Applications to Be Taken for Peace Corps Placement

McLean area residents interested in putting their skills to use in developing nations around the world are invited to take the Peace Corps Placement test at 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 21, at Room 322, Post Office Building, Amarillo.

Volunteers need not have a college degree, as a broad range of skills are needed to fill the overseas programs in agriculture, public health, community development, education and cooperative development.
The placement test, which takes about an hour and a half, determines how an applicant

can best be utilized overseas. It measures general aptitude and ability to learn a language, not education or present knowledge of a foreign language. The test requires no preparation and is non-competitive—an applicant can neither pass nor fail.
Persons interested in serving in the Peace Corps must fill out an application, if they have not already done so, and present it to the tester before taking the test. Applications may be obtained from local post offices or from the Peace Corps, Washington, D. C. 20525.
