Dr. John L. Witt

John L. Witt was born in 1909 in a dugout near the town of Wheeler, Texas. Times were hard, and John missed a lot of school helping on the family farm. His dream of becoming a doctor seemed impossible, but with the help of a sister he finally realized his dream.

Renting his first office in the Route 66 Hotel in

medical practice. From these humble beginnings, Dr. Witt built his practice to a new, 32 bed community hospital.

Dr. Witt spent his entire career on Route 66. After buying and renovating the 66 Hotel, he became the areas most prominent physician. From the mud of Jericho Gap, through the carnage of Death Alley, and through the boom and demise of The Mother Road, Dr. Witt served all who came. Emergency


1996 Farm Bill Reviewed

The City of Groom had a special called meeting on May 9th. Those attending were Mayor Greg Lamb, Aldermen Danny Ashford, Jr., Martin Hermesmeyer, R.E. Cornett, Ronny Fields and Howard Britten.

Election returns were canvassed with the following candidates being elected for

> The results of the election were unanimously approved and the meeting was adjourned.

> On May 10, 1996 the newly elected City Council

held their first regular Attending were meeting. Mayor Greg Lamb, Aldermen Ronny Fields, Jay Lamb, Don Case and Mary Alderman Sue Lyles. Danny Ashford was not present.

Bill Hinson, Justice of the

Peace, administered the official oath of office to the newly elected members.

Minutes of the previous called meeting were read and approved.

Terry Barnabe of Clarendon met with the council to discuss possibility of promoting tourism in Groom by means of the Internet. He stated that he is already providing information concerning the "Cross of the Plains" and would be happy to include other information about Groom at no cost to the Council The unanimously agreed.

Danny Ashford, Jr. was elected Mayor Pro-Tem to serve in the absence of Greg Lamb. The vote was unanimous.

The Council unanimously approved the ACH orginination agreement with State National Bank which concerns residents who choose to pay water bills by draft.

Council also The approved the release of funds for the budgeted Summer Youth Program Groom ISD (\$1,000.00). and the Lion's Club pay the other two-thirds of the

program.

Alderman Lamb led a discussion concerning closing off 3rd Street from Texas to Bosen on July 20, when the Panhandle Emergency Services Systems will hold their annual picnic. The school and park will serve about 200 people on that day. Reason given for the closure were given as parking and safety. Debbie Anthony, City Secretary, had already contacted families that this will affect and the Carson County Sheriff's Department for their approval.

The motion to close the designated area was approved.

A discussion was held concerning a City Emergency Plan. Jay Lamb reported that Ambulance Service was working to create such a plan. Carson County has a plan in place. No action was taken.

Sealed bids were opened for BLK 34, Lots 3, 4, and the south 30 feet of lot 2. R.B. Thornton was unanimously awarded the property with the highest bid of \$1007.50

Bids were opened for BLK 52, Lot 4. All Bids were unanimously rejected.


Max & Helen Wade

Max Wade became copublisher of the Groom News in 1927, when his father bought the paper. Max married Helen Vassey in 1932, and the couple copublished the paper until 1978. While Max was in Europe in WWH, Helen published the paper.

During their publishing career, the Wades saw Route 66 emerge from the mud of Jericho Gap, to a busy, well traveled highway traffic zooming 24 with hours a day.

Early memories include watching the weary runners of the Bunion Derby travel through Groom. laugh as they recall the young folks in Groom sweeping off the Mother Road so they could roller skate on the road.

The Wades were generous with hospitality, as they helped weary travelers with food and a days work at the newspaper. The Route 66 heyday was both prosperous and fun as friends gathered at the 66 Cafe, or tried out one of Nellie Ford's famous "Nellie Burgers" at Wall's Cafe. Like many other Hall of Famers, the Wades spent most of their lives on Old Route 66, and still live at Groom, their home for over 70 years.

New Members Installed Into Rt. 66 Hall of Fame

Nine new honorees were installed into the Old Route 66 Hall of Fame in ceremonies over the weekend held at the National Guard Armory in Shamrock.

Delbert Trew, master of ceremonies, explained that the members who are chosen for the Hall of Fame have a long time connection to Route 66, in some way, either by working at a business along the highway or other types of connections.

Harris A. D'Spain; Z.T. and Flora Jones; and Raymond Guyton were all nominated to the Hall of Fame.

The following is a brief summary of the nominees contributions to Route 66 that appears in the Hall of Farne.

Harris A. D'Spain

Harris A. D'Spain was born in 1900, in Howe, Texas. He and his family moved to the McLean area in 1905, and on to Kellerville where they farmed for a living.

Elarris left the farm in 1926, and began working as a mechanic in a garage on Old Route 66, in McLean. He moved to Shamrock and worked in a Buick agency there, until 1930.

He married Mary Akers early in 1930 and the couple moved back to McLean where Harris established his own garage in partnership with his brother Ancil. Harris was the mechanic, Ancil was the welder, and another brother pumped gas and fixed flats. The shop was located 1/2 block east of main street, on Old Route 66.

The shop operated until 1935, then sold out with Harris moving to New Mexico. For several years, he worked as a parts man and mechanic in Santa Fe, Taos, and finally at Tucumcari. The couple returned to McLean in 1942.

They were active in the community and church. Both Harris and Mary died in 1994, and are buried at See Rt. 66, pg. 9
