Weather Causes Low Turnout

Primary Election Day was an unfavorable one as far as weather was concerned. The Panhandle area experienced its second snow storm of the winter or Tuesday, March 8, and that caused many voters to stay home and not cast votes at the polls. Voter turnout was not expected to be large and Carson County went right along with the prediction.

One-third of the 4,127 registered voters in Carson County exercised their voting privilege. Many of them took advantage of early voting and avoided the inconvenience caused by the

Election Day snow.

Now those voters are getting another chance to some of the races. A runoff election will be held on Tuesday, April 12. There will be only five days of early voting for that election - April 4th through April 8th.

One county race is of prime interest in the runoff. Jeannie Cunningham and Linda Orr will extend their campaign for another month after neither of them received a majority of the

Democratic Primary votes for County Treasurer.

Roslyn Watson, Carson County Voter Registrar, reminds everyone that any voice their opinions on registered voter who did not vote in the Republican Primary may vote in the Democratic run-off. "Some people are misinformed about that," she said. "We registered some new voters just last week. They weren't eligible to vote in the primaries, but are eligible to vote in the run-

> March 13th was the cutoff date for voter eligibility in the run-offs.

There are other races on the run-off ballot.



The Groom exchange has petitioned for Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling to the Pampa and Panhandle exchanges.

Within the next 15 days GTE will mail ballots to all customers in the Groom exchange. After marking the ballot, customers should sign their name and return the ballot to the Public Utility Commission of Texas. A stamped self addressed envelope will be provided with the ballot.

Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling will allow customers in the Groom exchange to call and be called by customers in the Pampa and Panhandle exchanges. If approved, all subscribers in the Groom exchange will be charged an additional monthly per line charge up to \$3.50 for residence and \$7.00 for business. This charge is in addition to your local exchange service rates, and will apply until GTE's next general rate case, at which time all service rates are subject to change. These charges are the maximum that can be charged regardless of the number of exchanges that are approved by the voters in the Groom exchange.

Expar ded Toll-Free Local Calling will be granted to each exchange with a "Yes" vote from 70% of the people who actually return their ballots. Exchanges that fail to receive a 70% "Yes" vote will not be added to the local calling scope. If all exchanges fail to meet the requirements of the ballot, service will not change and customers will not be billed an additional monthly fee.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING, INVESTIGATION, FEES AND PERMITS OF PEDDLING

City Council of City of Groom amended Ordinance #70, regarding to itinerant merchants (vendors) to include the following

Before the City will issue peddling license, the peddling individual organization shall make application for investigation at the City Hall of the City of Groom. The cost for this is \$50.00 non-

Upon completion of the investigation, a permit shall be issued upon payment of the following permit fees: \$15.00 per day; \$75.00 per month; \$250.00 per year.

Any person peddling within the limits of the City of Groom, Texas, without a valid license, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than \$10.00 and not to exceed \$1,000.00.

Peddling - selling or offering for sale consumer goods, as hereinafter defined, directly to the consumer at a residence of place of business.

Consumer Goods - Food, produce and other perishables and consumables, manufactured or hand-crafted items, books, magazines and other publication, works of art, decorative items, perfume, jewelry, tree, shrubs and other vegetation and domestic or wild animals, but excluding a farmers own produce.

We ask all citizens to be aware of peddlers or vendors in town. If they come to your house, ask to see their license from the City of Groom. 
