The attendance committe will review the case and

decide if a student should receive credit.
If the committee decides to withhold credit, a student may appeal to the school board.

Students may be allowed to regain lost credit by fulfilling one of the following requirments: complete additional assignments, as specified by the committee, satisfy time-on task requirments before and or after school, attend tutorial sessions as scheduled, maintain the attendance standards for the rest of the semester or year.
In all cases, the student must maintain a passing grade.

The state has set aside extenuating circumstances, chosen by the committee, to excuse a student's absences, circumstances chosen by the local committee include: Religious Holidays, medical and dental appointments, extra-curricular activities,
