Tigerettes Win First In District, Tigers Finish Second Place

Groom hosted the district track meet last week. The Tigerettes won the meet with 184 points. The Tigers placed 2nd, losing to Valley by only 3 points.

First and second places will be going to the regional meet, April 30 - May 1 in Levelland. Third place winners are alternates and may also attend.

The Groom girls 1600, 800 and 400 meter relay teams all placed 1st. Karen Babcock qualified for the regional meet in the high jump as well as Sandie Conrad placing 1 and 2 respectively.

Rebecca Conrad won the 800 meter race to qualify.

Kay Case won a second place in the discus.

Melanie Friemel placed 2nd in the 3200 meter race

and the 300 meter hurdles.

Marie Conrad placed 2nd in the 400.

Tracksters who placed third and will be alternates are: Stacy Fields, shot; Sandie Conrad, long jump; Melinda Burgin, 200 meter run; Alicia Woods, 1600 meter race.

In the boys meet Valley placed 1st with 163 points followed by Groom with 160.

The Tigers who will be going on to regional are: Shannon Miller and Matt Fields in the Shot. Miller placed 1st with 46.0½, Fields placed 2nd. Matt went on to win the discus. Seth Ritter won the pole vault competition with 11 feet. Bryan Crowell placed 2nd in the 800 meter run.

Paul McLaughlin placed 2nd in both the 300 meter hurdles and 110 meter hurdles.

The boys relay teams both will go to regional. The 1600 meter team placed 1st and the 400 meter relay team second.

Boys who placed third and will be alternates for the regional meet are: Ty Lambert, pole vault; Wes Hall 400 meter run; and Corkey Hickey, 200 meter run.

The Junior High teams also did very well. The Junior High girls placed second; losing out to Valley. Team scores were as follows: Valley 186; Groom 150½; Silverton 57½; Lefors 54; McLean 26; Patton Springs 18; Kelton 13 and Lakeview 0.

BFI Advises Council Of Trash Rate Increase In October

BFI Waste Systems of Amarillo representatives attended the Groom City Council meeting last week to say Groom's contract is up October 1, 1993 and the rates of trash pickup were going up. The city's ten year contract with BFI has seen several increases, the last one coming October, 1, 1991. "The 1993 increase could be significant with the disposal fee possibly doubling, some tripling," said Mr. Graham. The limitations are the same as last year, only stricter restrictions on picking up discarded refrigerators.

The City Council approved BFI's request to renew their ten year contract.

Courtney Sharp of Panhandle Regional Planning Commission was present to discuss with the council the possibilities of Groom applying for a Parks and Wildlife grant to build a new set of tennis courts. Mr. Sharp said that the scoring factors would be determined on the recreational plan in the area. Three factors would be looked at in order for Groom to receive a grant for new tennis courts: 1) tennis courts 2) baseball field 3) walking trail. The community must support all three phases he said to show the money would be

The Reserve Officers are fully-certified as law enforcement officers and have the same powers of arrest as a regular Deputy Sheriff. These officers are required to continually upgrade their training in order to keep their peace officer's license valid as are full-time deputies.

Our reserves receive no compensation for their work and all provide their volunteer service in addition to their full-time jobs. They are licensed by the State of Texas and bonded in Carson County.

Mr. Colfax was born in New Jersey and was a former resident of Groom.

Doppler Dave Draws Crowd of 50 Weather Buffs

"Doppler" Dave Oliver, KFDA Meteorologist told the crowd of approximately fifty in attendance Monday night that "believe it or not lightning kills more people a year than does tornadoes."

He explained the different kinds of severe weather in the Texas Panhandle. They included tornadoes, lightning, hail, flash flooding and high dangerous winds.

By using a VCR he showed films of tornadoes and their paths of destruction and how all tornadoes are not created equal. One of the worst,

and largest, tornadoes he knew of occurred in 1979 in Wichita Falls, Texas. Forty-two people were killed during the Wichita Falls tornado. As far as tornado alley, Oliver said, "We are a part of tornado alley. Most tornadoes occur throughout the Panhandle beginning May 1 through June 16, a period of six weeks."

Oliver said, "Tornadoes are classified on an F scale, 0-5, the worst being an F5."

The Fritch tornado was an F5 tornado, because of the width and the wind strength of the storm.

Carson County Sheriff's Report

Ten persons were confined in Carson County Jail since last week. Those persons were arrested for the following offenses: (3) First Offense DWI, (4) Possession of Marijuana Under 2 Oz., (1) Second Offense DWI, (1) Public Intoxication and (1) Contempt of Court (Brownsville Warrant).

The subject arrested on Contempt of Court charges out of Brownsville was previously arrested in that jurisdiction for Failure to Pay Child Support. The subject was ordered by that court to begin regular payments or to face charges of Contempt of Court. It would appear that the subject did not take the court seriously, but he will have the opportunity to appear before the same judge in Brownsville after he is returned to the court by Brownsville Sheriff's deputies.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department is currently investigating reports of neglect and abuse

to a disabled infant. This investigation is a cooperative effort of the Carson County Sheriff, White Deer City Marshal, Department of Human Services Child Protective Service and the Stinnett Police Department.

