## Groom Athletes Honored At Banquet



Groom Coaches' Jay Lamb, Mark Lance, Shirley Fields, and Terry O'Dell presented athletic awards to Groom athletes Monday night. Kristy Case and Bruce Britten were named Fighting Tigerette and Fighting Tiger, respectively.

Groom High School awarded its top honors Monday night during the 1992 High School Athletic Banquet.

Bruce Britten was awarded the Fighting Tiger award while Kristy Case was named Fighting Tigerette.

A full house was in attendance Monday night for the banquet and barbecue.

Coach Jay Lamb introduced as special guests to Mondays' banquet, Bill Bowling, location manager of Paramount Pictures, and Kate McCarty of the Texas Department of Commerce's filming division, Austin, Texas. Lamb told the guests during the introduction he hoped to

see them around Groom for the next several months to come. Bowling is in Groom to search out a location for the movie "Leap of Faith".

Lamb proceeded to introduce and speak of the great year coming to an end for Groom High School athletics.

Coach Terry O'Dell introduced the Tiger football team, and the players making the all-district team, Brian Baker, Bruce Britten, Matt Fields, Daryl Homer and Nick Kuehler.

Matt Fields was named Most Valuable Player in football.

Coach Mark Lance introduced the Junior Varsity football team, saying Groom's large freshman class should help Groom in the future.

Coach O'Dell recognized the varsity girls basketball team and he spoke of just how close the Tigerettes came to making big things happen.

Kristy Case and Karen Babcock were named MVP's in basketball.

Coach Lamb could not name an individual as MVP to the 1992 Tigers basketball team but rather named the man-to-man defense of all 12 individuals as the MVP.

Karen Babcock was named MVP in girls track, qualifying for Regional in several events.

Bruce Britten was selected MVP in tennis and track while Lesa Sweatt and Kristy Case were named MVP's, making the regional tournament, in tennis.

Lastly, Coach O'Dell recognized the 1992 Cross Country team. This being the first cross country team Groom has organized for competition.

Also awarded plaques for best free throw shooting was Kristi Case, hitting 81% and Daryl Homer, 70%.

#### ACTIVITIES

Groom Economic Development Corporation members and other volunteers have been busy the past several weeks. Some of the activities include:

**Trees:** Several volunteers showed up to help plant trees on the lawn of the community center recently. The planting of these trees is a part of a landscape program which could possibly include all of main street. The Australian pines were purchased from a nursery in Shamrock. They will also be used as a part of the Christmas decorating scene at the community center.

**Remodeling:** Several volunteers showed up Saturday to start remodeling the south portion of the community center building. All the partitions were removed from this part of the building several months ago. This portion of the building contains about four thousand square feet of area and if the remodeling is completed by Groom Day, some activities will be held in the area. A work list has been posted and volunteers are asked to show up on Saturdays or any other day of the week for work assignments. Money is not available to complete the project in the manner necessary at this point but there is plenty of work that can be done that will not require expenditures.

**Roof:** Forty two hundred square feet of roof on the south portion of the community center building received a new roof this week. A drain was also added to help remove the water from the roof. The north portion of the roof was installed six years ago.

**RCD Program:** GEDC joined the Resource Conservation and Development Program recently. This is a partnership for conservation and rural development for counties and cities and rural areas whereby that grant

money can be applied for to complete needed projects within a community. Bobby Pool is the representative from Carson County. GEDC will submit a list of possible projects for future funding to the RCD board by May 12, 1992. These projects include City Beautification, Remodeling south portion of community center building, USDA approved kitchen for the community center, fire truck garage, improvement of curbs and sidewalks, city park equipment, tennis courts and paving around

community center.

Paramount Pictures: GEDC members met with and continue to work with representatives of Paramount Pictures who will be filming a motion picture here.

**City Clean Up:** GEDC is encouraging everyone to help in the clean up of our city. This needs to be done anyway, but more especially since many visitors will be coming to Groom within the next several months. "Paint Up, Fix Up, Clean Up - Company Is Coming!"

Amarillo.

