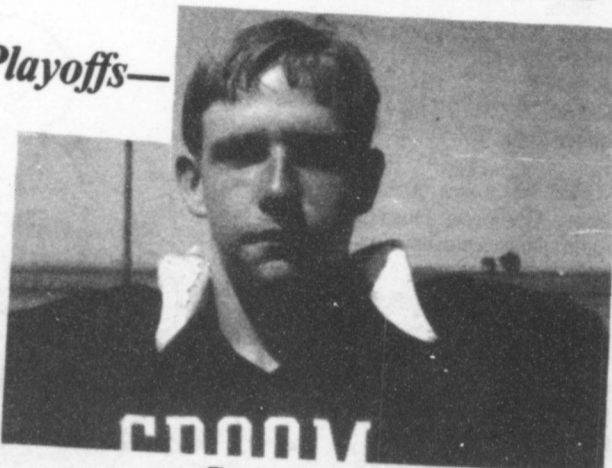

## Bi-District Tilt In Chillicothe For Friday, 13th Game

Groom Tigers completed the 1992 football season last Friday night against Miami, winning 52-6. The win gave Groom outright second place in district 1-1A behind McLean who was the only team this year to beat Groom. Groom ended the regular season 8-1. McLean finished 6-4. These two teams will enter the playoffs representing District 1-1A this week. Groom lost the coin toss Saturday morning with district winner Chillicothe for the home field advantage so Groom will play Chillicothe in Chillicothe Friday night at 7:30 p.m. Chillicothe is also 8-1 overall. McLean will host their playoff game this week against Valley at 7:30 p.m.

Miami never was a threat to the Tigers Friday night in

the season finale for both teams as Groom jumped on Miami early taking a 38-0 halftime lead. Miami finished the season in last place going 0-5 in district, 0-10 overall.

Paul McLaughlin scored twice, returning a punt for a touchdown of 65 yards in the first quarter and adding a touchdown run of 24 yards. Bo Burgin threw a pair of touchdown passes both to Wes Hall for 14 yards and 47 yards. Bart Britten scored on a 20 yard run, Seth Ritter on a 25 yard run and John Weinheimer recovered a fumble in the endzone to end the game. Tom Lambert kicked well Friday night, kicking 4 PAT's. Brandon Crump kicked the final PAT for Groom.

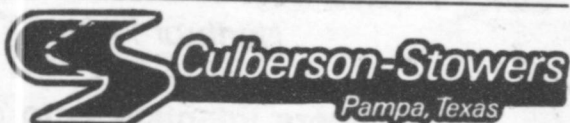

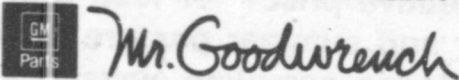

### Carson County Sheriff's Report

During the first week of November there were fourteen persons booked into the Carson County Jail. Five persons were arrested for DWI (1st offense), one for DWI (2nd offense), one for Public Intoxication, two for Driving While License is Suspended, four for out-of-county warrants and one for Resisting Arrest.

Deputies responded to a variety of domestic disputes and reports of suspicious persons and assisted area fire departments with traffic control at grass fires. The Sheriff's Department is investigating an incident of vandalism near White Deer and we have received additional information regarding a theft from a vacant farmhouse south of Panhandle.

The Sheriff's Department is currently investigating a report of Assault with a Motor Vehicle which allegedly took place in the country between White Deer and Panhandle. This matter has been turned over to the County Attorney for

evaluation.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department and a Ranger from the Texas Cattle Raisers Association are continuing to follow-up on leads dealing with a theft of horses from the Panhandle area during the summer. Deputies are also investigating reports of prostitution at the rest areas along Interstate 40. Residents should be cautious of contact with any suspicious persons along the highways. The transients we have dealt with over the past few months have considerable criminal histories and often have a history of confinement in mental institutions. We would much rather check a

report of a suspicious person than to later investigate a crime which involved the subject. Your reports of suspicious persons are greatly appreciated.

