## Public Notice

So thwestern Bell Telephone Company recently filed an applicetion with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC) for app oval to redefine the location of the demarcation point, or demarc. The demarc is where Southwestern Bell Telephone wiring connects with customer-maintained wiring.

This request will not increase customers' service rates. This request simply changes the point within the wiring where Southw estern Bell's maintenance responsibility ends and the custorrer's maintenance responsibility begins. As before, custorrers will be able to connect their own wiring directly to Southv estern Bell's network at points up to the new demarc.

Southwestern Bell is seeking approval of this new demarc location to bring its tariff into compliance with a Federal Communications Commission Order in CCDocket 88-57.

More information will be included in customers' bills beginning Fe oruary 1, 1992. Persons who wish to comment on the application should notify the PUC by March 20, 1992.
