It was in May, 1925, about 6:00 o'clock one evening when, standing in front of the cellar on their farm northeast of town, the Waters family cited the funnel drop down south of town and head north-east. It demolished the Rich Phillips home, blew away the Hinton's and Kid McCoy's houses, as well as doing extensive damage to many other people. The Waters had their roof blown away and their house moved from its foundation ten or fifteen feet to the south.

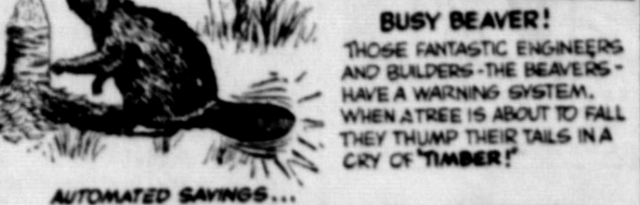
