identify and control asbestos hazards in public and private schools nationwide. The rules implement the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1986.

Under the new regulations, which closely match those proposed last spring, every school district in Texas must inspect for asbestos. If asbestos is found, districts must submit a plan to the Texas Department of Health for eliminating, containing or monitoring the material by October 12, 1988.

Orbry Holden, executive director of the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) said, "These inspection requirements, paperwork burdens, and maintenance plans will be extremely costly to Texas Schools already facing financial problems in hard economic times. The Texas Association of School Boards is work-

ing to get some relief on the unreasonable timelines, and is working on cost effective approaches for dealing with the new regulations. However, schools will be faced with having to move forward with plans to implement the Act."

Here are some highlights of the new regulations as they affect schools:

The district must see that each building owned, rented leased or occupied by the distict be inspected for frible (easily crumbled) and non-friable asbestos. The inspections must be performed by an accredited asbestos building inspector who has received EPA approved training.

The distric must have an accredited management planner (evelop the district's resi onse actions in the event that inspections reveal the presence of asbestos.

Following the initial inspection, the district must conduct a periodic surveillance every six months in all buildings that were found to contain asbestos. The district is also required to thoroughly re-inspect these

The district must appoint an asbestos coordinator to ensure compliance with all training, notification and certification requirements.

Once a management plan has been submitted, the district must keep detailed records of its asbestos related activities.

"Two of the most disturbing aspects of these requirements are that no federal or state funds were provided to help defray the cost of these mandates, and the deadline of October 1988 for submitting the asbestos management plan is really not that far away," Holden

Schools that fail to conduct inspections or to

submit an adequate plan to the state agent designated by the governor can be fined \$5,000 daily for each violation of the rules.






