## State Capital News

replace the Water Pollution Control board has been approved. Governor Connally recommended the measure as an aid to strengthening water pollution control. Bill will create a seven-member board with its own professional staff and provide for local enforcement of water quality standards.

### SHORT SNORTS

The proposed constitutional amendment to give equal rights to women cleared the Senate and is ready for final House vote.

Bill to increase maximum unemployment compensation from \$37 a week to \$45 a week (for those who earn \$85 or more) and hike minimum from \$10 to \$15 has cleared the Legislature.

After early faltering, the Open Meetings Bill to require all governmental agencies to meet in public gathered steam and won final legislative approval.

A resolution calling for the appointment of an interim committee to study air and water pollution, noise and land use is being studied by a subcommittee of the House Committee on State Affairs.

Governor Connally signed "medicaid" implementing legislation (effective Sept. 1) which will bring an estimated \$130,000,000 in medical benefits to 350,000 Texans on welfare rolls during the next year.

House has passed a bill permitting experimental 10-month school programs involving 50,000 Texas students in selected districts.

A resolution establishing an interim committee to study pricing and marketing prices in Texas has been favorably reported out of the House State Affairs Committee.

A quiet Senate committee meeting saw the death, on a 6-6 tie vote, of the House bill that would have let people sue the state or local units of government for injury done by public employees of all kinds.

Interim committee on faculty compensation—which made some recommendations to the current Legislature—will get another two years of existence, under a resolution adopted by the Senate and sent to the House.

Governor Connally delivered his first veto of the 60th Legislature when he killed the bill to give West Texas State University its own Board of Regents, removing it from the control of the Board of Regents, State Senior Colleges.

Pampa rancher Jim Campbell and farmer-rancher John A. Smith of Cameron were named heads of new Republican "task force" on agriculture.

District Judge E. E. Jordan of Amarillo was named judge of the Ninth Administrative Judicial District by Governor Connally.

Land Commissioner Jerry Sadtler has set 10 a.m. Aug. 1 for an oil-and-gas lease sale of the School Land Board and other state boards; School Land Board will hold a sulphur lease sale at the same time.

## Highway Patrol Investigates 22 Mishaps in April

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 22 accidents on rural highways in Gray County during the month of April, according to Sgt. J. W. Wilson, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in 18 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$27,865.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first four months of 1967 shows a total of 55 accidents resulting in one person killed, 39 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$48,255.

## Livestock Survey To Be Taken by Rural Carrier

Postmaster Frank Simpson reminds rural patrons of the McLean Post Office to be on the outlook for June Livestock Survey cards. Next week, mail carriers will leave survey cards in a sample of boxes along their routes.

"USDA bases livestock and poultry estimates on replies to this survey," Simpson explains. "It is important for everyone who gets a card to fill it out and return it to the carrier. This way, USDA gets a representative sample of the area's livestock and poultry holdings."

Carrier assisting with the survey is J. M. Hathaway, Route 1. Survey cards will be forwarded to Cary D. Palmer, state agricultural statistician, in Austin. After analyzing these cards, USDA statisticians are able to estimate the state's milk production, calf and pig crops, lamb and wool crops, and the number of hens and pullets.

"Information from this survey will guide livestock and poultry producers in making important business decisions," Simpson concludes.

## Baptist Men to Meet At Wellington

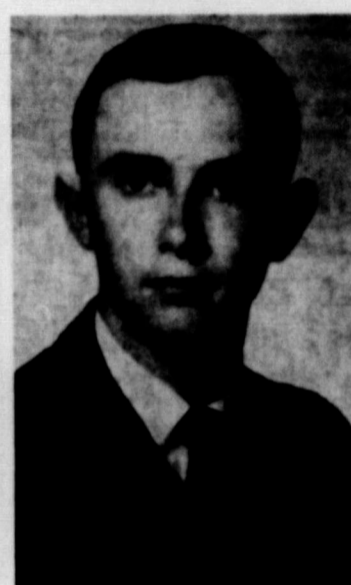
The North Fork Baptist Men's Association will have a meeting Thursday, May 25, at 8:00 p.m. at the First Baptist Church, Wellington.

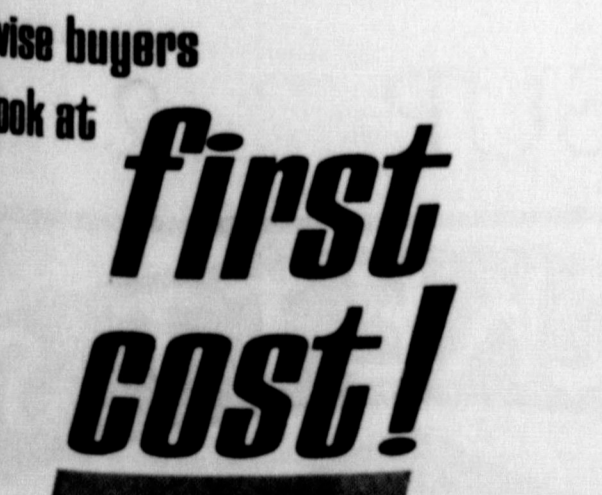

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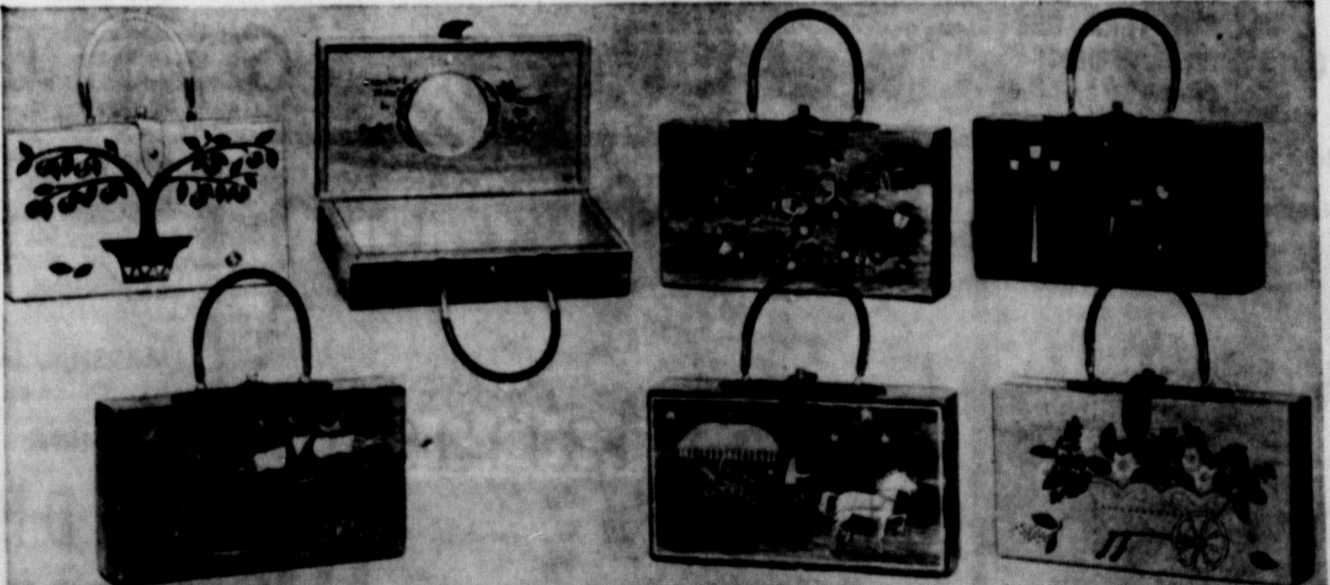
