Dr. John L Witt John L. Witt was born in 1909 in a dugout near the town of Wheeler, Texas. Times were hard, and John missed a lot of school helping on the family farm. His dream of becoming a doctor seemed impossible, but with the help of a sister he finally realized his dream, Renting his first office in the Route 66 Hotel in

Groom, Texas, he began his medical practice. From these humble beginnings, Dr. Witt built his practice to a new, 32 bed community hospital.
Dr. Witt spent his entire carcer on Route 66. After buying and renovating the 66 Hotel, he became the areas most prominent physician. From the mud of physician. From the mud of
Jericho Gap, through the Jericho Gap, lhrougn the carnage of Death Alley, and through the boom and demise of The Mother Road, Dr. Witt served all who came. Emergency

Harris A. D'Spain
Harris A. D'Spain was born in 1900, in Howe, Texas. He and his family moved to the McLean area 1905, and on to Kellerville where they Karmed for a living
arnsed for a living.
Flarris left the farm in 1926, and began working as a mechanic in a garage on Oid Route 66, in McLean. He rooved to Shamrock and worked in a Buick agency there, until 1930.
He married Mary Akers early in 1930 and the couple moved back to McLean where Harris established his own garage in partnership with his brother Ancil. Hanis was the mechanic, Ancil was the welder, and another brother pumped gas and fixed flats. The shop was located $1 / 2$ block east of main street, on Old Route 66.
The shop operated until 1935, then sold out with Hanis moving to New Mexico. For several years, he worked as a parts man and mechanic in Santa Fe , Taos, and finally at Tucumcari. The couple returned to McLean in 1942.

They were active in the community and church. Both Harris and Mary died in 1994, and are buried at See Rt. 66, pg. 9
