

Carson County Sheriff Investigates Burglaries And Check Forgeries

By Loren Brand, Sheriff There are currently fourteen persons incarcerated in the Carson County Jail. We have two persons awaiting transfer to the Texas Department of Corrections. One will be transferred during this

department has received four reports of physical or sexual abuse to children this past week. All matters are currently under investigation by our department and Child Protective Services.

We have received an additional complaint

regarding check forgery which does not appear to be connected with other forgeries we were investigating earlier this month. In all cases, the checks belonged to persons outside Carson County, but all were cashed at businesses within the county.

The Sheriff's Department and Texas Highway Patrol arrested three subjects near Groom for suspicion of motor vehicle theft. When arrested the subjects were found to be carrying a handgun, a large quantity of alcoholic beverages which are presumed to be stolen

which may tie in with burglaries in Illinois. The vehicle, which was stolen from Springfield, Illinois, is impounded in Groom. All three suspects are being held in the Carson County Jail pending extradition to Illinois.

We are currently investigating reports of an individual trying to pass altered or counterfeit currency along Interstate 40. The subject is apparently trying to alter two-dollar bills to make them appear to be one hundred dollar bills. His work has not been successful so far.

The Sheriff's Department is investigating reports of persons selling meat products in the area without proper documentation or local approval. The best advice we can give potential customers is that anything that sounds like "too good of a deal" probably is. There are a number of scams that these people try to pull, but it can only be done with the cooperation of the victims. Your safest bet is to deal only with people you know and not to trust the sales pitch of someone who has a freezer sitting in the back of a pickup.

> citizens of our county are concentrating on preparations for Christmas, there are a number of predators who pass through Carson County looking for an opportunity to do some "one-stop-shopping" at your homes. Please make every effort to have your home appear to be occupied when you're absent and to secure windows and doors the best you can. There's probably no way to totally secure your home from someone who is determined to enter, but you can certainly make it as difficult as possible.

Our department has made several changes in our patrol coverage of the county which gives us more manpower during the evening hours and earlier into the mornings. We are focusing our patrols primarily on back roads and checking to see who is out at night. This is not meant as an inconvenience to residents. It's just the best way we have of trying to prevent crimes before they happen. While we may recognize your pickup or car, if we can't clearly see who is driving the vehicle, we would rather check to be sure that the proper person is behind the wheel rather than take a report from you in the morning after the vehicle is discovered to be

Old Fashioned Christmas Remembered Fondly

An old-fashioned Christmas! What wonderful memories and images that expression evokes!

In the days before Christmas, Mother would be busy at the old wood stove, baking special breads, pies, cakes and sugar cookies, or making maple sugar candy. Sister would be helping mother in the kitchen, while Brother kept the wood box filled with wood.

Dad would go into the woods and chop down the Christmas tree, bringing it home triumphantly on a sled. The tree was placed in the parlor, with real candles decorating it, as well as strings of popcorn and cranberries that had been strung by the children. Popcorn balls wrapped in tinfoil and paper cones filled with homemade candy also decorated the tree.

The Christmas actually began much earlier in the old days, for most gifts were handmade and so had to be worked on months in advance. The boys often made wooden objects, while the girls might embroider handkerchiefs or aprons. Mother, of course, kept her needles busy as she knit or crocheted garments for the whole family. Dad would whittle whistles or animals, or make a hobby horse or wooden doll.

On Christmas Eve, at the old country church, the tree was the biggest you'd ever seen, ablaze with candles.

Nearby someone held a tenfoot pole that had a wet sponge tied on the end, should a fire start.

The bells would ring out over the countryside, bringing families in their sleighs or bobsleds, eager to worship the new-born King. What a delightful, jingling sound the bells on the horses would made, as they trotted through the snowy countryside. the bobsled or sleigh would be filled with hay, and the youngsters would snuggle under lap robes and gaze at the stars above, or hop on one of the heavy runners for an exciting ride.

A Christmas play would be performed at the church the children, and afterwards Santa would make an appearance, rewarding the youngsters with goodies.

After hanging their stocking over the fireplace on Christmas Eve, the children would go to bed, with anticipation.







Grandview-Hopkins School Board Meets

The school board of the Grandview-Hopkins I.S.D. met in regular session in the school cafeteria on Tuesday, December 14th. President Marshall Hopkins called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read, and the board approved all bills presented for payment. In other financial business, the board approved a series of budget amendments to bring budget coding in line with changes required by the Texas Education Agency.

