ELDERLY HOMEOWNERS MAY DEFER PROPERTY TAXES

Ievans aged 65 or older may postpone paying delinquent and current property taxes on their homes They may take advantage of a tax option called "overthe deferral' by signing on affidavit at the Carson County Apprasal District.

This special form of tax relief also halts a lawsuit filed to collect delinquent property taxes on an older Texan's home according to Donita Davis. chief appraiser of the Carson County Appraisal District "To stop a delinquent tax suit Davis said the over-65 homeowner files the deferral affidavit with the court in which the suit is pending ${ }^{-}$

If the affidavit is on file. an older homeowner cannot lose a homestead betause of delinquent taxes." Danis sad

Once a homicowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district. no taxing unit can start or continue a lawsunt for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and lives in that home

Davis stressed that the fax deferral for the elderly only postpones paying delinquient taxes on the home, it does not cancel them. Durng the deferral time. taxes and interest of 8 percent per ear continue to add up. She sad. -When the elderly taxpayer no longer owns and tives in the home, the laxes become due. If the: taves are not paid taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred taxes and interest

There is no penalty on the delinquent taxes during the deferral tume. However filing the deferral affidavit will not forgive penalties that were already due. Also, if the taxes remain delinquent more than 90 days after the deferral ends. a taxing fnit may charge an added penalty if die account goes to a delinquent tax attomey.

Tax deferral forms are available at the appraisal district office. "The homolowner should fill out the form and have the signature winessed by a notary public" Davis said For more information. taxpayers may contact the Carson Copinty Appraisal District. at 102 S Main or at 806-537-3 69.
