Groom City Council Approves Ambulance Budget, Pay Increases For Employees

The Groom City Council met in regular session last week. Alderman Jerry Thornton was absent. Guests included Jay Lamb, Charlotte Whatley and David Britten.

Jay Lamb, representing the Groom Ambulance Department, presented their annual budget. The Council approved \$3,000 of the city's annual budget to be given to the Ambulance Department for education, insurance, and supplies. The vote was unanimous.

The Council reviewed the 1994-95 Annual City Budget. It will be adopted in August.

No action was taken after the aldermen reviewed the City Ordinance on unlicensed and inoperable vehicles parked on city streets.

The Council instructed city secretary, Debbie

Anthony, to purchase a new C. B and antenna for the city office.

The board went into executive session at 10:05 pm for personnel evaluating on employees Debbie Anthony, Donnie Evans and Jack Barnett.

The Council resumed open session at 10:45 pm.

Ronny Fields moved to give the following raises in salary: Debbie Anthony \$1,500.00 per year; Donnie Evans \$750.00 now and \$750.00 when he passes his water test, per year; Jack Barnett \$1,200.00 per year; Martin Hermesmyer seconded the motion and all members voted ayes.

In the area of finance the Council voted to amend the general fund for election to \$310.00 and the water works school fund to \$450.00.

McLean, Shamrock Teens Injured In Car Accident

Two McLean youths and a Muleshoe youth were injured in a one car accident just east of Groom Saturday morning.

Brandon Gage Angeley, of Muleshoe but temporarily residing in Shamrock, was driving east on Interstate 40 when he fell asleep at the wheel. The vehicle, a late model Chevrolet pickup, veered onto the median. The pickup then went over

the edge of the overpass between the east-west lanes of I-40 landing on the service road below.

The two passengers in the vehicle, Casey Wayne Carter, 16, and John Thomas Pennington, 18, both of McLean were rushed to Northwest-Texas Hospital and St. Anthony's Hospital respectively. Their injuries are still listed as critical at presstime.

Angeley, the driver, was treated at Northwest Texas Hospital as well. His condition is unknown.

The accident occurred at 7:00 am just inside the Gray County line. Corporal Roland McGill of Panhandle led the D.P.S. investigation. No mention of alcohol was made in his report according to Sergeant Bill Snyder.

Rain Ends Heat Wave

Rain brought some welcome relief to the blistered prairies this weekend. Saturday morning around 5:00 am a thunderstorm blew in between 1 inch to 1.75 inches of rain.

The same storm brought Amarillo as much as 3 inches in places that led to the closing of I-40 and I-27 due to flooding. Some underpasses had three to six feet of water for a while.

Groom enjoyed the moisture as well as the lower temperatures throughout the weekend.

The forecast is calling for more hot temperatures by Friday with possible evening showers.

Payton Receives Scholarship

The 5th annual Carson County International Quilt Show will be held September 3-5 at the County Ag Building in Panhandle.

The objective of the show is to share the work of quilters, raise scholarship funds, and pass the art of quilting on to the next generation.

Andrea Denyse Payton of Groom received the latest scholarship from the Quilt Show.

The Midwestern International Quilt and Textile Museum, Inc. awarded its first scholarship to Robert Wilcox of White Deer.

These winners were selected from applications that are available to each graduating senior from a Carson County public school who is a member of the FHA, FFA or 4-H and will attend a college or university the year after his/her high school graduation.

Funds for the scholarship come from entry fees and admission to the annual Quilt Show held in Panhandle each year. As a juror show, pictures and entry forms for this year's show are available at the show. Pictures can not be returned. The \$5 entry fee per piece is for display and critique of the judges.

Deadline for show arrivals



is August 20 and must include directions of return and shipping for the entry to be returned after the show. Quilters entering two categories (youth to 18 and seniors age 62 and older) may enter free of charge.

The show is open to any geographic area. Last year there were over 450 entries, including quilts, quilt tops and quilt blocks, from 50 states, the District of Columbia and more than 30 countries. 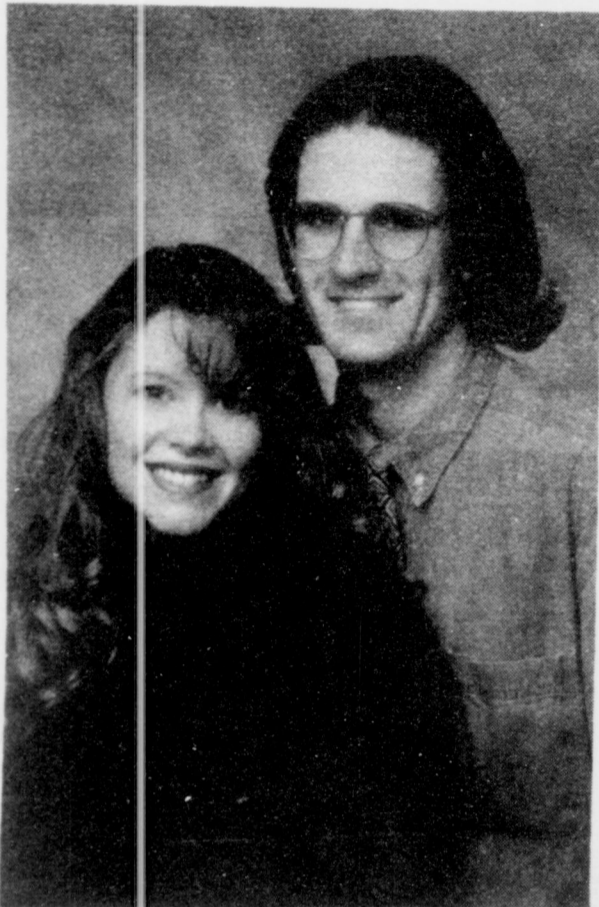

