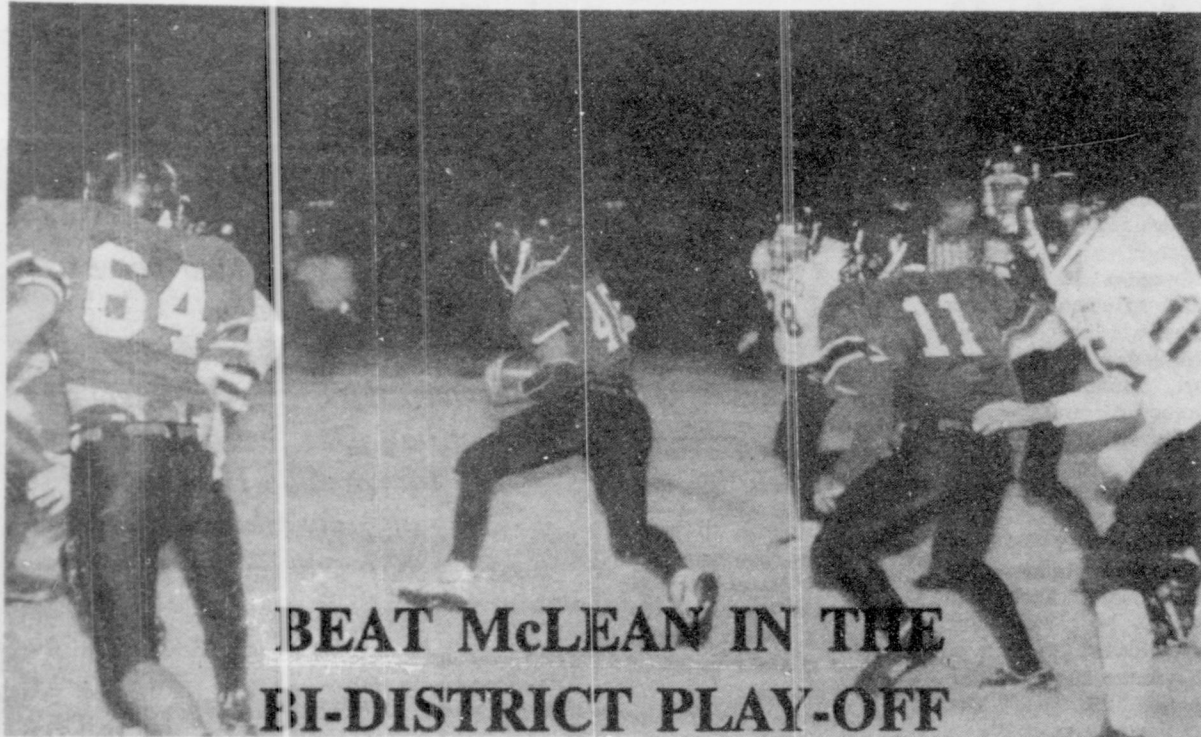

Tigers Named District Champions



BEAT McLEAN IN THE BI-DISTRICT PLAY-OFF

The Groom Tigers handily won the District Championship from the Follett Panthers last week, 61-32.

From the opening kick off to the final buzzer, the Tigers gave the fans a game to remember.

Justin Ritter ran back the opening kick off 75 yards for a touchdown. Groom's extra point failed. Follett caught the kick after the points and ran within 10 yards of the goal posts. In the next play Follett scored and also made their extra points giving them their only lead of the game, 6-8.

Groom had an exceptional night carrying the ball 53 times for 401 yards compared to Follett's 23 carries for 229 yards. Groom's passing game was a little on the thin side with two connections on three passes for 21 yards.

Justin Ritter had a very good night with 29 carries for 235 yards and 5 touchdowns. He also connected with Brad Sustaire on a 20 yard pass for another touchdown. Ritter added a fumble recovery and 8 unassisted tackles to his tally.

Toby Burgin also had a very good night, rushing for 115 yards on 15 carries and two touchdowns. He carried three kick off returns for 21, 2 and 5 yards, respectively. He had 9 unassisted tackles and a 29 yard interception.

