## City Council Meets

The City Council of McLean convened in regular session Tuesday, February 14, 1989 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Green with the following members present: Wayne Bybee, Dale Glass, Martha Jo Bailey, W.C. Simpson and George Green. Alderman Smith being absent.

Others present: Gary Stevens, Roger McCracken, Mr. and Mrs. Clifford McDonald, Sam Green, Christian Looney, Dwight Brandt, Kaye Foshee and Stella Lee.

The first item on the agenda included the acceptance of the minutes of the January meeting.

Gary Stevens, representative of Southwestern Bell Telephone, appeared before council to explain a new program called Texas First. This would freeze basic rates for five year, install a digital phone network, and several other changes. A motion was made by Bailey and seconded by Bybee, to adopt a resolution backing Texas First Play. The motion carried.

A discussion was held concerning a need to continue with a plan to seal coat streets each year, under this plan a street would be seal coated once every five years. A motion was made by Glass and seconded by Bybee to proceed with the seal coating program.

A motion was made by Bailey a seconded by Simpson and seconded by

Simpson to deny a request for a street light at First and Cypress. The reason given was they felt there was nothing to substantiate a need for the light.

Bailey and seconded by Simpson to deny a resolution for election as follows:

"Be it resolved, that the election for Mayor, and two alderman positions be called for the first Saturday in May, being May 6, 1989, with balloting at the Lovett Memorial Library in McLean, Texas.

And be it further resolved, that filing for said positions shall be accepted up to and shall close as of 5:00 p.m. on March 22, 1989 and absentee balloting shall commence on April 17, 1989 and end on May 2, 1989, said absentee balloting to be in the office of the City Secretary at the City Hall in McLean, Texas and shall be supervised by the City Secretary.

Be it further resolved, that the election Judge for the General Election shall be Rev. Jeff Messer with two clerks. Election officials will be paid the same as in 1988.

The motion passed unanimously.

Bids for Willys Jeep was received and opened. Earl Winegeart bidding \$1,001.00 and Bill Allgood, bidding \$1,105.00. A motion by Glass and seconded by Bailey and all present voting in favor of a motion, to accept the highest bid of \$1,105.00 from Bill Allgood. Simpson and seconded by

Bailey to accept the resignation of Doyle Lee from the Housing Authority Board. The vote was unanimous.

The names of Sam Green, Margaret Milam, Wilma Steward, Anna Miller, Doris Stillwell, Vernon Stillwell and Fred Smith were submitted to the council to fill vacancies on the Housing Authority Board. A motion made by Simpson and seconded by Glass was made to appoint Green, Milam, Steward and Miller as members of the board. The council also agreed to keep the remaining names on file for future vacancies.

The council appointed Ann Williams and Margaret Coleman as members of the Library Board.

Glass made a motion, seconded by Bybee to advertise for bids to purchase a new heating and cooling system for City Hall. Bids are to be opened at March 14, 1989 meeting.

Council approved a motion to allow the Fire Department the use of a light bar for a rescue vehicle.

A motion was made by Bailey and seconded by Simpson to pay current bills.

Mayor Green told the council that Mayor Gee of Lefors requested the use of McLean's Animal Control Facilities. A motion by Glass and seconded by Bailey was made to allow the City of Lefors to use the facilities at a charge of \$3.00 per day, per animal.

With no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned.

## B&B Turbine Inc. To Build New Plant

It was announced today by Billy and Wayne Bybee that B & B Turbine Incorporated has purchased 25 acres south of I-40. B & B Turbine Inc. plans to build a new building and work is planned to start in July or August. Construction will be completed by approximately January of 1990.

Billy and Wayne Bybee believe this to be phase one of several phases they plan in the construction. B & B Turbine Inc. is in the

business of rebuilding and servicing natural gas turbines and centrifical boosters and compressors. They also are suppliers for gas turbine and booster compressor parts throughout the regions. They are currently doing this business all over the United States and several foreign countries. The company is also associated with several plants in the United States.

When the new plant is completed they will be able

to handle jobs in McLean, that are currently taking employment out of the area. The new plant will also bring employment to six or eight full time employees and at times an extra six to eight employees, to work on special projects. The final result will be a extra strength in McLean's economy.

