A tax rate of \$1.35 from the recommended \$1.17 was voted on by the McLean I.S.D. Board of Education to take to public vote. The tax rate passed by a narrow mar in of 216 - 204.

All winners were awarded cash prizes.





There were 26 members and guests at the December 21 Young at Heart Christmas party. Wilma Barker (now living in Shamrock) was able to join the group.