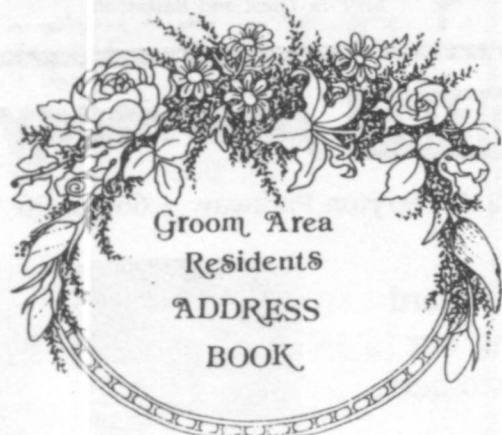

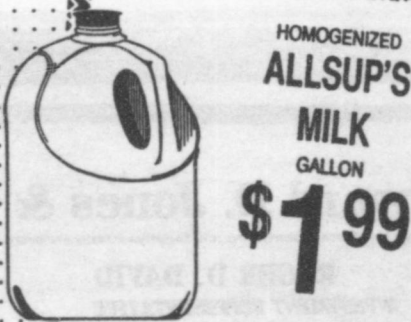

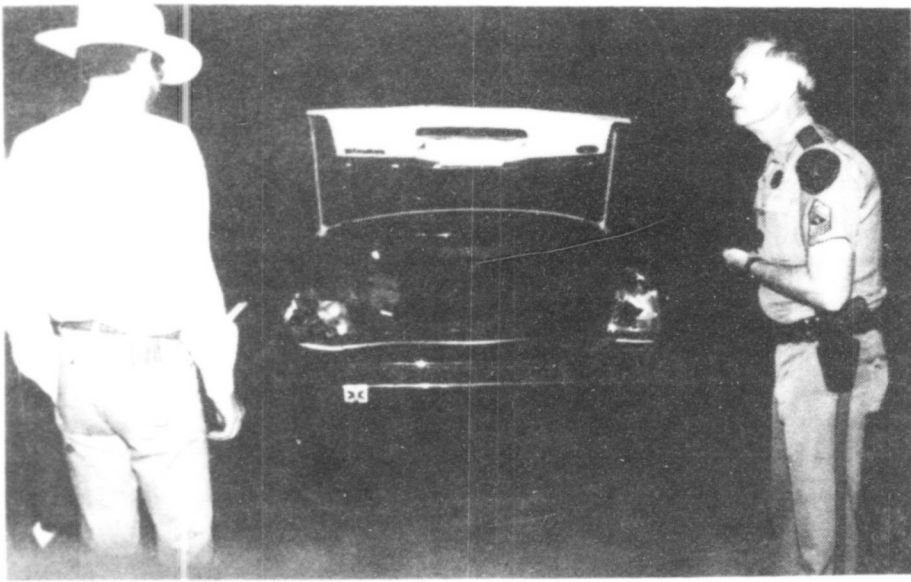

## Sheriff Investigates Parental Kidnapping



**SHERIFF'S REPORT**  
One adult and two juveniles were taken into custody on Highway 60 west of White Deer by Carson County Sheriff's deputies following a pursuit which began at the Oklahoma/Texas border in Wheeler County. Officers from Carson County, Gray County, Hemphill County and

Wheeler County were involved in the pursuit as well as several troopers from the Texas Department of Public Safety and the Texas Rangers. During the pursuit the suspects repeatedly rammed a DPS patrol car causing extensive damage. Shots were fired by the law enforcement officers to end the pursuit after the

suspects rammed the DPS patrol car and then began driving on the wrong side of Highway 60. Law enforcement agencies involved in the pursuit were concerned that the suspect vehicle would pose an extreme threat to other motorists on the highway. A number of knives and firearms were found in the suspect's vehicle as well as

ammunition for several weapons. The three suspects are currently facing charges of Attempted Capital Murder in Texas, Armed Robbery in Oklahoma and Armed Robbery in Arkansas.

