

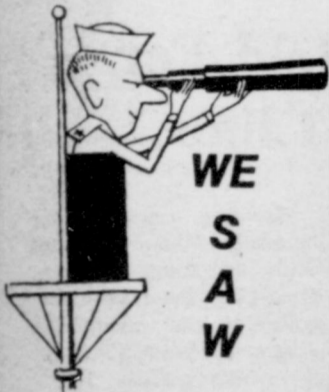

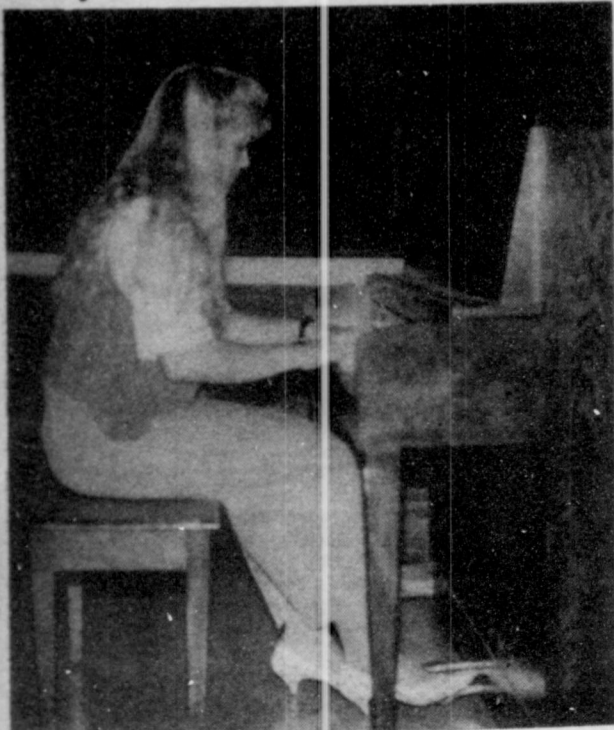

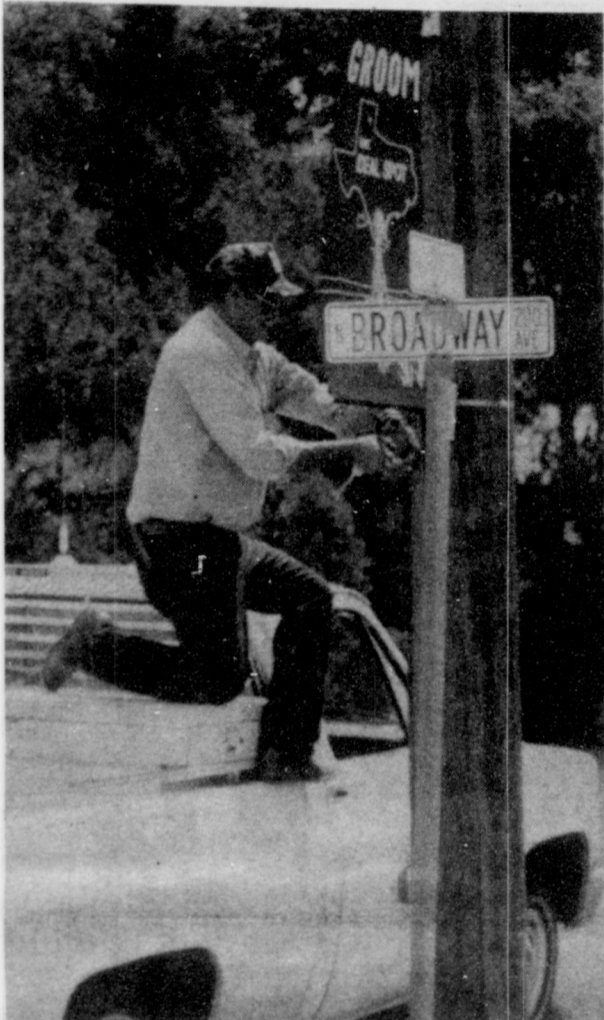

Hometown Hero's Do Their Part In "D" Day Battle At Normandy

Fifty years has not lessened the pain in America and the world paused Monday to remember "D" Day. Groom, Texas was no exception even though no formal services were held.