Wayne and Billy are already thinking of phase two which will be adding on to the building which is not yet constructed.

## McLean To Consider Providing New Business Development With City Sewer Line!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

This new sewer line to be carried out to the business development project south of Business I-40, and on I-40, is designed to put McLean back on the highway and back in competition for the business going up and down Interstate 40.

Over \$25,000 has been pledged to be donated to the City of McLean to be used to buy materials, labor, and equipment to put the project into existence. The total cost of putting a sewer line into commercial development would be

approximately \$35,000, thus for approximately \$10,000 McLean would have a \$35,000 sewer system south of business I-40 for commercial users, also McLean would have all taxes and revenues from all users of this sewer system. Above all, it would invite and show potential businesses that McLean is recruiting new industry. If McLean could slow down the truckers and travelers of I-40 and get them to spend 50 cents each, the prosperity that McLean could share would be great. The City Council of McLean

## 1838 Indian Attact Reinacted

"The year is 1838. A small party of trappers camped on Saddler Creek, near Salt Fork, were hit by Indians on an early morning raid. Although they fought the Indians off without anyone being shot, they lost most of their horses, to Hideout Canyon, where they were protected from the weather and there was plenty of wood and water. They hoped to rest, replenish their rifle ball, and food."

This was the setting of the 1989 Plum Creek Brigade Winter Camp out on the Trew Ranch west of Alanreed this last weekend. Vehicles were left near Rockledge Camp and the Buskskinners had to pack in on foot, with horses, mules, burros, and one big dog. All

gear, food, clothing, and equipment was 1838 vintage, and nothing modern was allowed. Packs were carried down "Chicken" trail at the head of Big Canyon, one and a half miles through rough trails to "Hideout Canyon." Arriving Friday and leaving Sunday, with one and a fourth inches of rain, continuous fog and an average temperature of 34 degrees really gave the

brigade a test in survival.

The arrival started out with a bang when "Snowball", a white pack burrow, hee-hawed unexpectedly and spooked Buck and Thelma's pack mules, and bucked off the rider, all packs and equipment were scattered up and down the canyon. The owner knows now why the trappers ate many mules in the old days.

18 Buckskinners from Lubbock to Denver attended

the campout. Buffalo, elk, veision, antelope, and fish dishes were prepared, followed by berry cobblers and "Commanche mush sweetenin," and washed down with tea, coffee, and "aos lightnin." Hard Core Skinners showed the pilgrims the tricks of survival in the wild, gave demonstrations, examined and criticized all gear and had a black powder handicap shoot. A great time was had by all and plans were made for the next camp out. The hosts were Delbert and Ruth Trew and Mike Oldham.

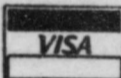

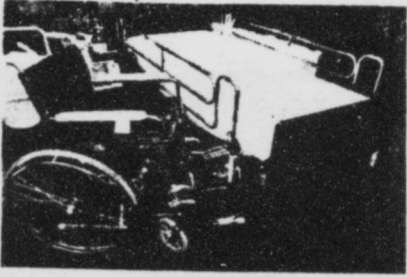

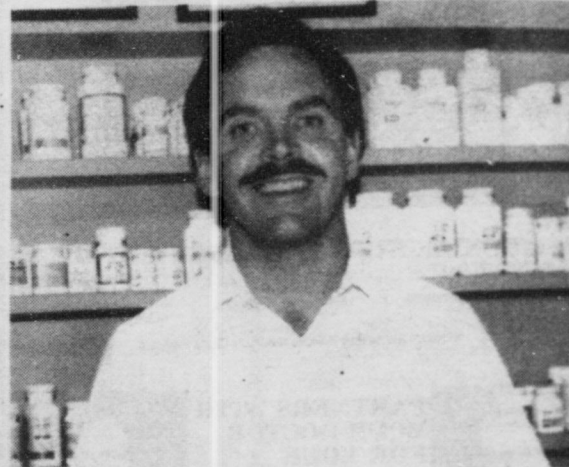