The pursuit began at 10:10 p.m. in Wheeler County and ended at 11:08 p.m. in Carson County.

This past week Sheriff's Department deputies investigated two incidents of public intoxication and made arrests for that charge and assisted the DPS in a two-vehicle collision with injuries on I-40. Deputies assisted with the investigation of a car fire on Highway 207 south of Borger and began investigation of check forgery in Groom.

One subject was arrested by Sheriff's deputies for Assault and Criminal Trespass in Conway.

Deputies are investigating a report of oil field theft from wells north of Skellytown and officers are currently monitoring a suspected attempt at parental kidnapping in Groom.

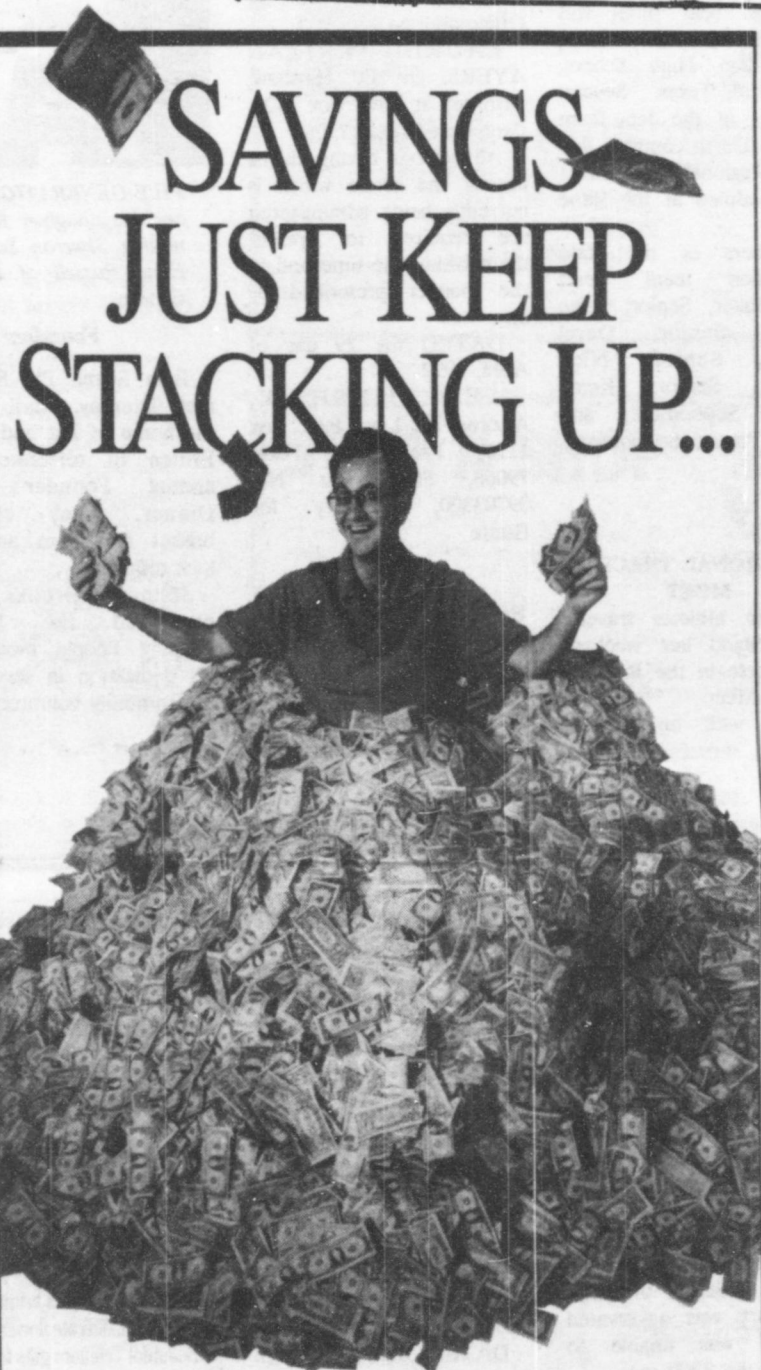