R.A. Snyder remembers his arrival at Normandy Beach well.

"I was driving a halftrack," he stated, "I remembered thinking that it would be a miracle if anyone was alive by the time we got across the beach. We had to take all the waterproofing off the engines before we could continue, we did that under fire. The beach was the worst. We were absolutely sitting ducks."

Snyder served on foreign soil for "three years, six months, sixteen days and four hours" to use his words. He was later wounded in Mintz, Germany and was awarded the Purple Heart, the USA's highest honor.

James Hoyt, deceased brother of Norris Hoyt, was also there. He was a glider pilot who would take in paratroopers and equipment pulled by the larger bombers. Also a Purple Heart recipient he was shot down over the Rhine.

There may have been others. Paul Townsend who's family is unknown to the writers of this article, died on Normandy Beach.

Although location and circumstances of many soldiers were not known back in the states for quite some time, the levity of their letters does not reflect the grim reality of the situation.

Crim Goodlett writing to J.B. Gibbons stated, ". . .

Most of the natives are either too old or too young for the average guy to flirt with. . . . I'm still counting on getting home before that old Chevrolet rusts away and before all the widows and old maid's get married."

Mike Homer (Bill Homer's uncle) wrote long descriptive letters about the people and their way of life to his sister, Loretta (Homer) Wicklemen. He also included what many young men thought was important at the time.

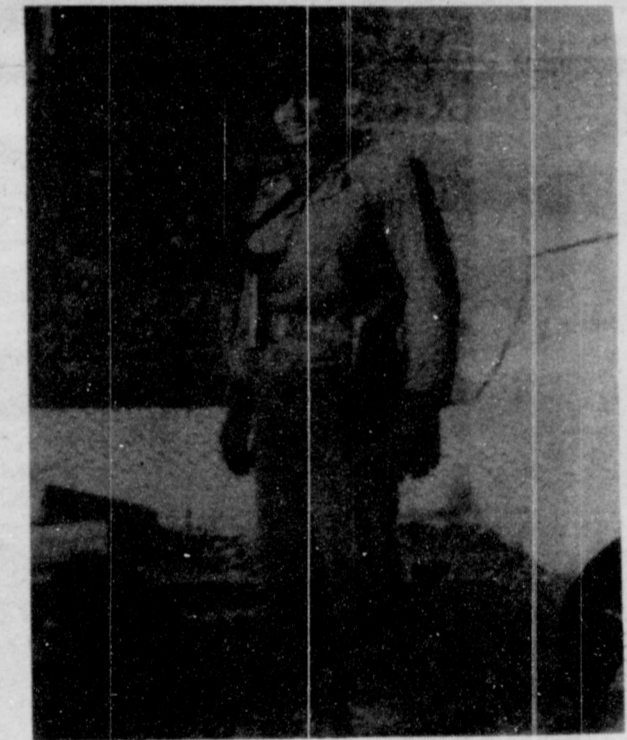

As The Interstate Turns

I apologize for not having an article for the last three weeks. We have been busy lately. To start off Troopers Roland McGill, Gary Davis and Chris Ray worked fatality accidents on I-40 for the month of May. Trooper Doug Hatch of Borger worked another on TX 207 south of Borger. Most of the accidents involved the driver either falling asleep or taking their eyes off the road for a split second. The fatality on 207 could have been avoided by wearing a seatbelt.

On Sunday, May 8th an Indiana was arrested for Possession of LSD on I-40 one mile west of Conway. The man was taken to Carson County Jail until he could post bond. The young man stated that this would be a nice experience. Apparently he hadn't tasted the food.

On Monday, May 9th Trooper Chris Ray arrested a man for theft of a car, DWI, evading arrest and reckless driving after being caught in a stolen car with stolen beer from the Groom Stop N Shop.

On Friday, May 13th, two New Mexico men were arrested for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia on I-40 one mile west of Groom.

Monday, May 16th, three Pampa residents were arrested for Public Intoxication at the J&N Fuel Stop parking lot and the driver, also from Pampa, was arrested for DWI and Driving While License Suspended. All four subjects were taken to the Carson County Country Club where they spent the night until they could post bond. Deputy Joe Leatherwood assisted with transporting the two women who didn't stop talking all the way to Panhandle.

