The Texas Election Code stipulates the post office is not allowed to forward Voter Registration Certificates. Voters who have moved or changed their mailing address since registering to vote will not receive their voter registration certificates. The certificates will be returned to the Voter



In order to vote in the March Primary you must be registered to vote 30 days before the election, which will be February 9, 1997. To avoid possible delay on election day, please be sure your voter registration certificate contains current information. After December 31st, please discard the orange card and replace it with the new BLUE Voter Registration Certificate.







The next poultry shows the families plan to enter are in Lubbock in February and Amarillo in March.


#### McLean Jr. High Loses To Miami






The court discussed and reviewed a county policy which was approved in October concerning cell phones. The policy was not changed from its present form.


