Ambulance Dept. Woes May Be Solved "Mutual Aid Agreement"

Groom Ambulance Service has been between a rock and a hard place lately concerning repairs and problems with an aging ambulance.

The 1985 model Ford ambulance has been out of commission almost as often as it has been in use, lately. The engine was replaced in the fall at considerable cost to tax payers.

The ambulance is now back in the shop for the fourth time this year. While the work being done is under warranty, Groom is still without an ambulance while repairs are made.

Groom's old ambulance,

while not any longer legal to transport patients, is used by the fire department as a rescue vehicle carrying the "Jaws of Life" and basic first aid equipment. Groom's ambulance team responds to calls even though they must wait for transport to come from White Deer, McLean or Panhandle.

Ambulance department president, Jay Lamb and County Judge Jay Roselius are working together to see if Groom might get an ambulance on loan from Pantex.

"Carson County and Pantex have a mutual aid agreement," said Judge

Roselius, "That states that we can assist each other in times of emergency, through needs or resources."

"What happens is that they can loan us surplus equipment," he went on to say, "That we can use as long as necessary."

Pantex has an ambulance that they are replacing. The governmental agencies have requirements as to how long their ambulances can be used. This particular vehicle has about 40,000 miles on it and is a 1989 model.

Carson County officials have petitioned Pantex for the use of this ambulance. Roselius stated that Pantex must determine if any other DOE site needed the vehicle before any decision would be reached. He was expecting to hear from them in about two weeks.

"We are lucky in the sense that the timing . . . their having a surplus ambulance . . . and our needing one in Groom, came at the same time," said Roselius.

Sales Tax Proposal Slated For May Vote

In about a month, citizens of the City of Groom will have the opportunity to vote on two 1/2 cent sales tax proposals.

The first proposal is a 1/2 cent sales tax increase to reduce property tax.

Mayor Greg Lamb told The Groom News that the increase in sales tax would lower property tax by 10¢ - 12¢ per hundred dollar

valuation.

Sales tax is paid on all taxable items and services in Groom. City officials expect to raise around \$10,000 to \$12,000 per year with the measure.

The second part of the measure is a 1/2 cent sales tax increase for economic development. The city would keep the funds until



CPR Class To Be Sponsored By Beta Sigma Phi Sorority

A Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and First Aide for Choking class will be sponsored by Beta Sigma Phi. The class will begin at 9:30 am on Saturday, April 22, at the Groom Community Center, instructed by Charlotte Whatley.



There are currently eight persons incarcerated in the Carson County Jail. Two of the eight are awaiting transport to the Texas Department of Criminal

Justice in Huntsville when space is available.

Chief Deputy Lovell Kennard was called to a convenience store on Interstate 40 to investigate an assault complaint which

involved the assault of a store clerk by a large female subject. After contact with the suspect, it was determined that she may have been suffering from mental health problems. The subject was transported

to Amarillo in an attempt to provide her with a place to stay and access to psychiatric care.

The Carson County Sheriff's Department is working with the Texas Southwestern Cattle Raisers' Association to locate a suspected trailer thief in our area. Please notify our office if you observe any suspicious vehicles on your property or your neighbor's property. The suspect in this matter is known to be quite bold about stealing trailers and is a suspect in several Texas counties as well as in the states of Oklahoma, Kansas and Colorado.

Our department was called to Skellytown Friday evening to investigate the discovery of a bomb at a Skellytown residence. The initial investigation confirmed that we were dealing with a homemade explosive device. The Skellytown Fire and Ambulance services helped to block the streets near the residence and to evacuate persons from surrounding homes. The Amarillo Police Department assisted us by providing two members of their bomb disposal unit to secure and disable the device. After the device was disabled we were advised by the bomb technicians that the device had the potential of causing serious injury or damage to property. Deputy Jeff Oldham is the lead investigator on this case and will be assisted by the Texas

Rangers and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.





Everyone had a real good time although the weather was terrible.




