use of commercial drug, Sodium Flouride, a by-product of felds par, for the control of all lice affecting poultry, says W. F Kaziemer, poultry husbandman College of Texas. This has proven very succesful, either as a dusting powder or dip. It is lean and easy to handle, rela tively