Daniel Treadwell added another 46 yards rushing on 8 carries and kicked 3 extra points. He had a 21 yard kick off return.

Jamie Shuck rushed for 5 yards on one carry and a 7 yard kick off return. He also added 3 unassisted tackles.

Quarterback Brad Sustaire did a great job of getting the ball down field. He threw three passes for 21 yards. He gained 25 yards on a punt and had 7 unassisted tackles and one fumble recovery.

Trae Kepley received one pass for 1 yard and had 1 unassisted tackle.

Sean Crowell earned a whipping 10 unassisted tackles and one quarterback sack.

Josh Evenson returned a kick off for 19 yards.

67% Of Carson County Goes To The Polls

Five hundred and eighteen Carson County voters chose to vote early in the November 7th General Election. When all the ballots had been cast, figures showed that 67% of the registered voters in the county had used that privilege.

In the presidential race, 310 early votes were cast for the Dole/Kemp duo, 183 for Clinton/Gore, 20 for Perot/Campbell and none

for the other two parties on the ballot. Total figures for the county found the Republican twosome leading with 1742 to 742 for the Democratic candidates and 225 for Perot. In that order (Dole/Kemp, Clinton/Gore, Perot) a precinct-by-precinct breakdown shows 170-119-23 in Precinct 101 (Groom); 116-51-18 in 102 (White Deer); 44-20-13 in 103 (West Panhandle); 343-112-

42 in 201 (South Panhandle); 44-17-12 in 202 (East Panhandle); 252-72-24 in 301 (North Panhandle); 68-24-12 in 302 (Fritch); 220-82-37 in 401 (White Deer); and 175-62-26 in 402 (Skellytown).

Incumbent Phil Gramm got Carson County approval for re-election to his U.S. Senate seat with 1936 votes to Victor Morales' 750. Mac Thornberry also won

Carson County with 2092 votes for his re-election bid to the U.S. State Representative, District 13 seat. His challenger, Sam Silverman received 599 votes in the county.

Unofficial totals for candidates in uncontested races of local interest show 1953 votes for District 33 State Representative Warren Chisum, 1814 for

New York Man Dies In One Car Accident



Philip A. Reed, age 24, of Shortsville, New York, died when his car, a 1991 Chevrolet crashed head-on into an overpass pillar on I-40, 3 miles west of Groom. Reed was eastbound on the access road when he attempted to cross the grassy median to the main road. He struck the pillar and was pronounced dead by Justice of the Peace Bill Hinson at 9:45 p.m. He was not wearing a seatbelt.



The Groom City Council met in regular session on November 5th. Present were Mayor Greg Lamb, Aldermen Don Case, Jay Lamb and Mary Sue Lyles. Absent was Ronny Fields and Danny Ashford. Also attending was Rodney Bohr for CellularOne.

Rodney Bohr discusses the feasibility of City employees making use of mobil phones in the city vehicles. After a discussion concerning cost and other items of concern Mary Sue Lyles moved to reject the proposal. All members voted in agreement.

Bohr was asked to check on the cost of beepers for city employees.

A bank depository agreement was unanimously approved with State National Bank of Groom.

The Council approved the Annual Christmas Contest. Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be given.

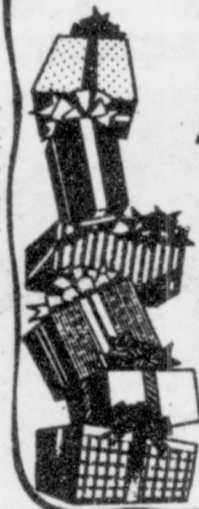

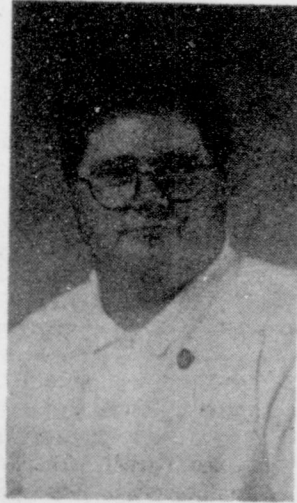
James Miller Hired By Columbia Home Care