After reviewing information presented by the superintendent, the board voted unanimously to withdraw from a class action lawsuit filed by the Texas Association of School Boards on behalf of all members of its Workmen's Compensation Pool. The board then proceeded to appoint a textbook committee to review new textbooks for the 1994-95 school year and make recommendations for adoption to the board. The textbook committee, which consists of the superintendent and all teachers, will review Supplementary Readers Learning Systems for grades 1 through 6.

On first reading, the board voted to approve Policy DEC (LOCAL), which sets policies

concerning salary schedules for professional and non-professional employees. The second reading of the policy will take place at the next regularly scheduled board meeting.

The board approved the administration of the Iowa Test of Basic Skills to students in grades 1 through 6 during the current school year. Students are no longer required to take the

NAPT, and the board elected to administer the ITBS in its place. Students in grades 3 through 8 will also take the TAAS exam this year.

Reports concerning school district investments, progress on the Grandview-Hopkins Foundation, School Finance, and the new Accountability System proposed by the Texas Education Agency, were presented by the superintendent. No action was taken by the board on any of these items.

After evaluating the

superintendent in executive session, the board reconvened in open session to vote on the superintendent's contract. In a unanimous vote, the board extended the superintendent's contract through the 1995-96 school

Community Scholarship Program Targets Rural Areas In Need Of Health Care

A new Community Scholarship Program (CSP), administered by the Center for Rural Health Initiatives, is a federal, state, and community partnership which supports students who are committed to returning to their rural communities to practice primary health care. The purpose of the program is to increase the availability of primary health care in rural Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) in Texas.

The CSP is open to sician assistant and nurse practitioner students and to students in their third or fourth year of medical

school. Students are nominated for the program by community-based sponsors. A sponsor must be located in a rural Texas HPSA and commit to funding 35 percent of the student's educational expenses as well as to providing a full-time practice opportunity to the student when he or she is ready to practice. The Center for Rural Health Initiatives and the National Health Service Corps provide the remaining 65 percent of the funding.

A student must be a resident of the rural HPSA in which the sponsor is located. In return for the payment of educational expenses, the student agrees to provide one year of practice to the sponsor for each year of scholarship, for a minimum of two years.



New Law Goes Into Effect January 1

A new law that goes into effect January 1, 1994, will eliminate the need for commercial vehicle operators to have their commercial vehicles undergo dual inspections. The new inspection program to be overseen by the Texas Department of Public Safety, will combine the U.S. Department of Transportation inspection with the State of Texas safety inspection.

Beginning January 1, inspections obtained at other than an official commercial Texas State Inspection Station will not be accepted.

Commercial motor vehicle means any selfpropelled or towed vehicle except a farm vehicle with a gross weight, registered weight or gross weight rating of less than 48,000 pounds used on a public highway to transport passengers or property when: the vehicle or combination of vehicle has a gross weight, registered or gross weight rating in excess of 26,000 pounds; or the vehicle is designed to transport more than 15 people including the driver; or the vehicle is used to transport an amount of hazardous materials requiring placarding under the federal Hazardous





Farm Home Administration Develops Loan Program For Socially Disadvantaged

The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) has new loan program designed to help members of socially disadvantaged groups, including minorities, acquire land for farming in Texas.

August Hesse III, FmHA County Supervisor, for Carson, Hutchinson, Moore and Potter Counties, said that under the program FmHA is trying to find persons in those categories who are interested in farming and can qualify for an FmHA Farm Ownership loan. The FmHA is prepared to sell or lease to them a farm held in its inventory, if any are available in their county, or make a loan for purchase of land on the open market, Hesse said.

FmHA can also provide other loan and technical assistance, if needed, to help the borrower get started. Socially disadvantaged population groups include Hispanics, Native

Americans, Blacks, Asians, and Pacific Islanders.

Persons who think they might be eligible for the rogram should contact the local FmHA office for the county in which they live.

The Federal Equal Credit Opportunity Act prohibits creditors from discriminating against credit applicants on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, marital status handicap, or age (provided that the applicant has the capacity to enter into a binding contract), because all or part of the applicant's income derives from any public assistance program, or because the applicant has in good faith exercised any right under the Consumer Credit Protection Act. The Federal agency that administers compliance with the law concerning this creditor is the Federal Trade Commission, Equal Credit Opportunity, Washington, D.C. 20580.


