Formerly the CEO of four corporations, Woodward was taking a leave of absence, to help friend reorg, to help a friend reorganize his catering business. Realizing that he needed to have a better understanding of what that business entails, he leased the friends business for one show. Discovering that he enjoyed cooking be began enjoyed
more and more gourmet cooking
The movie was being directed by Frances Ford Coppala. He thought Woodward should buy the business. Woodward didn't really take him seriously
when he said he would put up the money.
A week went by and Coppala kept insisting that Woodward find out what

To make a iong story short. he eventually became
Frank Woodwards partner. "We paid him off at the end of the show. . . he was really more of a sponsor than a partner. . . all he ever asked of us was that we be the best." said Woodward.
