Carson Co. Investigation Leads To The Arrest Of Two Males At Motel In Groom

The Carson County Jail is currently housing seven prisoners. The holding charges are as follows: 1 - Bench Warrant pending trial, 1 - DWI bond forfeiture, 1 - Possession of Marijuana under 2 ounces, 1 - Probation Revocation (Odessa, TX) for theft under \$20,000, 1 - Assault, 1 - Public Intoxication and 1 - Felony DWI.

Sgt. Ray Davis and THP Trooper Gary Davis responded to a call at a business along Interstate 40 last Thursday after an individual went into the

business place wearing a pistol on his belt.

Deputy Jeff Oldham was assisted by THP Trooper Chris Ray in an investigation at a Groom motel. Two adult males were arrested and a juvenile female was returned to her family in Pampa as part of the investigation. Deputy Oldham had arrived at the motel on a suspicious persons call and did not accept the explanations given by the suspects and called for Trooper Ray to back him up. The officers seized a large quantity of

stolen property from the motel room and took both males into custody on charges of Harboring a Runaway (the juvenile female). Deputy Oldham persisted in his investigation of the property seized and helped authorities in Amarillo and Gray County to solve some residential and motel burglaries.

Our officers investigated an incident on Interstate 40 where some juveniles were shooting paint ball guns at passing vehicles. The paint