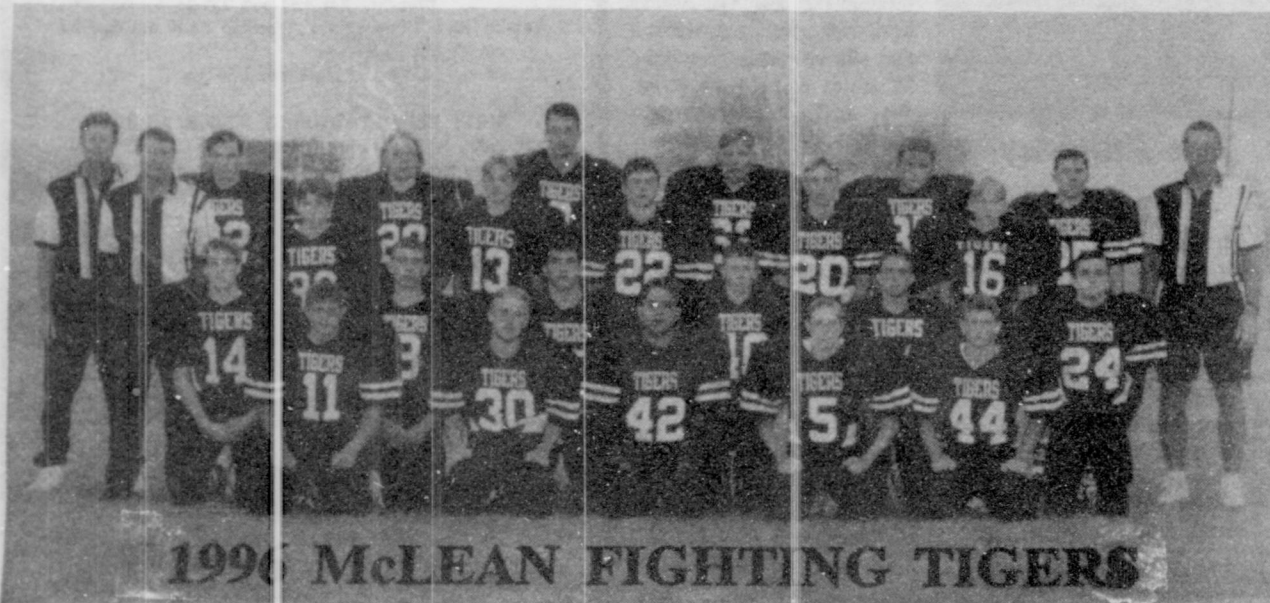

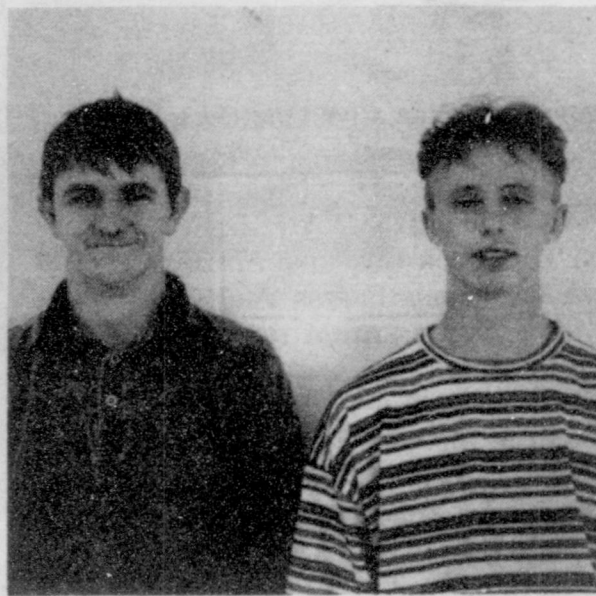

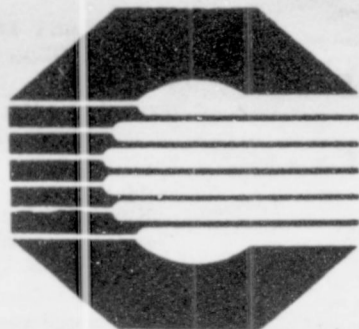