Deputies responded to numerous medical assistance calls, grass fire reports, reports of suspicious persons and vehicles and a house fire.

The Department of Human Services/Child Protective Services referred an investigation to the Sheriff's Department which involved family violence resulting in four broken ribs to the mother of young children. While the mother did not wish to have law officers notified of the situation, DHS/CPS felt that the children might be in danger of physical or emotional trauma and they alerted the Carson County Sheriff's Department of the situation.

The Carson County Sheriff has requested assistance from the Texas Attorney General's Office with regards to false

identification cards which are currently being sold to local youths. While many of the youths purchasing the cards intend to use the ID for alcoholic beverage purchases, others are attempting to disguise their identity when stopped by police and when pawning stolen merchandise at area pawn shops. If you are carrying or using a false identification card or certificate, the least of your problems may be having a law officer confiscate the card. We are exploring which methods of dealing with the situation might be most beneficial. If you insist on carrying the card and using it, you may be able to assist in our research.

We are receiving more calls regarding packs of dogs in the rural areas. With this being the season for newborn calves and lambs, we are making every effort to eliminate any threat to livestock. If you really care about your family pet or your working dog, it is your responsibility to control the

animal. Not only are you responsible for any damage caused by your dog, it is most likely that your animal will be destroyed if it appears to present a continuing or current hazard to livestock.

Methodist Book Available History

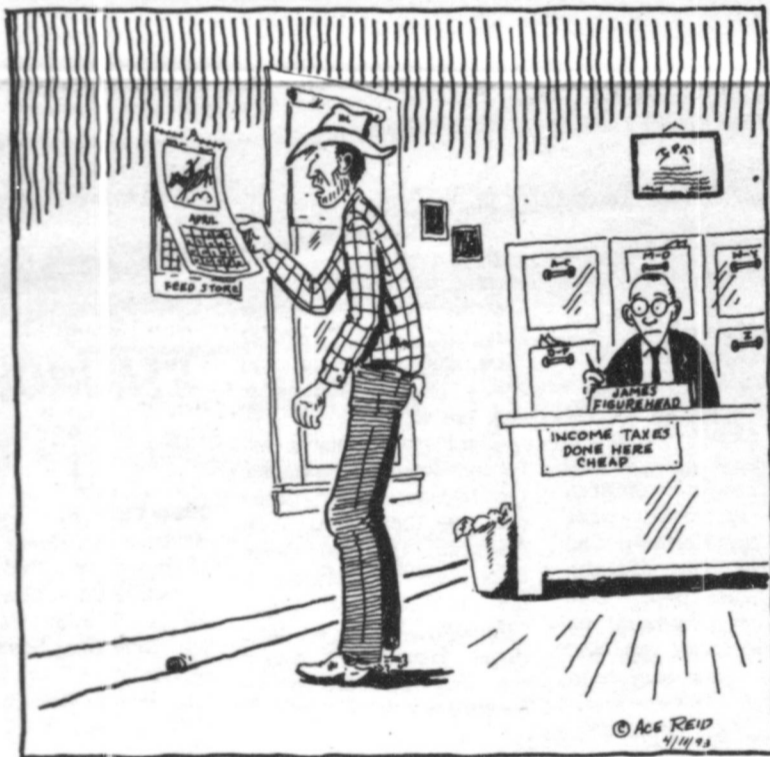

The City of McLean has been notified by the Texas Department of Health that the water being supplied by our system exceeds the following maximum constituent level for Nitrate specified by the Department "Drinking Water Act," Public Law 93-523 (U.S.). The limit is set at 10 milligrams of Nitrate (as nitrogen) per liter of water. The amount of Nitrate (as nitrogen) in the water to be 11.73 milligrams per liter.

Adults and children over the age of 6 months need not be concerned about drinking water from the tap. An excess of Nitrate intake by an infant under the age of 6 months may reduce its available oxygen supply and possibly produce "blue baby" symptoms. Parents are advised to find other sources of drinking water such as bottled water, for their infants under 6 months of age. All doctors and hospitals in the area have been notified of this situation. The city will offer to provide bottled water of acceptable quality to pregnant women and to infants under 6 months of age for cooking and drinking purposes.

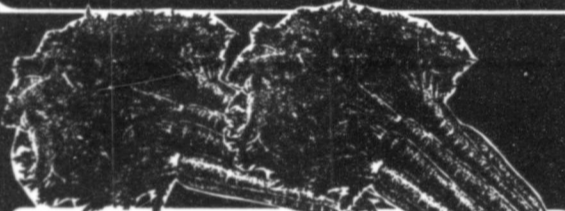

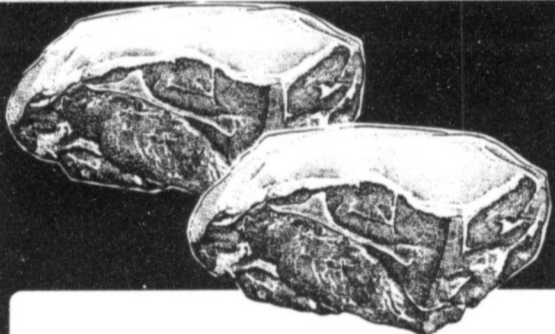
