## DPS Troopers Net Over \$40,000 Cash In Traffic Stop

found a large sum of found a large sum of money hidden inside his vehicie following a traffic stop on I-40.

At 10:40 a.m. on Sunday, October 16, Sergio Sanchez of Kansas City Missouri was driving a 1993 Jeep Cherokee westbound on I-40. Sanchez was stopped for a traffic violation 10 miles cast of Amarith ia Carson Covesty. After consent to
search was given, troopers evertually found $\$ 40,130.00$ in cash hidden inside the intake manifold of the engine. The cash was wrapped in home insulation, vacuum sealed and taped with black electr cal tape.
