AN ORDINANCE
AMENDING AN
ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING, INVESTIGATION, FEES AND PERMITS OF PEDDLING

City Council of City of Groom amended Ordinance \#70, regarding to itinerant merchants (vendors) to include the following changes:
Before the City will issue a peddling license, the peddling individual or organization shall make application for investigation at the City Hall of the City of Groom. The cost for this is $\$ 50.00$ nonrefundable.

Upon completion of the investigation, a permit shall be issued upon payment of the following permit fees: $\$ 15.00$ per day; $\$ 75.00$ per month; $\$ 250.00$ per year.

Any person peddling within the limits of the City of Groom, Texas, without a valid license, shall be guilty valid license, shan a misdemeanor and upon of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than $\$ 10.00$ and not to exceed $\$ 1,000.00$.

Peddling - selling or offering for sale consumer goods, as hereinafter defined, directly to the consumer at a residence of place of business.
Consumer Goods - Food, produce and other perishables and consumables, manufactured or hand-crafted items, books, magazines and other publication, works of art, publication, works of art,
decorative items, perfume, jewelry, tree, shrubs and other vegetation and domestic or wild animals, but excluding a farmers own produce.
