Columbia To Open New Health Clinic In Groom

Columbia Family Health Care is pleased to announce that it will be opening its doors on the new Groom facility on Monday, July 14. Office hours will be Monday and Wednesday, 8:00 am to 12 noon; and Tuesday and Thursday, 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The Clinic will accept most of the major medical co-payments such as FirstCare and MD Physicians; as well as Medicare, Medicaid, and Title 5. Dennis Kunkel will head up the staff at the Clinic. He is a certified physicians assistant and a registered

nurse. He will be working under the direct supervision of Dr. Craig Schaffer.

Wheat Harvest Better Than Originally Expected Earlier

Tony Treadwell of Attebury Grain, Inc. reports that the 1997 wheat crop is much better than expected.

"A couple of months ago, I didn't expect to see hardly any wheat harvested," stated Treadwell. "Between the late freeze, rust and mosaic, I expected very little yield."

This is one time that Treadwell is glad he was wrong!

"We actually are seeing

good yields and test weights. Even somewhat better than the last few years. It has been so long since we had a 'normal' year that no one really knows what that is anymore," he added.

Dry land wheat is harvesting 20-30 bushels per acre, while irrigation has a wider range of 20-50 bushels per acre. Areas south of Interstate 40 seem to be the hardest hit by

weather and disease. Treadwell reported test weights of 40-60 pounds.

Breeze Kuehler brought in the first load of wheat. Treadwell estimates that harvest is 2/3 of the way done. The weekend rain has slowed down progress with the harvest, but has greatly benefited the other crops that will be harvested in the fall.

Allsup's Breaks Ground For Improvements

Allsup's is getting a whole new look! For several years the parking lot has been in need of repairs. Several hard winters had left the parking lot littered with pot holes. Crews broke ground Monday for a new parking surface, new gasoline tanks, new gasoline pumps and other in store remodeling and repairs.

Store manager, Bonnie Terbush stated that repairs would take at least a couple of weeks and could continue as long as a month. She also asked that every one use caution when pulling into the store while the repairs were ongoing.

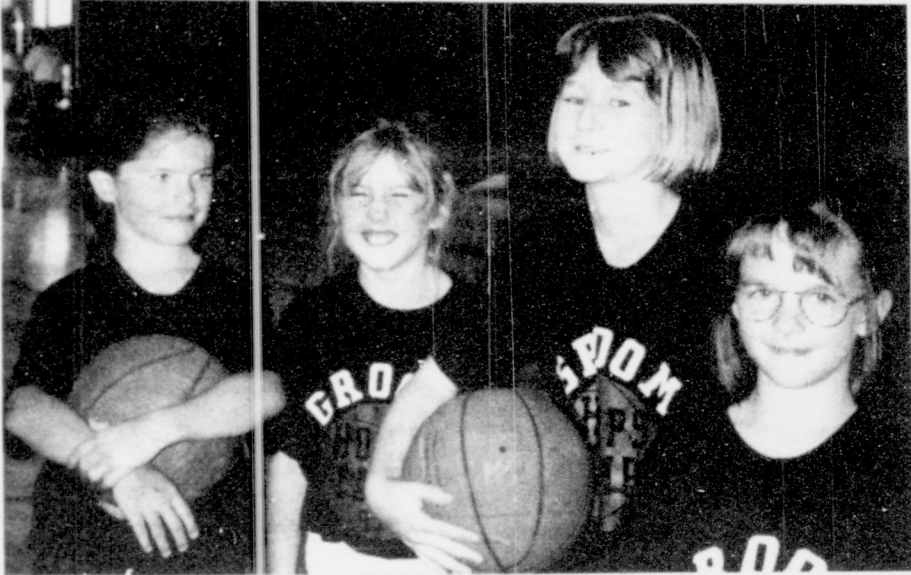

Caleb Pool Attends Farm Bureau's Seminar

Attending the Texas Farm Bureau's 34th annual Citizenship Seminar in San Angelo June 16-20 were Shannan Goss from Panhandle; Kimberly Warminski, White Deer; and Caleb Pool from Groom.

Sponsored by the Carson County Farm Bureau, they were among approximately 400 high school junior and senior students from over 150 counties across the state.

