



On Saturday afternoon, May 1st, a Schneider Trucking Company driver





Lynch Glass received 104 votes, Joe Ray Riley had 94, Robbie Turpen Sanderson netted 92, Randy Stalls pulled in 69, Donna Monigomery received 44 and Lana Stump had 42.

In the city election the uncontested candidate for mayor, Sam Haynes, received 194 votes. Alderman Casper Smith received 189 and Andy Eck received 171.
