Aiding Wright in the research and location were Stan and Margie Anthony of Groom.

Wright said Pampa author Kelly Ebel is currently going through the research, historical accounts, journals government documents and other materials to prepare a book on the Black Kettle Battle. Wright said the book should be ready for publication this spring.
Wright said a microfilm viewer had been purchased to use microfilm material for the research and writing, the viewer also will be donate to the museum, he siad
The actual battle site area is currently on private property near the lake Wright said. He said efforts are currently under way to gain permission to place a historical marker at the site.
