Groom Tigers lost their second game in as many weeks to the Woodson Cowboys, 62-59 here last Friday night. The Tigers outgained Woodson 534 yards to the Cowboys 390 total yards.

The new rate is spproximately $21 / 5$ times less than last year's rate of 0.402054 per valuation. This is 0.023190 less than 2005. The approval by the court was unanimous.
