Parcel Post War Stamp Tax
Effective December 1st, there
is to be a war tax of one cent
levied on parcel post packages
on which the postage is as much
as 25 cents. If the pustage is less
than 25 cents, no tax need be
paid. If the postage is between
25 cents and 50 cents, a tax of
two cents must be paid. The tax
rate is one eent for each 25 cents
or fraction thereof, above 25
cents.
The postal regulations requirt
that special internal revenue
stamps shall be used to pay this
tax; postage stamps will not do.
The post otfice department an-
nounces that revenuestamps for
this purpose will be supplied to
postmasters in due course for
sale to the public.
