#### Shelton To Seek D. A. Seat


James T. Shelton formally announces his filing as a Democratic candidate for the 100th Judicial District Attorney. Shelton has served as the 100th Judicial District Attorney since September 27, 1993, after being appointed by Governor Ann Richards to replace David McCoy. McCoy was appointed 100th District Judge to fill the unexpired term of retiring Judge John T. Forbis. Prior to becoming District Attorney, Shelton was Assistant District Attorney under Daivd McCoy, as well as Donley County Attorney Pro Tem.

Shelton and his family have lived in Clarendon since 1984, when he first returned to the area to practice law. Shelton was

Seventy-one DWI arrests were made, twentyeight of which were conducted by Trooper Ray. One hundred eighty-two motorists were assisted on the highways within Carson County for reasons ranging from out of gas to fixing a Four thousand six hundred seventy tickets were issued in Carson County resulting in Judge Phyllis Tyler of Panhandle collecting \$192,515, Judge Bill Hinson of Groom collecting \$128,429.32 and Judge Sharion Harper of Skellytown collecting \$46,634.91 for the year. As a reminder a portion of all fine money collected stays within the county for the road and bridge fund. Troopers also is ued six

Troopers of Carson County will strive to keep accidents to a minimum for 1994 by issuing citations for Speeding, No Seatbelt and other hazardous violations which cause accidents. Also the troopers will be vigilant for DWI's and any other criminal activity within the


