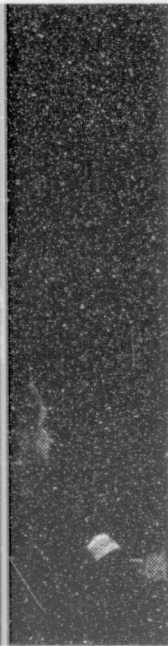

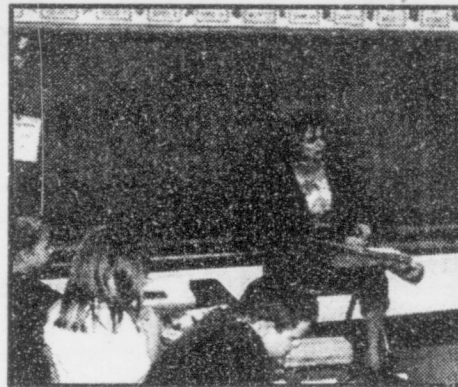

McLean Tigers Win Against Groom

The 1-40 shootout between the McLean Tigers and the Groom Tigers was an offensive explosion with McLean coming out on top 99-56. Total offense for McLean was 642 yards, while Groom total 400 yards of offense. McLean had 13 first downs to Groom's 9 first downs.

McLean and Groom battled back and forth in the 1st half with McLean holding a 42-41 lead at halftime.

The second half was a different story as the McLean Tigers took control of the football game. McLean outscored Groom 57-15 in the second half.

Zach Richardson threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns and ran for another 146 yards and three scores for McLean (7-2, 2-1 six man Division II, District 7).

Jayme Welch accounted for five touchdowns on runs and Logan Sparling had six catches for 180 yards and two touchdowns. Mark Smith caught two touchdown passes and Frank Saunders had a touchdown run. Richardson kicked three extra points and Steven Vassey caught a pass for an extra point.

Head Coach Jack Graves praised the defense for their effort. The defense forced seven turnovers. Coach Graves commented, "We lost Seth Childers in the 1st quarter

and that hurt our defense in the 1st half. But we were able to make the necessary adjustments at half time and the defense responded and shut Groom down in the second half." Seth Childers tore a leg muscle and will be out of action this week.

On scoring 99 points Coach Graves stated, "I was amazed and excited that our team scored that many points. We needed a great effort and the boys stepped up, and we are still in the race for a playoff spot."

McLean plays Lazbuddie Friday at 7:30 PM, at McLean.

If McLean wins and Motley County beats Groom this week McLean, Samnorwood, and Motley County will share the District Championship.

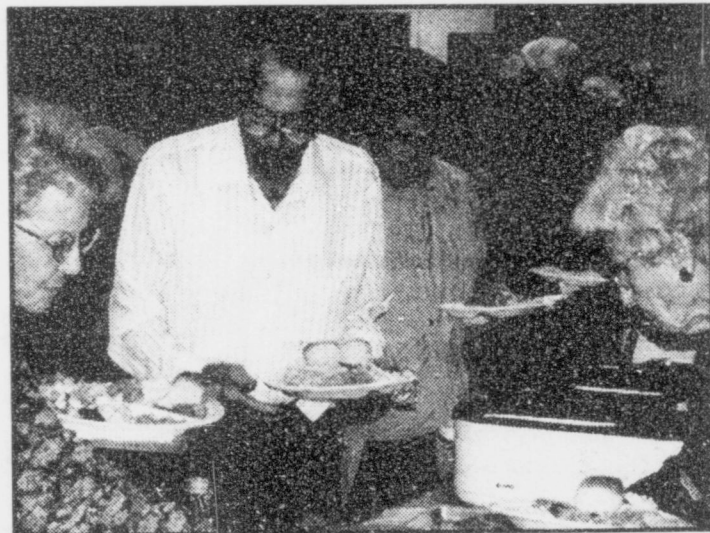

McLean scored on a 50 yard kick-off return.

