

Poor Road Conditions Result In Near Fatal Truck Wreck

The Groom Fire Departand Ambulance Service responded to an accident scene Saturday night. A truck slid off the side of the overpass next to the Dairy Queen due to poor road conditions. Two men from Indiana were trapped in the over turned truck for about 45 minutes. The Jaws of Life were used to extricate the men from the truck. The extrication crew was headed by Fire Chief Tony Treadwell with several

members and some helpful

bystanders, David Britten, Lynn Pool, and Kenneth Payton transported the two ambulance to Coronado Community Hospital where they were reported doing well.

The fire department and ambulance responded to a wreck Sunday morning west of Conway. A truck had rolled over a car. Upon arrival no further services were needed. Claude Ambulance had responded and transported the injured parties to Amarillo.

Wind Damage Reported

The winds of March held no comparison to the galelike turbulance Tuesday, November 15. Weather forecasters attributed the change to the leading edge of a cold front which dumped snow from the Canadian border to the Texas Panhandle. Wind speeds were reported to be 35-45 mph, with gusts nearing the 65 mph mark in several