The purpose of the seminar is to provide the students with a better

understanding of their American heritage and the capitalistic free enterprise system, according to Dan Looten Carson County Farm Bureau president.

The students were welcomed to the seminar by Dr. James Hindman, president of Angelo State University. "Farm Bureau - Your Host" was presented by Bob Stallman, president of Texas Farm Bureau.

Dale Bullock (TFB Field Representative), Cara Chrimes (1996 Miss TFB), and Michael Santos, the 1996 TFB Speech contest

winner, presented a program on "Farm Bureau Youth Activities".

Speakers at this year's seminar and their subjects were as follows: David Vernon and Jerad Boyd, Lubbock Christian University, "Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE)", Earl Taylor of the National Center for Constitutional Studies, "The Making of America", and Kurt Swanda, Fort Worth, "American".

The video tape "A More Perfect Union" was shown to the students

illegal drugs.

This is how the pedal pull works. The miniature pedal maneuvering tractors are "beefed up" with special chains to withstand the added weights as competition progresses.

Children may register starting at 9:30 am August 2nd. Contestants will pull in order of registration and according to age group. 4 year olds will pull against 4 year olds, 5 year olds against 5 year olds and so on. Every child in each category rides the exact same tractor to make sure everyone gets a fair shot. The contestant who pulled the longest distance in each age category wins. In case

of a "full pull", which is a pull the entire length of the course, those contestants will then re-pull to determine a class winner.

The first and second place winners in each class will advance to state competition to be held in Lockney, Texas. The first and second place winners at state advance to National competition held each year in Omaha, Nebraska. Local competition awards the winners with ribbons or medals. State or National, awards trophies and savings bonds up to \$3,000 in worth.

The entry fee for all children has been provided by the Groom Day Committee. Out of town

children are welcome as well.

The Groom Day Committee is very excited about this addition of fun scheduled for August 2nd. A registration booth will be set up the day of the pull at 9:30 am and competition is scheduled to start at 1:30 pm.

No special training is required, just need to be able to pedal the equivalent of a tricycle.

Other exciting additions for Groom Day are the Bouncing Tiger, Giant

Caterpillar and a table for the kids to make giant bubbles. All three can be found around the kids tent which opens at 1:30 pm south of Groom School in the park.




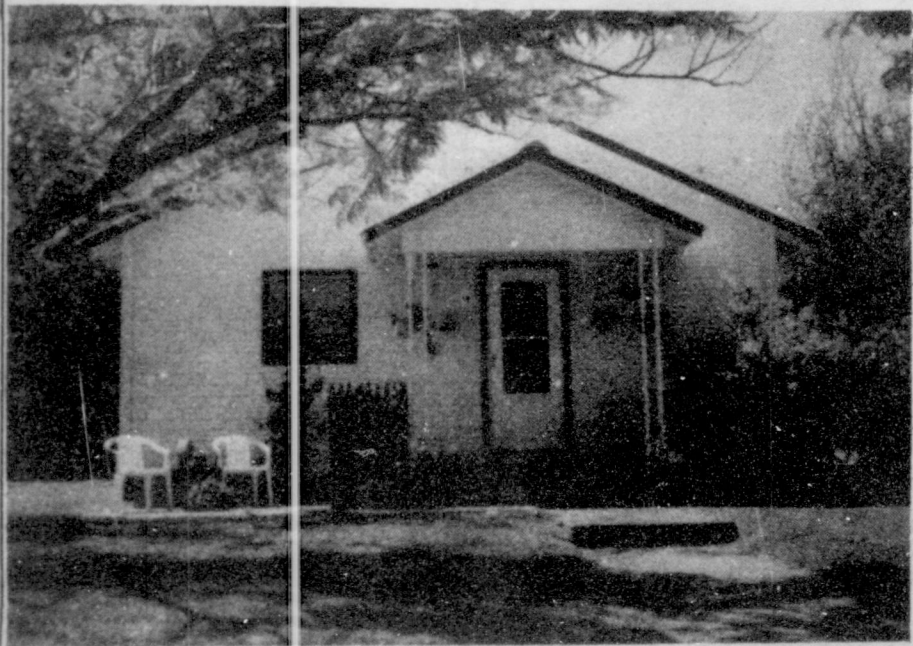

Capt. McCarty Buried After Being MIA For 25 Years

The war ends today for Naomi McCarty. The pain never will.

