baked goods auction was held. The junior class raised the most money. Their harvest candidates, Jessica Mann and Larry Lusk were crowned Harve t Royalty.



The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is still accepting applications for the 2007 Environmental Qualities Incentive Program in Carson County. Don't let the busy harvest season make you miss the deadline for coming in to sign up for cost share assistance to install needed conservation practices on your land.

Cost-share assistance ranging from 30-50% is available to help with the installation of numerous conservation practices including planting cropland back to grass, installing terraces and waterways, installing center pivots on previously row watered ground, replacing leaky underground irrigation line, re-nozzling pivots and installing drip irrigation. Cost-share practices on

installing drip irrigation.

Cost-share practices on grassland include cross fences, livestock water development (tubs,

pipelines, wells, solar and submersible pumps), and brush control (aerial spraying of mesquite and perennial broomweed, individual plant treatment and dozing of mesquite and cedar).

Applications will be taken until December 15th, but don't wait until the last

minute to sign up.