On Wednesday, May 18th, a California youth was arrested for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia on I-40 five miles west of Groom. Later that evening two Oklahoma youth on their way to a funeral were cited for Minor In Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage three miles west of Groom.

On Friday, May 20th Trooper Gary Davis investigated a Hit and Run accident on US 60. After a complete investigation Trooper Davis was able to locate the vehicle and driver. The case is pending review by the Carson County Attorney's Office. We will keep you informed of the progress.

On Saturday, May 21st Trooper Don Johnson of Borger arrested a man for unpaid DPS tickets. The man was taken to the Carson County Sheriff's Office until he could pay the fines.

On Thursday, May 26th Trooper Gary Davis arrested a man for Driving while License Suspended on I-40 eight miles east of

Groom in Gray County.

On Friday, May 27th a Pampa youth was cited for Minor in Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage on TX 70 south of Pampa. Later that evening an Amarillo man was arrested for Failing to Identify to a police officer and Driving While License Suspended on TX 70 near Greenbelt lake. The man was taken to the Donley County Jail. Even later a Howardwick man was arrested for DWI-2nd Offense and taken to the Donley County Jail. While this man was being processed, Trooper Davis left the jail and came back 20 minutes later with another Howardwick man under arrest for DWI. To make matters worse the first man could tell the second man was drunk.

On Saturday, May 28th Trooper Chris Ray arrested a man wanted for Theft out of Florida. The man was taken to the Carson County Jail until someone could come and get him. Later that evening Trooper Davis welcomed people to Greenbelt lake for the Memorial Holiday. During that evening an Amarillo man was arrested for DWI, another Amarillo man was arrested for Public Intoxication and six others were cited for Minor In Possession, another was arrested for being in possession of a club similar to a Police baton with a special added attraction. And last but not least a Pampa man was arrested for DWI and a warrant out of Gray County for Criminal Trespassing.

On Sunday, two stolen vehicles were recovered near Groom. The first a 1984 Cadillac stolen from Amarillo. The second a 1983 Cadillac stolen from the Chris Britten Cattle Company. The one we missed was the one stolen from Pat Britten's house, a red and white pickup truck. The man would have been in town between 6 AM and 8:15 AM. Anyone seeing anything unusual during this time period should contact Sgt. Ray Davis immediately. The man is believed to be headed east. Later that day an Amarillo man was arrested on TX 207 just north of Panhandle for unpaid DPS tickets. The man was able to pay the fine and was released.

On Monday, May 30th, Trooper Don Johnson arrested a man for DWI and placed him in the Carson County Jail until he could post bond.

On Friday, June 3rd an Illinois man and a Pennsylvania man were arrested for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia on I-40 near Conway. Both men were taken to the Carson County Jail after pleading guilty before Justice of the Peace Phyllis Tyler of Panhandle. Later that afternoon a North Carolina man was taken into custody

on I-40 by the Dairy Queen in Groom for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. The man was taken to the Carson County Jail until he could post bond.

On Saturday, June 4th Trooper Chris Ray arrested

a man on US 60 outside of Panhandle wanted for Felony Theft and Kidnapping. The man was taken to Carson County Jail until the agency could come pick him up.

