Groom voters will be going to the polls on Tuesday March 7 in the primary elections. This year the Republican Party nd the Democratic Party will hold their elections together in the same building, due to the new concerning having computerized balloting available to all. will have to declare whether they wish vote democratic or republican. They will be considered a member of that party through the year. (Which will usually in November.)