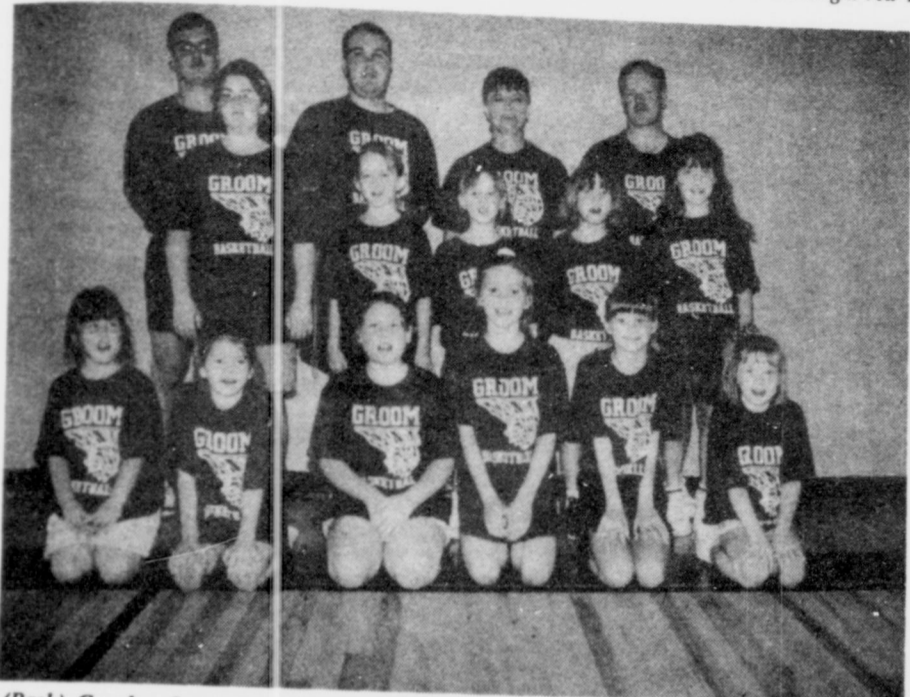

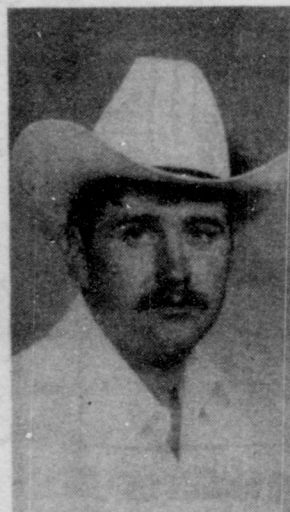
HAYNES APPOINTED FOR COMING YEAR

Hire Windmill Help!

Historians tell us that it wasn't the Cavalry, sheriffs, and six-guns that won the west, it was windmills and barbed wire. The barbed wire gave us control of the land, and windmills made it habitable. I agree with this philosophy totally, but I have sometimes wondered whether the windmill is a blessing or a curse. Guess it depends on whether it's pumping water, or if you are working on it.

Up until two years ago, Ruth, my assistant, and I did all our windmill work ourselves. We were so coordinated, so efficient as a team, and so experienced, that we could pull sucker rod, replace leathers, pull pipe, change a cylinder, all these things and never say a word. In fact it was a day or two later before we would even speak to each other at all!!!

"Whoa! Up! Down a little! Whoa! Too fast! Too slow! You gonna wait all day? Slow down or you will mash my finger!" This was the average conversation. An hour or two of this has been know to strain marriages, to cripple the clutch leg, to evoke profanity, and worst of all, to ruin a hairdo.

My experience and my advice is to just go hire someone to help you windmill. I base this on one experience where repair costs to the windmill was \$19.85. The cost to repair Ruth's disposition was \$129.85 at Boxes and Jeans.

A cousin of mine at Clayton, New Mexico was left at a windmill three miles from home, holding a string of sucker rods with his bare hands, while his wife drove off in a huff. A

neighboring rancher in New Mexico had to do his own cooking, wash his own clothes, sleep in the bunk house, and beg forgiveness, just because he said, "Turn the pipe wrench around, dummy!"

Since retirement, we now let Dwayne Myers do the windmilling. Our marital well being has been static, our respect and love is on an even keel. It costs me more than it used to, to keep our windmills pumping, but the increased cost is well worth the savings in mental strain. We even brag to the grandkids about how tough it was in the old days, when we did it ourselves. But believe me, take my advice, GO HIRE SOME HELP, when you windmill.

Jay Lamb, representing the Groom Ambulance Department, presented their annual budget. The Council approved \$3,000 of the city's annual budget to be given to the Ambulance Department for education, insurance, and supplies. The vote was unanimous.

The Council reviewed the 1994-95 Annual City Budget. It will be adopted in August.

No action was taken after the aldermen reviewed the City Ordinance on unlicensed and inoperable vehicles parked on city streets.

The Council instructed city secretary, Debbie

Anthony, to purchase a new C. B and antenna for the city office.

The board went into executive session at 10:05 pm for personnel evaluating on employees Debbie Anthony, Donnie Evans and Jack Barnett.

The Council resumed open session at 10:45 pm.

Ronny Fields moved to give the following raises in salary: Debbie Anthony \$1,500.00 per year; Donnie Evans \$750.00 now and \$750.00 when he passes his water test, per year; Jack Barnett \$1,200.00 per year; Martin Hermesmeyer seconded the motion and all members voted ayes.

In the area of finance, the Council voted to amend the general fund for election to \$310.00 and the water works school fund to \$450.00.
