Groom youths made an excellent showing at the 1992 Carson County Junior Livestock Show. 4-Her's and FFA members competed in the steer, heifer, pig and lamb shows.

Kori Brown, daughter of Susan and Lonny Brown, was the big winner in the heifer show winning Grand Champion and reserve. Kori carries on a winning tradition started by her father, Lonny and Uncle, Larry. The Brown's are very well known for their prize winning cattle. Kori plans to take the angus heifer, "Lady Bentley" on to the Houston Junior Livestock Show in a few weeks, and to a couple of other shows later on.

Chy Phillips, son of Twila Jackson, won the showmanship award and was awarded a silver belt buckle for the Steer Show. Chy

placed 3rd with a red angus steer. He also plans to take "Frito" on to the Houston Show.

Others in the Steer Show were Joe Rae Richardson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Richardson. He placed 2nd with a medium weight hereford. Sisters Julie, placed 4th in the medium weight hereford class and Jacey placed 2nd in the heavy weight division. The Richardsons will also make the trek to Houston.

Brodie Brown was the top winner for Groom in the pig show. His medium weight hampshire placed 1st in class. He is the son of Lana and Joe David Brown.

## City Water, Sewer Rates Increased By Council

The Groom City Council met in regular session on February 4th with all members present.

Mr. and Mrs. Mike Meaker met with the City Council to discuss the parking problem on the west side of St. Mary's Catholic School. The Meaker's stated that the diagonal parking there causes them problems getting out of their drive way. After some discussion, Greg Lamb moved to restrict parking on both sides of the street to parallel parking. All members voted in favor of the issue except Bill Homer who abstained.

In a unanimous decision the Council agreed to pay part of the cost of an ECA or EMT class. The cost of the school is \$101.00 per person with a minimum of 10. The Lion's Club will subsidize part of the cost as well. The cost will be taken from the road fund account. The contract with the City of Pampa Animal Control was renewed.

After a lengthy discussion, Bobby Cornett moved to raise the

minimum water rates and sewer rates. The minimum rate for water will be \$7.00 after the first 2,000 gallons and \$1.28 for each 1,000 gallons after the minimum. Sewer rates will increase by \$2.00. Ronny Fields seconded the motion and all members voted in favor of the issue.

May 2nd was set as election day, with Flora Hammers as the election judge.

In a motion by Fields, seconded by Thornton ordinance #172 was adopted. This ordinance restricts trucks over one ton from parking in residential areas of the city. A copy of the ordinance is in this week's edition of the Groom News.

### WATER & SEWER RATE INCREASED

The City of Groom has been forced to raise water and sewer rates to meet the cost of operating and maintaining the water system. State Law mandates that the city utilities be equal and uniform, and pay for all See City Water Rates, pg. 3

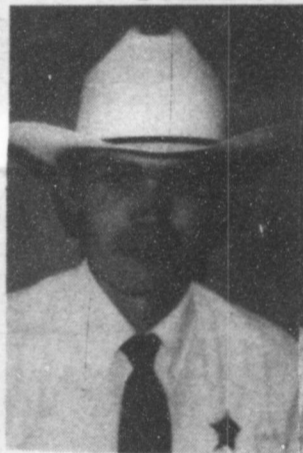

## City Water Rates

operating maintenance, depreciation and replacement costs associated with utilities. (V.T.C.S. Art. 1113) Water Rates for 2,000 gallons of water set in 1980 for \$5.00 will go to \$7.00, and rate for over 2,000 gallons will go from \$1.25 to \$1.28-an increase of \$.03. Sewer rate basic for residential will go from \$3.50 to \$5.50 - a rate increase of \$2.00 for each connection. All sewer rates will be increased \$2.00. Sewer charges average about \$1,220.00 per month, and water charges average \$4,880.00 monthly. The garbage charge is paid to Browning-Ferris Industries minus 5% allowed the city for collecting their fee. "The City has been fortunate in receiving grants from the State of Texas totaling \$428,123.00 to update water storage and water lines, and helped keep the cost of water and sewer low, but due to rising costs, the City Council has no alternative but to raise rates," said Mayor Jimmy Britten.



No person, firm, or corporation shall park any vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity of over one (1) ton for any purpose other than for loading or unloading, on any of the public streets, avenues, highways, or alleys located in the residential area of the City of Groom, Texas.

Not to park within fifty (50) feet of an intersection.