A private graveside service was held for Capt. James Lon (Jim) McCarty at Hillside Cemetery in McLean.

Capt. McCarty was reported missing in action on June 24, 1972, over Vietnam. His remains were finally recovered 90 miles west of Hanoi and returned home for burial. Capt. McCarty was the son of Naomi and the late Hershel McCarty of McLean.

Services were by Lamb Funeral Home of McLean and included a military honor guard from Altus Air Force Base, Altus, Oklahoma, and a fly over by planes from Sheppard Air Force Base, Wichita Falls, Texas.

Capt. McCarty was piloting an F-4 Phantom in the closing day of the

Vietnam War when it was apparently hit by enemy fire over North Vietnam. The jet fighter's navigator ejected safely. McCarty was reported missing.

"He was such a popular young man," Wanda Lamb of McLean said. "He was outstanding in every endeavor he undertook." Lamb grew up about a block from McCarty.

"When he started in the band," she said, "he bought my saxophone."

Private graveside services were conducted by Rev. Jerry Tamblin of Kingswood United Methodist Church, Amarillo, under the direction of Lamb Funeral Home of McLean.

Born April 24, 1946, McCarty was 26 years old when he was reported missing in action. McCarty had enlisted in the Air Force and was

commissioned in May, 1969.

Capt. McCarty was an honor graduate of McLean High School in 1965, and also an honor graduate of Texas Tech University in Lubbock in 1970. He was a member of First United Methodist Church of McLean.

He was awarded Distinguished Achievement Awards in both primary and basic training. He was also awarded the Purple Heart, the Air Medal with three oak leaf clusters and the Distinguished Flying Cross.

McCarty married Rebecca Jackson in El Paso on September 2, 1967.

He is survived by his wife, Rebecca McKeown of Bogata, Columbia; a son, Kevin McCarty, of Lookout Mountain, Georgia; mother Naomi McCarty, of McLean, and brother, Joel McCarty of Dallas.

Under Mothers magic touch the bird was edible, but a number of remarks were made about the strange proportions, and the stringy dark meat. After everyone was through eating, we confessed the bird was a crane. Mother never again trusted us to bring home a turkey for the holidays.

On the bright side, I can still remember the satisfaction of being able to wrap both hands around a drumstick and gnaw away at the meat. Maybe we should look into a cross breeding program for cranes and turkeys.

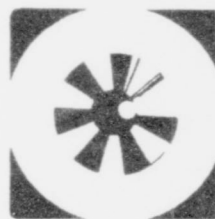

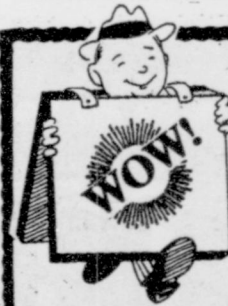

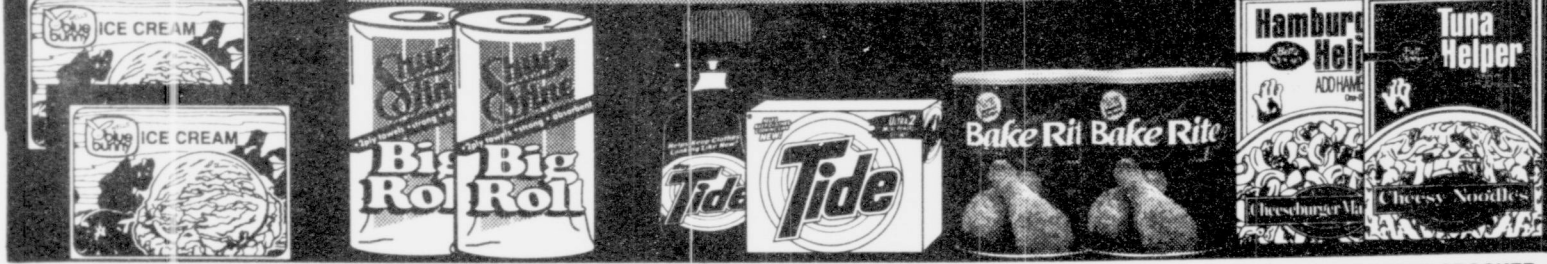