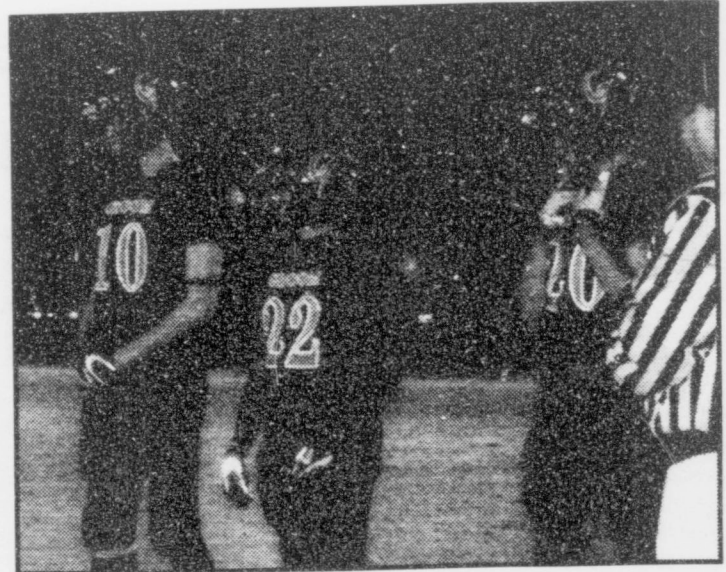

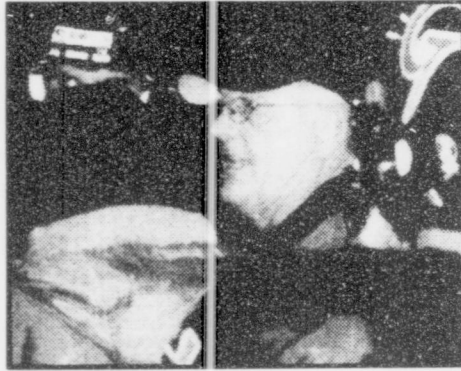

5 Weeks Left To Sign Up For EQIP

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is still accepting applications for the 2007 Environmental Qualities Incentive Program in Carson County. Don't let the busy harvest season make you miss the deadline for coming in to sign up for cost share assistance to install needed conservation practices on your land.

Cost-share assistance ranging from 30-50% is available to help with the installation of numerous conservation practices including planting cropland back to grass, installing terraces and waterways, installing center pivots on previously row watered ground, replacing leaky underground irrigation line, re-nozzling pivots and installing drip irrigation. Cost-share practices on grassland include cross fences, livestock water development (tubs,

pipelines, wells, solar and submersible pumps), and brush control (aerial spraying of mesquite and perennial broomweed, individual plant treatment and dozing of mesquite and cedar).

Applications will be taken until December 15th, but don't wait until the last

minute to sign up. Some practices such as terraces will require extensive field work and design to determine what is actually needed. For more information, call 806-537-3533, ext 3) or come by the NRCS office in Panhandle in the sought end of the Happy State Bank Building. Additional information, including ranking criteria, eligible practices and cost-share rates for all programs, can also be found on the Texas NRCS Web Site at www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov/programs/.

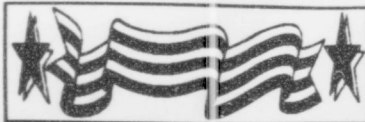

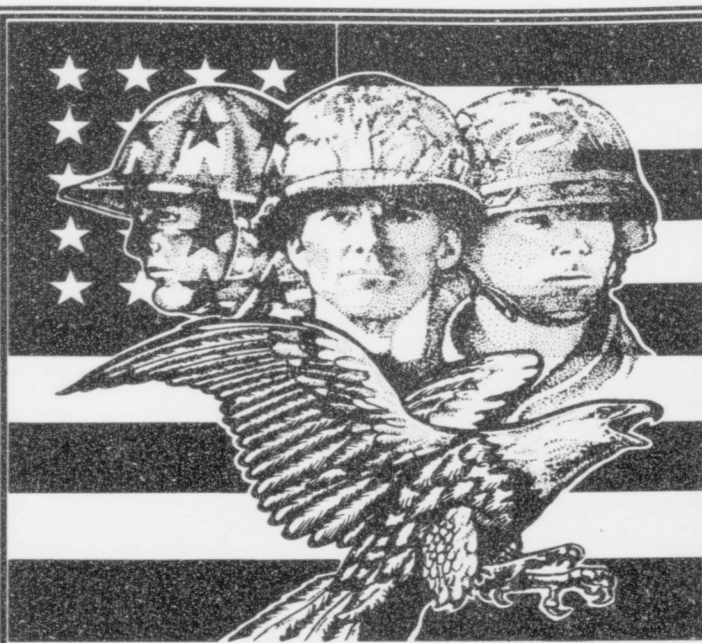