Thirteen 9-1-1 calls were received by the Carson County Sheriff's Department for dispatch to police, fire and ambulance services.

## State Education Plan From A Local Point Of View

Recently, Governor Ann Richards, Lt. Governor Bob Bullock and Speaker Gib Lewis unveiled the "Fair Share Plan" to finance public education in Texas. The 12 organizations comprising the School Finance Working Group, as well as the Texas Association of Secondary School Principals and the Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association, are disappointed and dismayed by this plan and in the state's lack of commitment to adequately fund Texas' public education system.

The "Fair Share Plan" is a classic case of passing the buck from the state to local school districts - but the bucks will come from the pockets of local property taxpayers. The plan will cause the largest local property tax hike in Texas history, and it will result in a drastic reduction in state aid for our students. It is a lose-lose situation.

A reduction in state aid means only one thing - another substantial increase in property taxes - an increase to the tune of perhaps \$2.5 - \$3 billion over the biennium.

Public education costs will not remain constant next year. Though the proposal would add \$650 million in new state funds to public schools over the biennium, schools will have more students to educate, more classrooms to construct, and

more teachers to pay. Additionally, schools will be faced with salary increases as required by law, continued pressure to bring classroom teachers' salaries up to the national average, and higher health care benefits. On top of that, school, like all Texans, will see increases in utility and transportation costs next year. All of this will more than offset the increase in state aid, leading to an actual decrease in state aid per pupil.

In essence, the local property tax continues to be the cash cow of public education because of state policy, a policy that has been declared unconstitutional on three successive occasions and cannot be made right by a constitutional amendment, which this plan proposes.

The state leadership says they won't support a tax bill because the people of Texas have made their voices heard loud and clear. But the taxpayers are only given half the story. They have not been told that the "Fair Share Plan" will cause local property taxes to skyrocket, and that even the poorest of the poor school districts will have to raise local property taxes to unbearable levels just to stay even.

Under the "Fair Share Plan," Edcouch-Elsa ISD, the poorest school district in the state, will have to increase their tax rate by 22 cents for an increase of only

