

They should be mentally equipped in a guiding force in securing the most and the best for the students, teachers and tax payers with the funds available; and the ability to manage, examine financial reports and question without question the students. mentally equipped to be esitation those things not immediately understood.

None of the motivations listed would patently prohibit individual from being good school boar member. an board required is an open and

inquiring mind, an inherent sense of right and wrong and ability to place position goals over personal goals.

Ordinarily boards function efficiently and without problems. The State of Texas has no provision at the present time to allow the recall of elected board members. This is one tool patrons of a school district need in order to correct mistakes made at the voting booth. Last year Texas House Bill year Texas House Bill HB-1144 and Senate Bill B-854 died in the Texas Legislature. These bills to allow recall of boards were well written and deserve reconsideration by the Legislature. your state legislators and request they take up these bills that would effect the recall of a less adequate board. State Senator Teel Bivins would be a good place to start.





Wind power accounts today for less than 1% of the total US electricity production. Estimates show that America's wind energy potential is ample

than twice the total current U.S. consumption of energy.

Development of only a fraction of that potential would increase electricity supplies by 10% to 20% more without sacrificing environmental standards or accelerating the depletion of natural

About one-third of the new wind power proposed for 2001-2002 come online primarily as result business considerations without the additional spur of mandates or marketing. California, their prolonged energy crisis has spurred interest in home small business





PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS! "RENDER" YOUR TAXABLE PROPERTY BY APRIL 15TH

A "rendition" is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on January I of this year. The rendition form is available at the Carson County Appraisal District.

WHO MUST FILE A RENDITION? You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income -such as the inventory and equipment used by a busine

ARE THERE ANY ADVANTAGES TO YOU? Yes, the advantages of filing a rendition are:

- You give your opinion of your property's value. If the appraisal district believes the value is higher, it must notify you in writing of the higher value and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying
- extra charges for late payments.
 You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2001. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in

WHAT'S THE DEADLINE? The last day for filing 2002 renditions is April 15. Call the appraisal district for the last date the rendition may be postmarked, if mailing. You can get an extra 15 days if you ask for it in writing by the April 15 deadline.