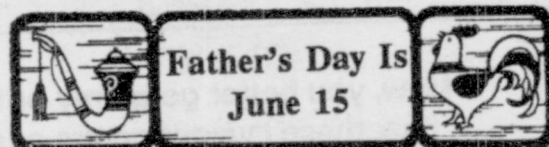

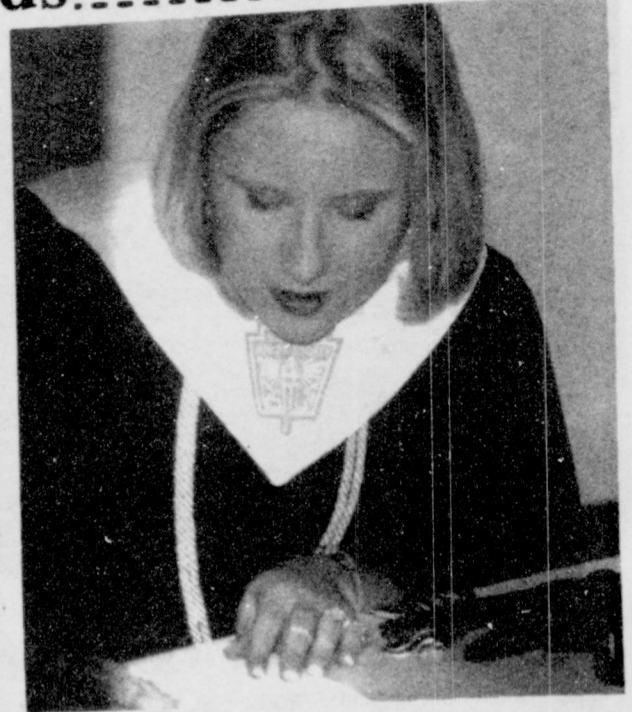

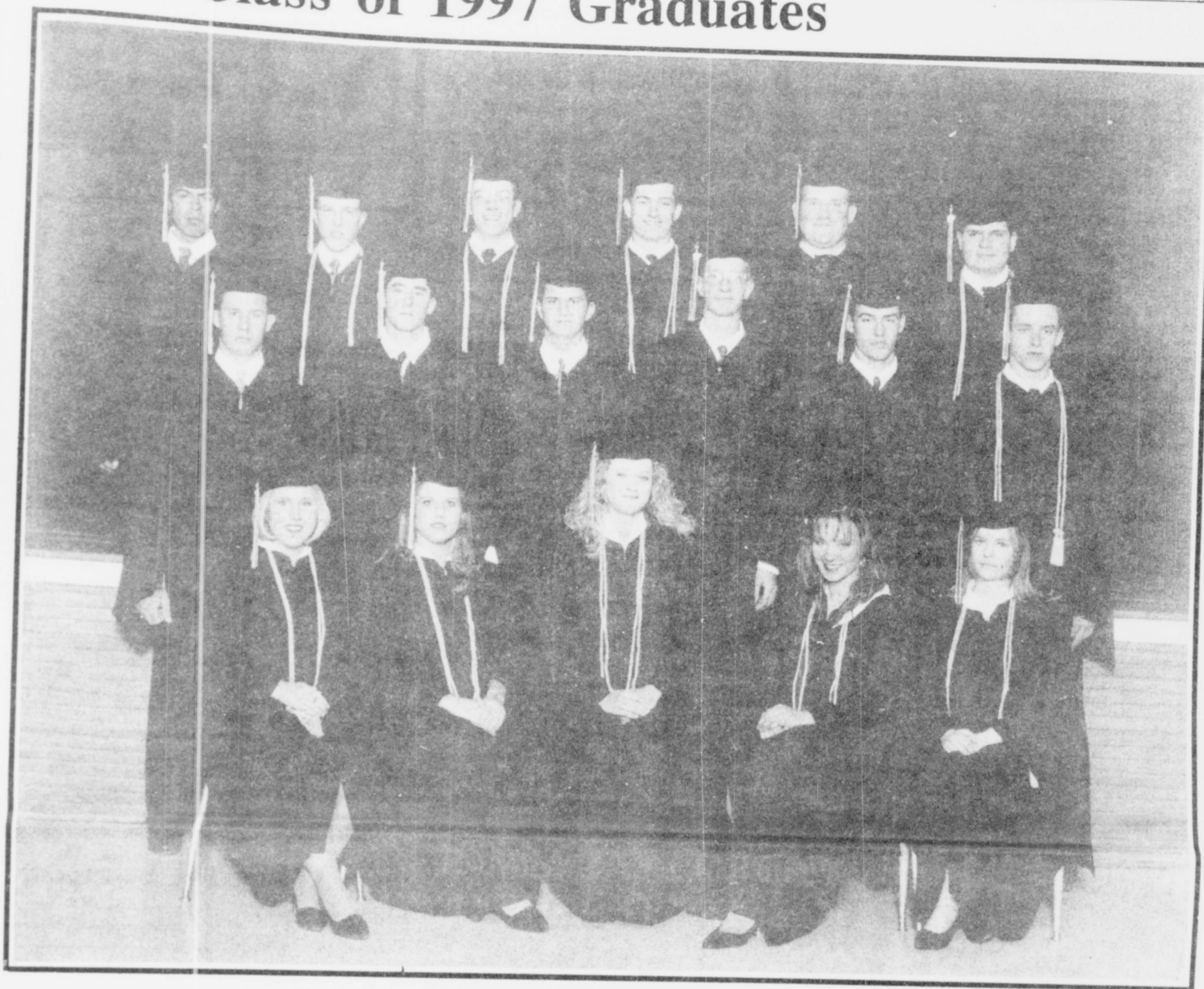

ball gun was later located and taken into custody as evidence.

We are investigating a number of fraud matters involving telemarketing scams and bogus prize giveaways. There are a number of factors to look for when trying to determine the legitimacy of an organization, but the simplest of all to remember is that winning a prize shouldn't cost you a dime. There are measures we can take to prosecute the culprits if you are victimized, but they are often calling from another state and your chances of recovering your money are slim. The easiest way to keep from losing your money is to hang up the telephone when the deal sounds too good to be true.

Another scam we will be seeing again soon is the roofing repair, lightning rod,

house painting and driveway repair gypsies. If you are contacted by a prospective contractor who is not from the area and who demands payment in advance or a cash deposit or credit card number, give us a call at 537-3511 and we'll check to see if they're on the level. A good contractor doesn't mind being checked out. The bad guys won't stick around if they think you're wise to them.


The Carson County Attorney has been presented with information concerning an incident of criminal trespass and unlawful dumping in the north part of the county which involved nearly 800 pounds of trash being dumped on private property. One suspect in the incident has been identified and warrants may be issued for his arrest.

Nell Keese has daughter Faye and husband, visiting this weekend. Jake accompanied them home to Junction for a visit.

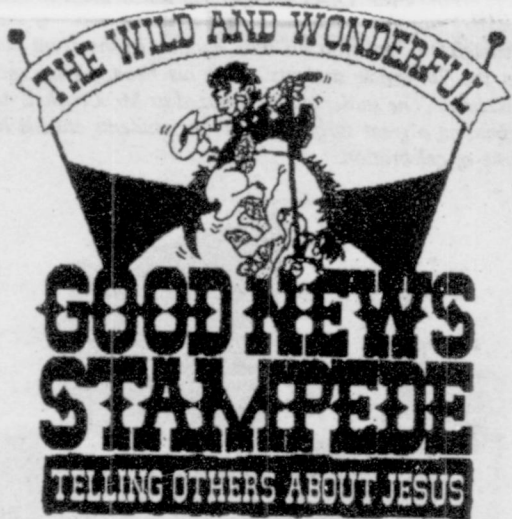

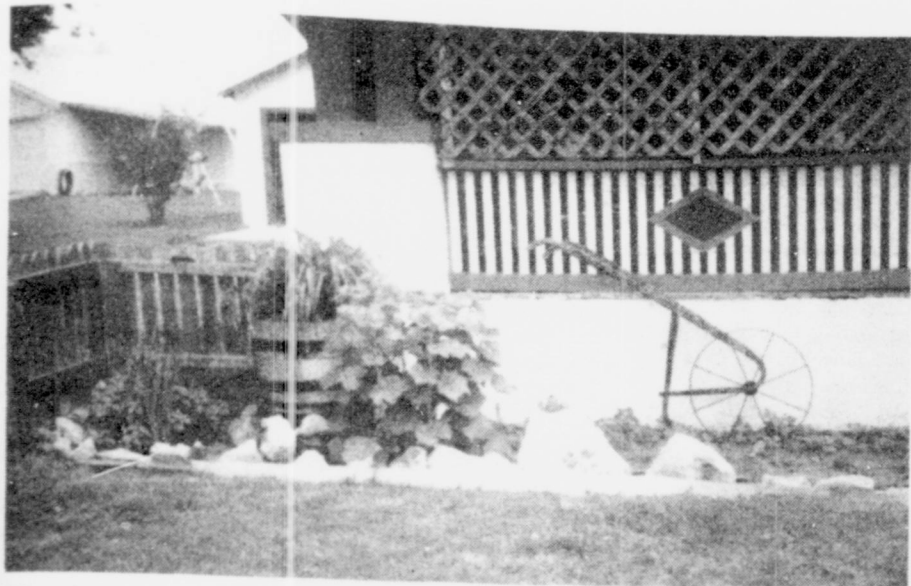
