Readers who take an interest in international matters may know that this year marks the 1,000 th anniversary of the coming of Christianity to Russia. Despite 71 years of rule from an antireligious government, the faith continues to thrive in what is now the Soviet Union. In fact, it is estimated that as many as 70 million people, or $25 \%$ of the population, still adhere to opularistian Faith. Those the Christian faith. Those numbers include 50 million members of the Russian Orthodox Church, 10 million Roman Catholics, 4 million Protestants, mainly Baptists and Pentecostalists, and million other believers various denominations.

Although repression still exists, the Communist gov ernment has relaxed some of its restrictive measures and is allowing various cele brations this year to mark brations this year to mari the anniversary. The faith arrived in Russia in 988 A.D. when Prince Vladimir of Rus converted and ordered his subjects to do likewise.
To help Soviet Christians celebrate, Suzanne Nagel, a member of New York's Trinity Episcopar Church, came up with an idea whereby America's Christian children would send "Birthday cards" to Russian Christian children congratulating them during this special them during led her cam
paign "The Crayon Brigade.
Nagel presented her idea o Katny Todd, coordinator of the National Council of Churches Ecumenical Travel Seminar Program, who was planning a program that would take as many as 1,000 Americans to the Soviet Union at various times during the year to help in the celebration. Todd liked Nagel's idea and agreed that ei's of the groups would some of the groups would hand-deliver the birthday cards. Hower, include not was expanded but also Am only chindren, but aiso American adults who would make and send greeting cards to their Russian coun terparts.

In 1986, the Council of Bishops of the Methodist Church published a docu ment in which they pointed out that the Methodists have a "basic faith in common with the Christian commun ity that, in spite of com munist restrictions, still ex ists in the Soviet Union. They also urged Methodists everywhere "to pray regu larly for our Christian sis lers and brothers in the Soviet Union, to study Russoviet religious life and sian religg life and thought, and to support ecumenical exchanges with Soviet churches

McLean Sales Tax Still Down

The State Comptroller's Office said recently that payments to cities and counties that collect local sales tax increased again this month Checks totaling $\$ 113.5 \mathrm{mil}$ lion were sent to 1,043 cities that collect local sales tax either one or one and onehalf percent.
For the second month in a Fow the second month in City of Mclean decreased City of Mclean decreased compared to the check sen during the same reporting period in 1987. This month's check was $\$ 2,093.60$ com pared to $\$ 2,269.47$ for the same period last year, decline of 7.75 percent.

However, year-to-date payments to McLean stand at $\$ 13,525.09$, compared to year-to-date payments in 1987 of $\$ 12,435.53$, an increase of 8.76 percent.
County-wide, the total amount refunded to taxing entities during this reporting period came to $\$ 148,399.2$ the same period last year, an the same period last year, an increase of 14.14 percent.