No person, firm, or corporation shall park any vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity of over one (1) ton on any public street, avenue, highway, or alley; and no person, firm, or corporation shall park any vehicle, regardless of type or size on any public street, avenue, highway, or alley, including the parkways, within the limits of the City of Groom, Texas, in such a manner that it obscures a clear view of an intersection or cross street, or in any other manner that would create a hazard or obstruction to the safe and efficient flow of normal traffic.

Penalty: Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this article found guilty or who pleads guilty, shall upon conviction therefore, be fined in any sum not less than \$10.00

nor more than \$200.00.

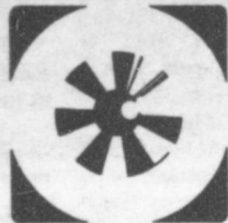

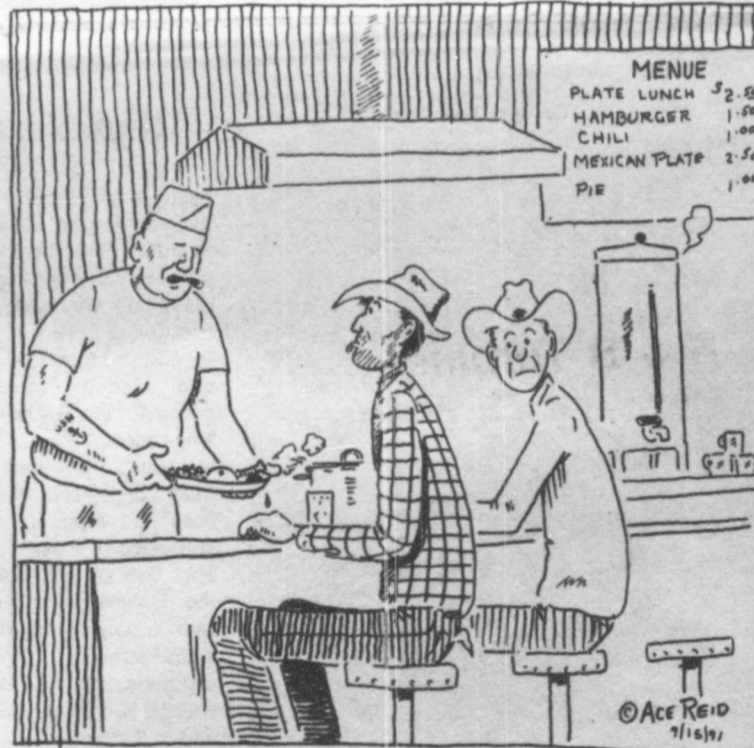

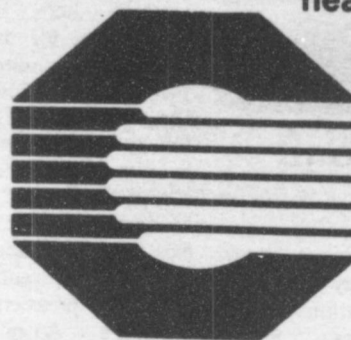

Briscoe girls have a 12-10 record while McLean is

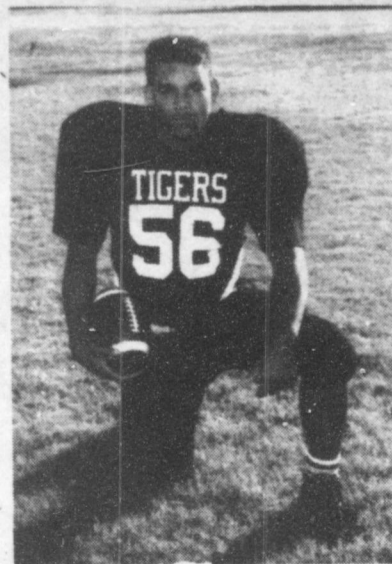
8-16.

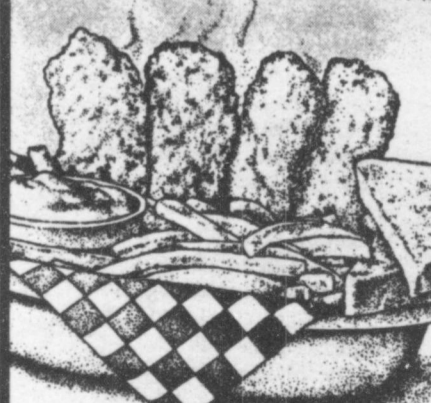
