McLean City Council Hires Hobbs Dirt Movers To Haul Clay for Sewer Plant

The City Council of McLean met in regular session Monday, October 9th, 2006 in the City Hall. The following members present: Bob Martin, Molly McDowell, Betty Taylor, George Shaw and James Troy. Mindy Reeves was absent. Others present were employees: Toni Bohlar, and Roby Lynn.

The minutes of the September meeting were approved. All votes were unanimous unless otherwise mentioned.

The Council agreed to pay the bills.

A motion was made to hire Hobbs dirt Movers to haul the clay for the sewer

plant, not to exceed the cost of \$10,000.00.

Alderman Taylor, president of the EDC, informed the Council that their budget was not ready yet. She discussed their upcoming projects. that some of their upcoming projects. The EDC bank balance as of this date is \$34,178.53.

The council voted to designate the Pampa News as its official paper because it is a daily paper and time is sometimes a considering factor.

At last months meeting, the Council voted to buy a compressor for the City Well. prices were obtained

from a couple of companies. The City will use Liquid Recovery Systems for a price of \$17,892.00. Money left in the Water Sewer and Gas Fund at the end of each month is put into a savings account to go towards the annual bond payment. This year, so far, we have enough for the bond payment, plus an \$8,000.00 head start on next years payment. A motion was approved that the money left in the Water Sewer and Gas Fund, for the months of October and November, to be used to pay for the compressor for the gas well.

The 2005-2006 Budget was amended as presented. Director's Report - Roby Lynn, informed the Council that he had passed his "D" wastewater exam. He also discussed the cost of injector pump loader parts. He was instructed to find out if city employees need CDL licenses. Irrigation systems for the sewer plant and leaky fire hydrants were also discussed.

Mayor Martin told the Council The Webelo Boy Scouts have requested to have a ceremony in the park to retire old flags.

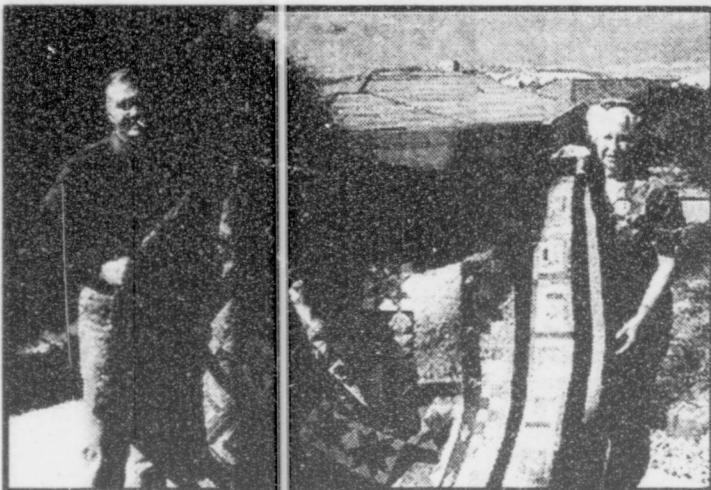
Committees made up of teachers of science, math, English, Social Studies and Spanish met in Austin to perform various functions

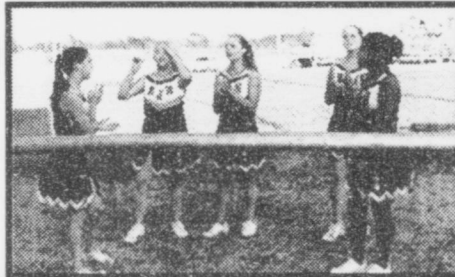

Sign Up Now For 2007 EQIP

Wheat planting is now completed and the fall harvest season is well underway for corn with cotton not too far behind. Landowners and operators need to remember that in the midst of all this work, they need to take some time to consider their land management needs that might be aided by the 2007

EQIP program. The Environmental Qualities incentive Program (EQIP) administered by the USDA's NRCS (Natural Resources Conservation Service) is now accepting applications for the 2007

program in Carson County.

