

Students at Groom ISD have become more and more aware of laws made in the State of Texas and how they effect them as students. House Bill 72 is still being felt with its great impact on education in Texas. The effects of what the state will propose on, state funding being unconstitutional is not fully known at this time.

Several new attendance laws were passed in the legislature last summer will effect students not only in Groom, but state-wide.