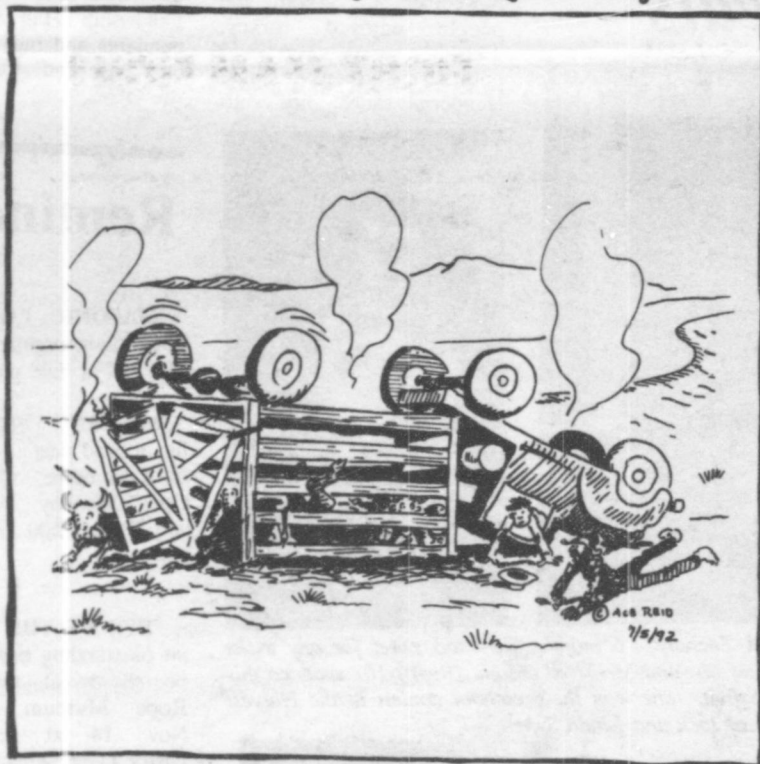

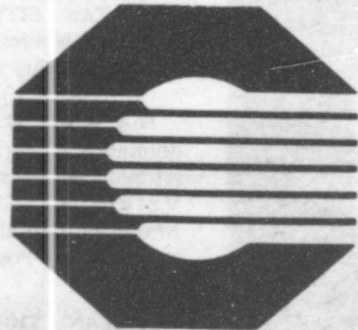

## McGill Visits Switzerland Each Summer Positive Effect Shows In Her Teaching

Its a long way from the Texas panhandle to

Lausanne, Switzerland, but teacher Marla McGill of The Grandview-Hopkins I.S.D. makes the trip every summer. The ideas and inspiration she brings back

with her enrich the classroom for her second and third grade students.

Ms. McGill began going to Europe eight years ago. A lifelong resident of the panhandle before her travels began, she graduated from Amarillo Tascosa High School. As a high school student, her main interest was music, particularly singing.

After high school graduation, she attended Amarillo College, and then went on to complete a degree in Music Education from West Texas State University. Trained as a choral director, she was unable to find a job in her field. To make ends meet, she took a job as a Study Hall aide in an Amarillo middle school. Her experiences on the job gave her career a new direction.

After working with middle school students, Ms. McGill became convinced that the most important job in education was to reach students when they were in elementary school. At a young age, students are more easily influenced and can learn to make better choices as adolescents. Ms. McGill returned to school and completed her elementary certification. She began teaching at Grandview-Hopkins I.S.D. immediately afterwards.

After thirteen years as an elementary teacher, Ms. McGill has never regretted her choice. Although she was subsequently offered jobs as a Choral Director in secondary schools, she turned them down.



How did a panhandle native become a summer resident of Lausanne, Switzerland? Ms. McGill first traveled to Europe on a group tour. While on the tour, she met and made friends with a couple she revisits each year.

In order to make the trip affordable, Ms. McGill works as a helper for the family she stays with every year. Although her flight to Europe is not cheap, she is able to reduce expenses by

working for her keep.

Her trips to Switzerland have had a positive effect on her teaching. Learning about the variety of cultures existing so close to one another in Europe has taught her to value the uniqueness that each student brings to the classroom. Just as different cultures have different characteristics, so do different students. Ms. McGill values each of her students' abilities and works to bring out the best in each.

Her trips to Europe taught Ms. McGill that Europeans are much more knowledgeable about their history than are Americans. After her experiences overseas, she shifted her lessons to bring in more history. Students in her class use historical biography and stories to develop reading and writing skills.

When she is not traveling, Ms. McGill is always learning. Currently, she is studying French. She reads widely, and continues her interest in music as a music leader in her church. Grandview-Hopkins sees her teaching and music skills displayed when she sponsors the Christmas play each year. Ms. McGill is one of the teachers who makes Grandview-Hopkins a special place to learn.

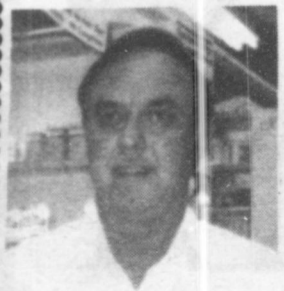

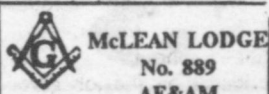

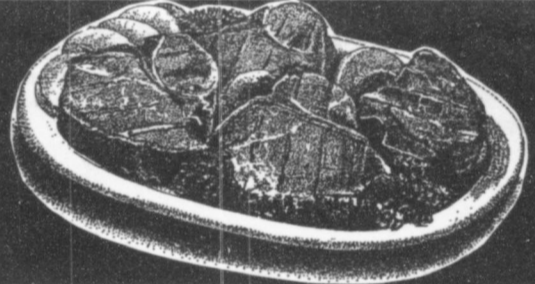