Cost-share assistance ranging from 30-50% is available to help with the installation of numerous conservation practices. Those practices on cropland including planting cropland back to grass, installing terraces and waterways, installing center pivots on previously row-watered ground, replacing ready underground irrigation lines, re-scheduling pivots, and installing drip irrigation. Cost-shared practices on grassland include cross fences livestock water development (tubs, pipelines, wells, solar and submersibles pumps, and brush control (areal spraying of mesquite or perennial broomweed, individual plant treatment and dozing of mesquite and cedar).

Applications will be taken until December 15th, but don't wait until the last minute to sign up. Some practices, such as terraces will require extensive field work and design to determine what is actually needed. For more information, call (806-537-3533, ext 3) or come by the NRCS office in Panhandle in the south end of the Happy State Bank Building. Additional information, including ranking criteria, eligible practices, and cost-share rates for all programs, can also be found on the Texas NRCS Web Site at www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov/programs/.



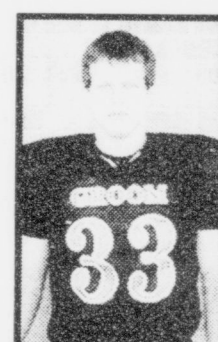

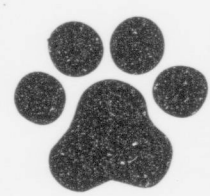

The City of Panhandle expects to start picking up the dumpsters from PANTEX soon.

PANTEX officials were present at the meeting and were to attend Tuesday night's council meeting as well.

Mike Murphy's proposal to the commissioners for damage to the courthouse due to the recent rains was accepted with Commissioner Jerry Strawn voting no. Strawn was unavailable for comment soon after the meeting. The courthouse received water damage with work to be done totaling \$24,680.00. The county was awarded \$20,043.00 for the damage. Commissioner Howell asked the question of going out for bids but Judge Powers said according to the county attorney the cost cannot exceed \$25,000.00. Commissioner Britten said, "We just need to get it done."

Murphy who was present told the court the complete work should be done within a month. Judge Powers

explained the good referrals from local panhandle public entities on Murphy's work.

Jackie Lewis, auditor, questioned the work to be done as well as job details of the work in its advanced stages.

The court accepted a price for \$9,258.25 for new carpet to the Panhandle Library. Judge Powers said, "The carpet now is seventeen years old." Mr. Jerry Watkins of Carpet World was present asking for an additional \$943.20 because he said there needs to be more work done. Commissioner Jerry Strawn said, "The price is barely below bid level." Judge Powers said that they could take bids if they feel it necessary. Commissioner Howell asked, what the bid process would

take?"

Again, no bids were taken but all approved the initial work and additional labor to be needed for a total price of \$10,201.45.

Commissioner Britten's request for a \$23,000.00 rubber tire packer to be used on road work was approved.

Justice of Peace Brandi Hefner was given the court's approval to temporarily move her telephone line to her home due to her surgery.

Kenneth Watson was hired in Precinct 2.

Sheriff Tam Terry asked the commissioners' court to approve the official hiring of court interpreters Val Stone and Maggie Mojica. The interpreters were approved. Sheriff Terry said that today, approximately 50% of the jail inmates need translators. Commissioner Strawn asked what kind of salary we are talking about? "The pair was

hired and their salaries set at \$25.00 per hour because that is what the post office is paying. Commissioner Britten made the motion to take the money from indigent defense funds, all approved.

The court approved acknowledgment of funds from FEMA at \$57,453.18 to be paid to local entities that were responders to fires in Carson County. Area entities will be paid once LEPC Director, Brenda Vermillion completes the list of responders.

The Panic alert system by Secure Tech Systems, Inc. in the courthouse of \$485.00 was approved with a two year extended warranty of \$425.00. The total cost for the system is \$910.00.

Prior to adjourning, the court approved the County Treasurer's report. A copy was not provided at presstime.
