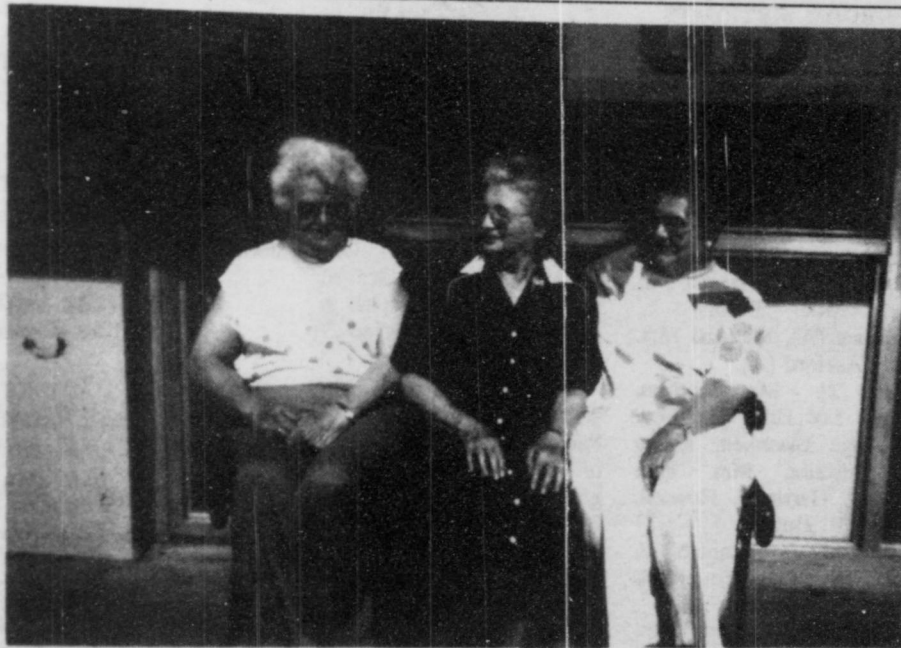

## Board Interviews Applicants For Head Football Job

The Groom School Board met Tuesday, July 9th in regular session. All members were present. Also attending were Brenda Homan, Nila Burgin, Donald Burgin, Bo Burgin, Dena Lambert, Marcia Conrad, Jay Lamb, Tammy Robinson, C. W. Williams, and Donna Burton.

Kenneth Sweatt introduced C. W. Williams, applicant for the football/basketball coaching position. A brief, informal interview was held discussing Groom's current sports programs and Mr. Williams' coaching philosophy.

The board then went into executive session asking Mr. Williams to stay and later

asking Jay Lamb in for a brief discussion.

At 9:42 they reconvened and offered employment to C. W. Williams at State Base Step 10, Masters degree overage of \$900.00, Step 10 increment of \$500.00, housing, personal hospitalization insurance and a coaching increment of \$5,100.00.

In other business the Board:

Approved use of school facilities for the Groom Day Celebration on Aug. 3, 1991.

Denny Babcock reported on the meeting of the CED created by recent legislation. The CED called for an election to be held

simultaneously with statewide county elections.

Bids were opened for food products, athletic uniforms, medical supplies, gasoline, and janitorial supplies.

Only two bids were received.

David Britten and Gary Friemel seconded to reject the one bid on gasoline and instructed the superintendent to obtain the best possible price for gasoline, oil, bus services, milk, bread, food, medical supplies, and athletic uniforms as they are needed.

## Fire Dept. Studies Expansion To City Fire Dept. Building

The Groom City Council met last week in regular session. All members were present.

Brent Stephens, representing the Groom Volunteer Fire Department met with the council to discuss placement to an addition to the fire hall. The fire department is currently attempting to seek a grant for the construction of a building. Stephens suggested that they extend the fire hall east towards the street. After some discussion, a suggestion was made that the dept. look at

### PROGRESSIVE RANCHER ...

Not long after the Comanche Indians were subdued in Palo Duro canyon in 1874, George Tyng became manager of the White Deer Land and Cattle Company near present-day White Deer, Texas. Tyng was to become known as "The Father of the Texas Panhandle". He was responsible for introducing fences, water wells, and windmills into the area, and he promoted the settlement of farms.



**PROTECTION AGAINST MISLEADING ADS**

A new law to combat mail scams is expected to provide much needed protection to Social Security beneficiaries besieged by various solicitations under the cover of official-looking envelopes. Called the DECEPTIVE MAILINGS PREVENTION ACT, the new law gives the United States Postal Service specific power to stop delivery of mail that gives the impression it is connected

with the Government.

The law says that any envelope (or the face of any postcard) that includes a name, seal, insignia, term, or symbol that could reasonably cause it to be mistaken for a mailing from the Government will not be delivered unless there is also a prominent "disclaimer." The disclaimer must appear on the envelope (or face of the postcard), and must clearly state that the mailing is not made or endorsed by the Government.



**Panhandle Rain has Perfect Timing**

Once again rain has blessed the countryside with much needed moisture. Area farmers are truly grateful. Precipitation now allows them to shut down expensive irrigation wells.

# Texas Public Safety Information

Fewer persons were killed in traffic accidents in Texas during the July 4th holiday period than at any time since at least 1970, according to preliminary figures released by the Texas Department of Public Safety.

"While we regret that we had seven fatalities in Texas during the 30-hour July 4th holiday period, we were pleased to see that we fell short of our estimate the 12 persons would die on Texas' streets and highways during the holiday," said DPS Assistant Director Lt. Col. James Wilson.

The previous lowest July 4th traffic death count was in 1973, when 9 persons died during the 30-hour holiday period. Four others later died of injuries, pushing the final total to 13 deaths that year.

"Of the seven deaths reported this July 4th," Wilson said, "three were in motorcycle accidents, two in auto-pedestrian accidents and two in vehicle accidents. In both the vehicle accidents, the victim had not been wearing a safety belt. The count might have been even lower if they had been buckled up."

All available Highway Patrol Troopers were on the roadways during the holiday period, which Wilson said may have discouraged drunken driving and speeding, the two leading causes of traffic deaths.

"Texas motorists also deserve our thanks for helping make it a safer July 4th," Wilson said.

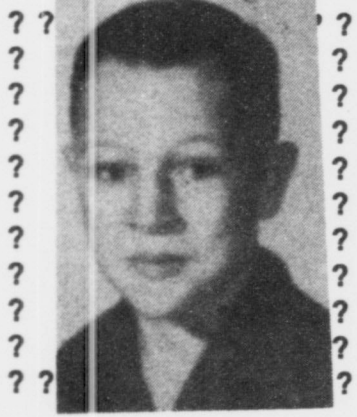
