County CVD Deaths
Decrease
Deaths from cardiovascular diseases (CVD) in Carson County have decreased from $43.8 \%$ of all deaths in 1996 to $34.3 \%$ in 1998. In 1998 there were 24 deaths in the county attributed to CVD, which accounted for $34.3 \%$ of the 70 total deaths in the county.
The figures were 28 CVD deaths out of 64 total deaths in 1996 (43.8\%) and 26 CVD deaths out of 61 total deaths in 1996-( $42.6 \%$ ).
