## Basketball Teams Lead District

Groom's High School basketball teams are leading the district with only one game left against McLean.

The girls have an impressive record of 9-0 for the district and 27-1 for the season.

The boys record is very good with a 6-2 in district, and 16-11 overall.

The Ettes walked away with a victory in Friday's game against Lefors. Melanie Friemel and Sandie Conrad each scored 12 points to lead the way. Kay Case added 11, Rebecca Conrad 4, and Jill Howard 4, to cinch the win with a final of 47-16.

The Tigers also had a walk away victory against the Pirates. Wes Hall led the point making with 18. Bo Burgin contributed 17 and Bryan Crowell had 15. Bart Britten put in 8, Seth Ritter 7, and Bronte Britten, Jeremy Chavedo and Nick Ashford each had 2. The final score was Groom 71 Lefors 45.

The final district game will be this Friday night at McLean beginning at 4:00 pm.

Groom Junior High finished their '94 season with two wins and two losses against Shamrock Monday night.

The 7th grade girls opened the games with a very close match, winning 19-17. Katrina Meeker led scoring for the Ettes with 5 points. Three girls from this evenly balanced team scored 4 points each, Tiarra O'Dell, Karen Conrad, and Jaycee Richardson. Heidie Smart also added 2 points for the win.

The Junior High boys "B" team had a disappointing loss to the Irish. Josh Evenson put up 13 points to lead the scoring. Chester Hutchison scored 8 and Dean Fields 2. The final score was Groom 23 - Shamrock 36.

The 8th grade girls played an equally difficult match. Shooters had an off night and Groom couldn't seem to buy a basket. Jessica Friemel and Melissa Anthony led the scoring with 8 points each. Angie

Conrad scored 7, while Mary Hutsell scored 4 and Marty Phillips 1. The final was Groom 28, Shamrock 34.

The "A" team boys thoroughly trounced Shamrock, whipping them with a final of 52-14.

Daniel Treadwell connected well, scoring a whooping 25 points. Jimmy Chavedo scored 8, Toby Burgin 6, Todd Gray 5, Tony Homer 4 and Marc Miller 4.

School Board members are guardians of public trust and through the policies they make, are ultimately responsible for the success or failure of local public education.

This responsibility often entails difficult choices, self sacrifice and exposure to public criticism. However it

also brings a great deal of personal satisfaction in sharing with parents, staff and students their academic successes. This closeness of trustees to the voters make the local school board the purest example of democracy our society presents.

Any person who is a registered voter in the school district and has been a resident of the state for 12 months and a resident of the district for 6 months before the filing deadline may run for office.

## Children's Home To Close

For forty years boys and girls have found refuge at the Catholic Children's Home under the direction of the school sisters of St. Francis. "After June 30," announced Bishop Leroy T. Mathiesen, "The Catholic Children's Home will close." Citing the expense of running the establishment (\$50,000 annually) and changing attitudes in child care as the reasons for the closure.

The School Sisters of St.

Francis came to Panhandle in 1954 from Trenton, New Jersey, but originated from Austria in the '20's.

One of the first arrivals was Sister Valentina Danzler in 1954.

The home will be donated to the order for their forty years of service. It has a value of \$836,000. The Sancta Maria Convent located next door is attracting a growing number of candidates and is hoping to utilize the facilities.

## DPS Report

On Sunday January 30th and Monday January 31st Troopers Gary Davis, Roland McGill and Chris Ray assisted numerous motorists on US 60 and IH-40 which had slid off the roadway. Remarkably less than a 1/2 dozen accidents were worked on these two days.

On Tuesday, February 1st, 1994 Trooper Gary Davis investigated three accidents due to icy road conditions. No serious injuries reported. However, the drivers were issued citations for unsafe speed. Later that evening another accident was investigated 1 mile east of Groom involving a jack-knifed 18 wheeler. The driver was issued citations for unsafe speed and having an alcoholic beverage in her sleeper. She was later transported to the Coronado Emergency room by the Groom ambulance.

On Wednesday, February 2nd some Groom residents got their first glimpse of the Carson County Sheriff as Trooper Davis assisted Sheriff Loren Brand with changing a flat tire in the Dairy Queen parking lot.

On Thursday, February 3rd Trooper Davis

investigated a one car roll over on TX 207 North of Panhandle. The driver fled the scene after damaging approximately 200 feet of 6666 fence line. The Panhandle man was tracked down later in the day and cited for Wrong Side Road - Not Passing, Failing To Report Accident At Once and Reckless Damage.

Later that afternoon Trooper Davis assisted Panhandle P.D. with a subject believed to be smuggling narcotics. Further investigation by Davis revealed the Borger man was wanted out of Hutchinson County for Forgery. The man was turned over to the Carson County Sheriff's Office until he could post bond.
