McLean School Board Hears Annual Audit Report

The McLean Independent School District Board of Education met for a regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. on December 17, 2001. Board members present were: John Holland, Billie Ward, Toni Bohlar, Joe Riley, Neal Odom, and Mike Darsey. Others present were: Interim Superintendent, Ron Gregory, Elem. Principal, Dick Crockett, Leslie Darsey, Secretary, Pam Crockett, Margaret Milam, Mindy Reeves, Joy Cooper, Robert and Denise Cooper, Eric Peterson, and Gary Brown.

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m. by John Holland. Opening prayer was given by Mr. Gregory.

A motion was passed to accept the regular meeting minutes of the November 19, 2001 regular meeting.

Gary Brown, auditor from Brown, Graham, and Company then gave the audit report for the 2000-2001 school year. The ending fund balance for the year was \$191,272.00, as reported on the A-2 schedule. The audit was conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the U.S. and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the U.S. Those standards require that the auditor plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. The audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amount and disclosures in the general-purpose financial

statements. An audit includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentation. The auditor issues a report on their consideration of the District's internal control over financial reporting and they test this compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants. Some areas of concern that were mentioned follows: to improve the checks and balances of the purchase order system, to take a current fixed asset inventory, to perform a 3-way reconciliation of the high school student activity fund, to pay all stipends through payroll for tax purposes, and to get the fund balance up and to continue to cut expenditures. Mr. Holland stated that the audit report was not negative, but addressing areas in which help was needed. A motion was then passed to accept the audit report as presented for the year ending August 31, 2001.

The Board was declared into Executive Session at 8:00 p.m. for a student expulsion hearing. Return to open session came at 8:35 p.m. with a motion passed to have the individual placed in AEP, and the details worked out by the principals.

Mr. Crockett presented the State of Texas 2000-01 School Report Card, and this report is required by the state to be sent out to the parent of school-age children. This report compares to the AEIS report given recently at a Board Meeting by Mr. Crockett also.

Mr. Crockett informed

the Board that the Elementary received first place in the U.I.L. Academic meet. He also stated that the kids and teachers had done a good job preparing for this contest. Mr. Holland expressed his appreciation for this effort. Mr. Gregory stated that winning academically is very important.

A motion was passed to adopt the following local credit card policy: District credit cards shall be checked out from the Superintendent's Office. Cards may be used for authorized purchase only. Authorization will come from the Superintendent or his designee. Cards will be checked out to employees by name and date and shall be returned no later than one day after the purchase or the first day back on the job. Receipts shall accompany all returned credit cards explaining purchase. Credit card purchases shall be for items needed to perform the jobs as an employees of the district. No personal purchases will be allowed.

Mr. Gregory recommended that the Board adopt the State Board of Education Resolution encouraging each Texas school district to preserve and protect the rights of students of faith to join with others in their school and community, as well as with millions of others throughout the State and nation, in exercising their constitutional right of voluntary, non-coercive prayer and their constitutionally protected right to express their feelings of faith and patriotism. A motion was passed to adopt this resolution.

Two Drug Busts Net \$200,000

There have already been two drug bust in the year 2002 on I-40. On Jan. 3 a routine traffic stop netted 56 lbs. of marijuana and the arrest of two Tennessee men. Trooper Wayne Beighle said "the subjects were initially stopped for a traffic violation on I-40, eastbound near the city of Groom, in Carson County. The marijuana is worth an estimated street value of \$31,684.00 was found in a bag located in the rear cargo area of the 1998 Chevy Van."

32 year old Derrick Eugene Sever and 28 year old John Curytis Robinson, both of Tennessee, were taken to the Carson Co. Jail in Panhandle.

Troopers believe the load originated in New Mexico and was being transported to Tennessee.

The second drug bust of the year took place on Friday, Jan. 4 at 9:15 a.m. on I-40 eastbound near McLean.

According to Trooper Lucinda Russell, a 2001 Chevrolet Impala was stopped for following to close. Jennifer Rena Gatchel, 33 of Indianapolis, IN was arrested when troopers discovered 1,478 grams of ecstasy with a street

value of \$141,888.00 in the trunk.

Troopers believed the ecstasy had originated in Los Angeles, CA and was headed to Indianapolis, IN. Ms. Gatchel was taken to the Wheeler Co. Jail.

The final numbers for the year 2001 reveal just how productive area troopers were: Drug

seizures, 104; drug value, \$11,683,039.10; currency seizures, \$1,909,031.00; and vehicle value; \$23,000.00.

This compares with the following totaled for the year 2001 with: Drug seizures, 88; drug value,

\$30,413,807.00; currency seizures, \$12,796,797.00; and vehicle seized \$187,500.00.

Clay Britten and Clay Ritter were named to the First Teams and Trey Britten was named to the Second Team.

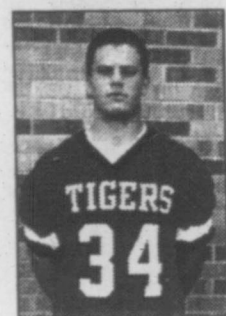
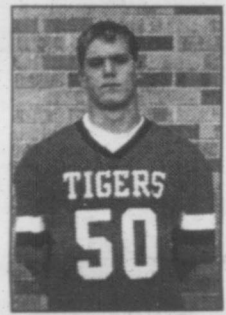

The Groom School Board of Trustees met in regular session on Monday night at 7:00 p.m. Attending were Board Members Clifton Britten, Tim Case, Ron Kuehler, Kelvin Ollinger, Barry Fields, Mike Friemel and Tony Britten. Also presents were Superintendent Kevin Noack and Business Manager Joyce Hutsell and guest Curtis Downs.

Minutes of the December meeting were approved.

Policy recommendations by the TASB Policy Service were discussed

and updated accordingly. The fiscal year for the schools business will now begin on July 1 and end on June 30.

Business Manager Joyce Hutsell presented the Business Managers report. The Board members approve the bills for payment. The budget was amended for \$771.21 in Functions 53-6300, Staff Development.

The Board retired to executive session at 8:00 p.m. to discuss evaluations and contracts for the Superintendent and Business Manager.

They returned to open session at 10:00 p.m.

In an unanimous decision, the School Trustees voted to offer Business Manager a one year contract in the amount of \$32,800 per year for 226 working days. This measure will save the district approximately \$8,000 and require Mrs. Hutsell to

work about 25 less days per year. This is the same number of contractual days that the Superintendent is required to work.

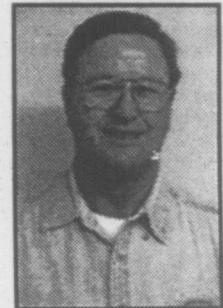

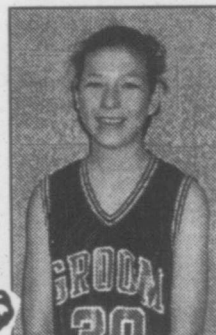

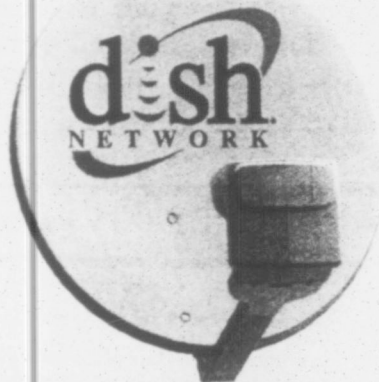
