## "4B Or Not 4B" That Is The Question For Local Voters

On May 5th election will be two propositions. The first proposition will give the voters a choice to vote for or against abolishing the present 4 a sales tax. The second proposition will be to vote for or against the adoption of the 4 b sales tax.
The reason for these two proposition is this: the present $4 \mathrm{a} \cdot \operatorname{tax}$ is limited as to how it can be spent. The primary purpose of the 4a tax is to promote expansion and development of manufacturing industrial facilities. can be used for other projects but only under limited circumstances. This tax is primarily for use by larger cities and has restricted the McLean EDC as to how to present funds can be used. The 4 b sales tax

NOTICES OF APPRAISED VALUE TO BE SENT TO PROPERTY OWNERS

State law requires county appraisal districts to notify property owners about changes in their property's value. Around May 15, the Carson County Appraisal District will mail property owners letters showing their 2001 proposed appraised value.

Donita Davis, chief appraiser of the district reminds property owners that the leffer of appraised value is not a tax bill.

Davis emphasized the importance of this letter and the key information that it contains. "If an informal agreement cannot be nade with the appraisal district, the property owner has the right to appeal to the Carson County Appraisa/ Review Board on any disagreement with the property's value. exemptions, ownership, and other afeas," she said
The notice includes instructions on how and when to file a protest and a protest form.

What should a property owner carefully review? "Look at the proposed value for 200." "Davis said The letter states the land's value and any improvement value for the property for the current year." The letter also includes current year information on exemptions granted on the property It provides last year's value, also.
letters to property owners will also includ "estimated" taxes. These taxes are based on the new taxable value and the taxing unit's tax rate from the prior year. Final tax amounts may vary from the "estimated" amounts.

Davis asks property owners to check the legal description and mailing address to be sure there are no mistakes. "If the letter has an old address, please let the appraisal district know. The post office forwards mail to a new address for a thort time, and tax bills do not go out until October," Davis added

A property owner is responsible for informing the appraisal district of the correct mailing address. and is also liable for additional penalies and interest on a tax bill that is not paid on time.

Property owners are encouraged to contact the appraisal district with any questions. Please call the appraisal district at 806-537-3569.