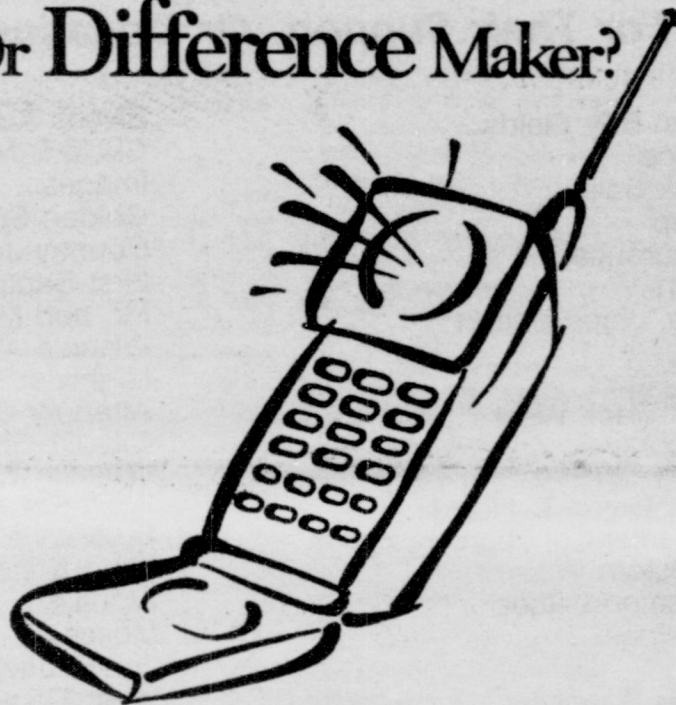

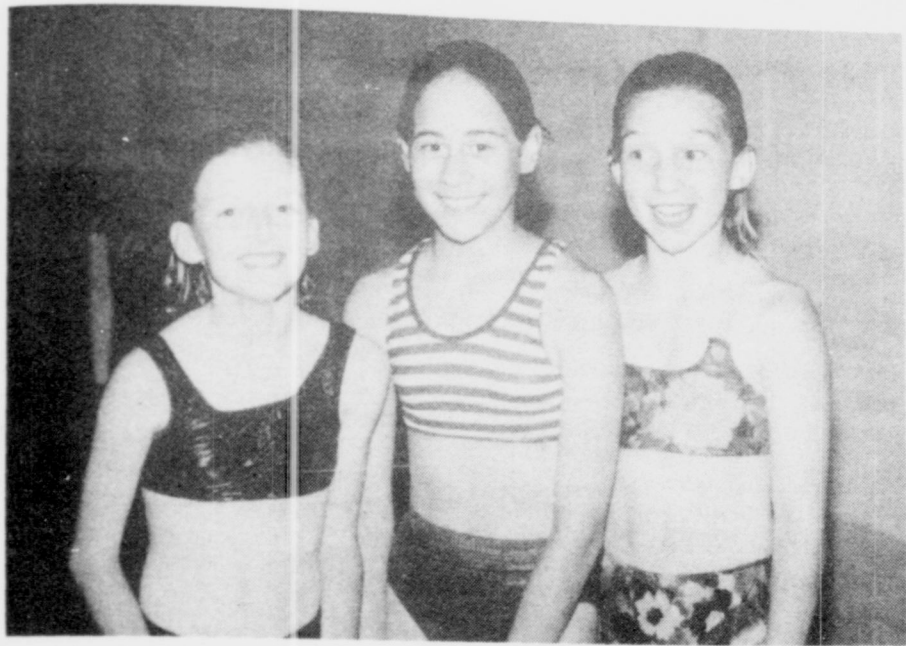

Pool Draws 40 People First Day

The Groom pool opened last week with about forty bathers in attendance. Pool manager, Melody Burton wishes to remind parents of the rules.

- 1) Children 9 and under must be accompanied by an adult.
- 2) Rafts and other pool toys must be approved by

the lifeguards.

- 3) No running on the deck or diving board.
- 4) No diving in the shallow end of the pool.
- 5) Children must be able to swim across the width of the pool before they can go to the deep end.
- 6) Only one bounce is allowed on the diving board.

- 7) No cut offs are allowed.
- 8) The lifeguards have final say in all matters pertaining to acceptable behavior at the pool. Failure to comply with disciplinary measures deemed necessary by the lifeguards could lead to being banned from the pool.

Carson County Sheriff's Report

We are currently holding fourteen prisoners in the Carson County Jail. Twelve are incarcerated for felony offenses and two for misdemeanors. Two suspects are being held on out-of-state warrants for stolen auto (North Carolina and Florida) and one for kidnapping (Kentucky). Two prisoners are being transported to the Texas Department of Corrections this week. One for Manslaughter and the other for Possession of Methamphetamine. We still have five persons awaiting transfer to TDCJ. An elderly man from the

Dallas area was found in Carson County. He had been driving for some time and was unsure of where he was or how he got here. Relatives were called to take him back home. Our department has been given two infant/child car seats by the Department of Human Services. These seats are available on a loan basis for persons not having approved car seats for their young children. There is no fee involved. We just ask that the seats be installed properly and used whenever the child is in the car. You may contact Lee Tice at the Sheriff's Office for further information.
